ADMINISTRATION

The intensifying of Club activities as a prelude to the acquisition of premises has necessitated the further delegation of responsibility and these matters were fully discussed during the Special Committee meetings held November and December last year. The final results were the establishment of a Finance Sub-Committee to advise the General Committee on all matters relating to finance and to set up a system of Budgeting, convened by the Commodore. A Clubhouse Sub-Committee responsible for all Clubhouse matters and convened by the Vice-Commodore. A Boatshed Sub-Committee which took control of all Boatshed and Mooring details, convened by the Rear-Commodore.

Many subsequent meetings and interviews with Governmental Authorities have taken place in an effort to expedite the completion of the purchase, which is contingent upon satisfactory arrangements with the Minister for Lands in whom, it appears, is vested sole control of this site.

The Administration Sub-Committee met on a number of occasions in late '61 and early '62 and prepared the "Memorandum and Articles of Association of S.A.S.C. Ltd.", which were approved by the full Committee and are now in the hands of our Hon. Solicitor.

RACING

The racing season opened with the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron Regatta on 16th September with an invitation to S.A.S.C. Similar invitation races followed with R.P.E.Y.C. and R.P.A.Y.C. and later with R.N.S.A. and M.H.Y.C.

It is desired to place on record this Club's appreciation of the courtesies extended to S.A.S.C. yachts, crews and members by the other Clubs and their Regatta Committees and we trust that next season will see us equipped to reciprocate in our own Clubhouse.

October 28th saw our own Flag Day when R.S.Y.S., R.P.E.Y.C., R.P.A.Y.C., R.N.S.A. and M.H.Y.C. fleets raced with our own by invitation, over 200 boats crossing the starting line.

Invitations were extended to the Junior Off Shore Group throughout the season.

The committee felt that crew's efforts deserved recognition and accordingly a race was held on the 14th October in which the crews of winning yachts were awarded prizes.

Ocean races were restored this season. Competing yachts were required to conform to specified safety requirements. Entrants were inspected by the Safety Committee comprising A. W. Furse, E. J. Merrington and W. D. Rayment. The first ocean race took place on the 11th November with approved yachts competing for the Merrington Trophy. The remainder of the fleet took part in harbour races organised and conducted by the R.S.Y.S. The second race was the Bob Brown to Broken Bay.

Thirteen Saturdays were set aside for the Club Point Score Competition and yachts were arranged in 1st, 2nd and 3rd and Bluebird Divisions.

SOCIAL

Flag Day itself — 27th October — provided perfect weather for our first television coverage and for racing, shown by the record fleet which attended. The visiting Flag Officers and Race Officials were entertained on J. S. C. McDouall's motor yacht "Valiant", which acted as starter's boat.

Our Rendezvous was held on Store Beach on Saturday, the 10th February '62 under ideal conditions, following the "Idle Hour" trophy races.

Ladies' Day was held on Sunday, 4th March, with a most enjoyable barbecue on Vacluse Bay Beach following the races. Prizes were presented on the beach after lunch and we are most appreciative of Tony Wheeler's efforts in not only supplying but cooking the sausages.

A brisk southerly ensured that the Closing Day Race was a short one. The Flagship "Radar" and "Prolong" moored in Double Bay where the dinghy races and usual duckings of the rowers took place and caused a great deal of amusement to the spectators.

The Hallets Beach Barbecue after the "Bob Brown Memorial" Race at Easter was attended by approximately 50 people, which is indicative of the camaraderie existing in the Club.

The 1961-62 Season Annual Ball was held earlier than usual — 11th May '62 — and I am sure that it is too fresh in the minds of the 210 who attended to require my re-iterating here what a great night it was. However, the highlight was the presentation by the members to Mr. Cliff Gale to mark over fifty years' continuous sailing with the Club. This feat and presentation are unique in the annals of yachting on Sydney Harbour.

Following last season's innovation, a Presentation of Prizes Night — 22nd June '62 — at the Metropole Hotel proved a great success. The attendance clearly indicates that this night must be included in the social programme. On this occasion the presentation was made by Sir Harold Alderson, M.B.E., Kt., St.J., who honoured us with his presence.
