### COMMODORE'S REPORT

So another yachting season has come to an end. I am sure it is making way for a greater one during 71-72.

Geoff McCorquodale, Peter Gregory and the Sailing Committee have seen to it that our racing has been of a high standard, as seen in the final Point Score results and the small number of protests being lodged.

While on racing, I would particularly like to thank Jack Millard, Geoff Cambridge, Don Skinner and the crew of the Starter's Boat for the tremendous job they have done for us.

Our social activities have been most enjoyable, particularly the dinner dances at the Clubhouse, two Harbour cruises aboard "Lady Scott" and finally our dinner dance held at the Wentworth Ballroom. All credit must go to the Social Committee.

During the last year members and visitors have made excellent use of the fitting-out wharf for repair and maintenance of their boats, also for picking up and returning of friends during a day's outing. The temporary gantry has lifted out some 50 masts and by the time this report goes to press, your Club will own one of the best gantries around the waterfront. For this and many other improvements and additions, the credit must go to Bob Skinner's Development Committee.

I would like to give special thanks to Jim Middleton for the many, many hours he has spent preparing our Centenary Year Book. I would like you to stop and think for a moment of the time it must take to research and write up one hundred years of a yacht club's happenings. A wonderful effort by a member who had already an honorary life membership for services to the Club.

Also a big thanks to our staff, Mrs. Nan Kartzoff, Mrs. Betty Saxon and Tony Ashleigh for the excellent work they have done during the past year.

### FINANCE/ADMINISTRATION

Commodore H. L. Schneider (Chairman), A. F. Grellman, B. Woods, N. G. Cassim, J. A. Middleton, A. W. Merrington.

Several meetings were held during the past year and from these meetings recommendations were made to your Directors concerning — office equipment, employment of an assistant to Mrs. Kartzoff, adjustments to staff wages, repairs and modifications to No. 2 slip, construction of gantry for lifting masts and engines.

All of the above were approved and are at present operating without any necessity to increase the annual subscriptions for the coming year.

I would like to thank the above committee for their assistance and support during the past year.

### BOATSHED

Rear Commodore H. H. Jackson (Chairman), G. J. Aldous, F. D. Bradshaw, D. W. Gale, R. G. Hopkins, C. Iacono, B. G. Ironside, I. D. V. Ralfe. Eleven meetings have been held during the year.

**Financial:** The work volume achieved by the boatshed has shown a steady increase. The ratio of work hours sold to available time averaged 68% for the year and compares with approximately 53% for the last year. Despite this very satisfactory trend, boatshed costs and expenses have shown a marked increase, particularly for labour costs, rental and rates. During the year further major renovations were undertaken, and although in the nature of non-recurring expenditures, these items have been written off in line with Club policy. Following the renovations to No. 1 slip last year, No. 2 slip was this year the subject of extensive repair and improvement. With the growth of shipwright activity the Directors have decided to include on the Balance Sheet (for the first time) Boatshed Trading Stock.

**Property:** The boatshed, facilities, and moorings are in good order. The No. 2 slip we now believe to be sound, with extensive underpinning of the rails, also the knuckle taken out of the rail on No. 1 slip. Safety control switches have been fitted to both slips. The tender was given a thorough overhaul at the start of the season, a serious bearing misalignment was found and corrected by Jan Aldous, this having been responsible for some of the early trouble. With normal maintenance and perhaps the addition of 'whales' to strengthen the hull sheeting, many more years of service can be expected from the boat.

Water and power points have been extended to the fitting-out wharf, and the installation of a crane for mast and engine removal is imminent. A power sawbench donated through Colin Crisp, and sundry smaller tools were acquired for the workshop. These additions have materially reduced the man-hour content of work done, besides increasing our capabilities.

**Summary:** Any difficulty in an otherwise very successful year has been due to unavoidable cost increases, and whilst to some extent these were absorbed through greater efficiency, the time has come when charges may have to be re-examined with a view to keeping the operation viable and of consequent benefit to all members, depending on what results are required in support of total club operations.

The capacity of the boatshed in its present form is very close to and in some cases exceeding the limit. Dinghy stowage has reached the stage when a number of boats have to be stowed outside the racks. Workshop and material stowage areas are crowded beyond the state of most economic usage. It is recommended that re-planning of the boatshed be given a high priority in the ensuing year, and that this include some 300 sq ft extra space for the workshop, storeroom, office complex. The need for extension of No. 2 slip landwards to carry an extra cradle was also made evident during the past season, and another necessary and suggested improvement would be a walkway and retaining wall on the west side of No. 1 slip.

