Eighty-Sixth Annual Report and Balance Sheet

The Committee has pleasure in presenting its Report and Balance Sheet for the year ended 31st July, 1958.

COMMITTEE MEETINGS

During the year the Committee has met on ten occasions during the period September, 1957—July, 1958. Summary of attendances at these meetings is annexed to this report.

General.

At the first Committee meeting after the election the following Sub-Committees were formed: Administration, Sailing and Social. Your Committee decided that this move would spread the work required of committeemen more equitably and thus result in more efficient administration.

Administration.

Commodore, E. J. Merrington; Hon. Treasurer, W. Rogerson; Hon. Secretary, A. W. Furse.

In order to allow the incoming Committee more time in which to organise for the following season, which now commences early in September, Rules No. 22, 24, and 25 were altered to advance the date of the Annual General Meeting to July, and to provide for a regular monthly meeting without the usual recess.

A Sub-committee was formed to investigate further changes in the Rules of the Club, but this has as yet not been convened.

RACING

The 1957-58 Season was opened with the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron Regatta on September 14th, 1957. The Sydney Amateur Sailing Club combined with the Middle Harbour Yacht Club, were invited to compete at this Regatta.

Invitation days were also arranged during the season by the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron, the Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club, the Royal Prince Edward Yacht Club, the Royal Naval Sailing Association, the Middle Harbour Yacht Club, the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia, and the Lake Macquarie Yacht Club.

The Anniversary Regatta and the Pittwater Regatta Committee also invited the Club to participate in their events. The Committee expresses on behalf of the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club members their sincere thanks for these gracious invitations.

The Sydney Amateur Sailing Club Flag Day Regatta on November 9th, 1957, was again the largest race day of the season. On that day 204 yachts on the registers of all Yacht Clubs affiliated with the Yachting Association of N.S.W. raced under the burgee of our Club. The Club highly commends all officials who so successfully organised this day.

The strength of the racing fleet was well maintained and keen racing was enjoyed until the end of the season, several point-scores depending on the results of the last one or two races.

The "Bluebird" Division grew considerably in strength, and the enthusiasm of these skippers is very commendable.

Several protests were heard and decided by the Sailing Committee, demonstrating the growing interest in keen racing.

The Peter Fletcher Shield was retained by the Middle Harbour Yacht Club by a close margin, and the function which followed at the Middle Harbour Yacht Clubhouse betokens the goodwill existing between these two clubs.

The "Bob" Brown Trophy ocean race to Broken Bay was a most successful event, and the Committee would like to see all Members, both cruising and racing, gather at Broken Bay for this very pleasant rendezvous.

Closing Day was again a successful conclusion to the Season, and enabled the Yachtsmen and their families and crews to share in the activities of the Club.

The Club expresses its gratitude to the Honorary Starter, Mr. W. J. Millard, for his sterling services, to the Hon. Asst. Secretary, Cliff Mecham, and all other officials responsible for the smooth functioning of the Club's racing programme.

SOCIAL

Once again the main two social functions afloat were Flag Day and Closing Day, both proving most successful. The Committee would like to see a greater attendance at these functions, as they undoubtedly help to spread good fellowship among S.A.S.C. members and their friends.

Wives and friends of S.A.S.C. members were invited to afternoon tea and to view the racing from the Clubhouse, afterwards to be joined by the crews for tea and an informal dance. Our thanks to Middle Harbour Yacht Club for a good day's racing and a wonderful evening's entertainment.

At the conclusion of the "Bob" Brown Trophy Race, held at Easter, yachtsmen of the club met at an informal gathering at the Basin, Pittwater, for the presentation of prizes and a barbecue. The popularity of this "get together" is increasing and all yachtsmen of the Club might do well to mark their calendars for next year's event.

The Monthly Meetings held at History House were well attended and your Committee would like to thank Mr. Rowley Morgan, Mr. and Mrs. Jack Cannon, Mr. and Mrs. John Caldwell, and others who contributed to the entertainment of all by their talks and motion pictures.

The End of Season informal party was held at the home of Mr. Reg. Rose, "Rose Vale," Deewhy. A perfect evening and a relaxed atmosphere contributed to the complete success of the party, and all present expressed the view that this function should be repeated next

year. The Committee offers to Mr. Rose their sincere thanks for his gracious gesture in making his beautiful home available for this party.

Finally the Annual Ball and Prize-giving has been arranged to take place at the Wentworth Ballroom on July 4th, and another successful and happy occasion is anticipated.
