In a few short years I have been grateful to see the Sydney Amateurs emerge as one of the Clubs of greater stature in Sydney Harbour. Knowing its members I am certain that it will rise to greater heights in the future and I will always feel proud to have been associated with them.

FINANCE—ADMINISTRATION

As was the case last year the immediate problem confronting this committee was the reduction of overdraft accommodation. This was successfully accomplished. At the same time a number of important capital items were added to the club's inventory, including moorings, slipways, etc.

All committees have operated within their budgets and a basis still exists for the club to run profitably.

A number of reforms have been carried out regarding administration in the club, including a suggestion for a part-time Secretary-Manager. This is the next logical step the club should take.

The accounts system commenced by our Treasurer and Mr. Woods last year proved successful in operation. A great deal of thought has been given to future club expansion which could be profitably used by the incoming committee.

My colleagues on the committee have attended regularly and I thank them for their support.

RACING

The club has once again concluded its most successful season from a racing point of view.

Over sixty regular starters from a programme in excess of eighty boats faced the starting line on Saturdays.

Jack Millard and his assistants, Norm Greenhalgh and later Geoff Cambridge, carried out this function throughout the year very efficiently. It is probable that Norm Greenhalgh will depart for South Africa to visit one of his family and we will lose his services. Norm and Jack have been together for eight or more years as a team, using Norman's boat as starters boat, and all racing skippers and crews are much indebted to them for their efficient service over the years.

Geoff Cambridge joined the starters this season and his assistance has helped cope with the increase in boats and close finishes we have been experiencing. Geoff also made his boat available for which the club is very grateful.

Division one and two have again increased in numbers and in the standard of racing. The Thunderbirds Class has also increased in strength and efficiency. The Bluebirds division was a little weaker than previous years, and the Third division about the same.

The Flying Fifteen Championships were conducted under the auspices of the club and were a very successful series. The major placings went to Pittwater Yachts.

The Kelly Cup was won by "Waitangi" with David Wearn at the helm, "Waitangi" raced this season with new rig and she is a much improved yacht.

BOATSHED

Firtly I would like to thank our Commodore, Mr. Nick Cassim, and the Directors for their co-operation and wisdom, without which the boat shed committee would have had a hard task to fulfil.

Next I would like to thank the boat shed committee one and all for their conscientiousness and devotion to this fine section of the club. The boat shed committee is made up as follows: Hon. Secretary, Mark Vines and Max Tayler; Moorings, Ian Ralfe; Slipping, Geoff McCorquodale; Boat Shed Captain, Jack Rogers; David Arthy, John Cornwell, Kevin Dalton, Bill Gale, Bill Lawler, Dick Nossiter, Laurie Schneider, Frank Talbot; and last, but not least, our dedicated shed hand Tony Ashleigh.

The boat shed committee has had a busy season dealing with storms, moorings, slipping and boat shed alterations, and still holding their own financially—which was due to the magnificent response by members to the numerous working bees. The committee was hardly formed when our first drama occured—a S.E. gale on 18th July, 1965, with boats breaking away—one on the rocks and another on the mud at the head of the bay. Danger and hard work in the heavy seas was endured by N. Cassim, R. Moxham and Tony Ashleigh to free these boats.

I would like to speak on moorings and thank Ian Ralfe for a magnificent job of re-allocating moorings, working with the Maritime Services Board on new charts, and increasing our mooring register from 27 to 38.

In the twelve months the moorings maintenance costs have been high, but now we have a mooring maintenance register showing that all moorings have been lifted and repaired and are in first class order.

Due to the high cost of maintenance it was found that our original mooring fee of 17/6 for all boats was inadequate and it was decided that 8 cents per foot would cover maintenance and depreciation.

One of the jobs which demands a lot of candle work is slipping and no one could be more deserving of praise for this job than Geoff McCorquodale. Apart from not booking two boats up for slipping at the one time, Geoff devoted many hours in helping to bring the slips up to first class condition. On this note I would like to thank all those members who took part in the 23 working bees which were held during the year.

This is a brief summary of work done:

The old remaining part of the boatshed, slips and pylons were removed.

Concreting section of the slips.

A new cradle was built, which was designed by Bill Lawler.
The slips' rails were lifted, levelled and packed.
New fibro fixed to part of the slipway shed and floor concreted.
Dinghy racks built and installed—making 42 in all.
Electrical wiring to boat shed.
Timber frames, walls and doors erected in the toilet block.

The boat shed Captain, Jack Rogers, did a very good job in keeping law and order with the dinghies, a thankless task but one well carried out.

In conclusion my sincere appreciate and gratitude to the committee for their fine efforts in making this year a financial success.

Also in November the rendezvous for the Idle Hour Trophy was arranged and credit must be given to Mr. C. R. E. Warren for his capable supervision, and along with the assistance given by Mr. A. W. Furse, the committee managed to arrive at Quarantine ahead of the competitors to prepare the refreshments. Other yachts of the fleet were in attendance. We look forward to Mr. Warren's capable supervision again next year.

We regret the recording of the sailing to bluer waters of three (3) of our Members, H. S. Lloyd, N. K. Wallis and J. P. Ward.

We extend to the friends and families of these respected and familiar figures our sincere sympathies. Suitable letters and, where possible, floral tributes have been forwarded on your behalf.

The Directors feel that the Club and Yachting will be poorer with the passing of the three late members mentioned in the Obituary as all three have in a different manner contributed to the advancement of the Sport.

Wally Ward was an engineer and the designer of "Janaway" which is now owned and sailed by his son, John.

This design was the basis of the successful "Carmen" and "Camile" Classes which were adapted to the R.O.R.C. Rule by Ron Swanson.

Norman Wallis had been a member since 1924 and was always a keen supporter often in quite a material fashion over many years. In recent years he did considerable research into Yachting History in this country and was in a large degree responsible for the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron's centenary publication "Sydney Sails".

Harry Lloyd joined the Club in 1933 and apart from other offices was Commodore for 10 years. Although a member of many other Yacht Clubs, he was one of our most consistent skippers, winning many trophies and starting on every possible occasion.

FINANCIAL

The Balance Sheet and the Statement of Income and Expenditure indicate that the Club's financial position is sound.

The Bank Overdraft has been substantially reduced, adequate Depreciation has been allowed for, all of which is in no small way due to the Committee's conservative approach to Funds available, and the tremendous voluntary effort by many Members which has kept Expenditure to reasonable proportions.

APPRECIATION

Members continued to attend the monthly general meetings in numbers, over 100 attending on occasions. Our guest speakers, who lectured on sailing subjects, were well received—we are grateful to them.

To the firms and members who showed films during the year we give our thanks.

The Directors again wish to thank the various committees and club members who helped to keep the club affairs running smoothly. As a result of their work club amenities have been improved and added to.

To our Hon. Auditor, Mr. B. Psaltis, we give our thanks for a job well done.

At the end of this year we find ourselves almost completely free from our overdraft. In two years time we have cleared our debt of approximately \$8000 on our boatshed. This effort was only done by a careful study of all spending in the last two years. One more year should put the club well in front financially and in a position to make good the suggestions by various committees of improvements to the Clubhouse and amenities.

There will be a big turnover of club officers this year. With the continuing rise in club membership and registered yachts we can look forward to continued improvement in the club generally, and I am sure the new officers will be well able to cope with the work of such improvements as is necessary.

The Ladies' Committee again did their usual good job. All functions where the ladies attended being successful. The Crippled Children's Day was a typical example of our Ladies' Committee efficiency.

Both our Social and Boat Shed Committees did a large amount of work for which we are grateful.