Tony Ashleigh, Jan Aldous and assistants have achieved a great deal towards enhancing the capabilities and reputation of boatshed work, their willing co-operation and sound advice are sincerely appreciated by the Committee, just as is Mrs. Kartzoff's support in administration. It would be wrong to conclude this report without also recording appreciation of the work of the Development Committee, who have planned and organised the structural improvements and repairs in the boatshed that constitute no small part in our progress.

## CLUBHOUSE

The Club's social calendar for 1970-71 included three dinner dances in the Clubhouse at which some members and their friends enjoyed the high standard of catering and service by Arcade Caterers of Ryde. The Committee felt that these functions provide an opportunity for members to enjoy their Club premises and it is hoped they will become a regular feature of the Club's activities.

A notable occasion during the year was the christening of the new wharf and this was a night to remember, thanks to Les Wildman's generosity in donating the use of his cruise boat 'Lady Scott'. Later in the year the 'Lady Scott' was utilised for an outing by the Club to raise funds to defray the cost of our day entertaining crippled children. This year children from Manly Warringah School for Crippled Children in addition to those from the Northcott House at Parramatta were invited and the day again went without a hitch, thanks to the help of many club members who either made their yachts available or assisted at the Clubhouse. The members of Parramatta Rotary, without whose help the day would not be possible, co-operated willingly as usual.

Again we have to thank a number of guest speakers, who, at monthly meetings, kindly gave their time to share their experiences with us.

Our 1970 Ball at the Wentworth Hotel was well attended and enjoyed. A variation to the format for our Annual Ball has been arranged for 1971 when it will take the form of a Dinner Dance which the Committee hope will be appreciated.

Idle Hour Day was memorable this year for the fact that unkind weather upset the usual programme which was disappointing for all and especially for Bob Banta who had made all the necessary arrangements and was left with a vast quantity of unwanted provisions.

Our thanks to Rex Lewis of Kimberley Clark for the generous donations of certain essentials to Clubhouse comfort.

Thanks to the Committee's enthusiasm and work the year has been a happy one — as we have come to expect from our Club's pleasant informality.

## RACING

For the second season running we have had very light breezes. The only strong wind was on Idle Hour Trophy Day, and most of us stayed ashore to watch it! Those who did race found they had very little wind to get home. Saturday, 23rd January, 1971 is unique as far as we can find, because the race was abandoned at 2.30 p.m. for the lack of any wind.

The new system of handicap penalties, with 5 minutes penalty for a win, has been a definite improvement in the eyes of the Sailing Committee. The point score position at the last race was more open than ever before. The "problem" division for handicapping was the Fourth Division which eventually had 26 yachts, which is too many! Next season it is planned to divide it, forming both a Bluebird Division and an Endeavour 24-Southerly 23 Division. Some further possible restructuring of divisions is being examined, but no firm decisions can be made until race entries have been received.

Our congratulations to the yachts which did well in Thunderbird Championships — 1st "Moonraker" Tony Parkes, 2nd "Larriken" Laurie Schneider, 3rd "Kaldari" Richard Wilson. Once again we lost the Daydream Shield races with Middle Harbour.

The Sailing Committee has worked well, with less problems than some previous years — less protests and fewer changes of courses and methods. However, in my view the strength of this Club is the telephone discussion every Sunday morning on the handicaps in each division. It is done by people who race, but who watch the performance of their competitors. For our type of handicap racing it cannot be surpassed.

Peter Gregory has been a most efficient Racing Secretary for two years, but is easing out because of greater demands due to his recent promotion. Our sincere thanks Peter, and even more so to Nan Kartzoff, who beyond doubt produces the most accurate programme in Sydney, and has it in the post earlier than any other club.

Geoff Cambridge and his boat have served us excellently, while Jack Millard, Don Skinner and their assistants have again done a sterling job starting and finishing so many yachts so accurately.

## DEVELOPMENT

The Committee has continued with work to improve the facilities and amenities of the Club's premises.

During the year the fitting out berth was completed and has proved a great success, well used by members and their friends as an amenity area as well as for its main purpose as a fitting-out wharf. Its well maintained appearance has transformed the Club's appearance from the harbour. We are grateful that so many yachtsmen are using the facility and yet are making efforts to maintain its "as new" appearance.

A crane capable of a wide range of work is currently being manufactured and will be installed on the wharf.

A number of improvements within the Clubhouse have been completed within the year.
