The weather on Saturdays during the season was not always up to the standard expected of Sydney, but unfortunately this factor is beyond the control of our committee.

Thanks to the enthusiasm of our Vice-Commodore Hugh Jackson and his wife Jean, the social activities during the year were most enjoyable and the embellishments added to the clubhouse have further enhanced its traditional charm. The boatshed business continues to function efficiently, providing a service to yacht-owner-members. The Committee, under the chairmanship of Rear Commodore Brian Woods, is to be congratulated.

I am very pleased to report the formation of a new committee to cater for the interests of members who are more specifically concerned with cruising, and I feel sure this committee will provide a valuable contribution to the Club's activities.

A further development during the year was the appointment of Roderick Glassford as part-time Administrator. I know that his genial conscientious approach to this position will be much appreciated, not only by Mrs. Kartzoff and Tony Ashleigh, but also by all members of committees and club members in general.

The Club negotiated another year resulting in a satisfactory financial position. However, with ever-increasing costs of administration it has been necessary to increase slightly our very modest rates of subscription.

We now have a part-time Administrator with the aim of increasing the efficiency of the Club's activities in all its aspects, and so obtain the greatest possible benefit from the funds available.

The introduction of Provisional Membership has so far proved to be very successful, notwithstanding some early teething troubles with procedures.

BOATSHED

Boatshed activities during the year continued to increase in volume. Both slipways have been in increased demand. As reported elsewhere, plans have been prepared to extend No. 2 slip as first priority in the new development programme. This slip will then contain a second cradle, thereby increasing our slipping capacity by 50 per cent.

Saleable labour as a percentage of available labour is running at a rate slightly in excess of 68 per cent and is considered quite satisfactory.

The Club has been unable to obtain additional moorings during the year due to a continuing restriction by the Maritime Services Board on applications from clubs and commercial boatsheds. However, as a further service the Club has supplied, on hire, mooring apparatus to Club members who have been granted a private mooring licence. Under this arrangement, the Club also provides dinghy stowage facilities to the member.

During the last annual inspection of mooring, a further 16 mooring chains were replaced with polypropylene mooring rope.

On the financial side, the Club has received no exemptions from the community wide cost spiral. Both labour and materials continue to increase in price. As a result, a revised operating budget was prepared in February and it was with regret that boatshed labour rates to members were necessarily increased to \$5.00 per hour. Other costs have been contained for the moment but will no doubt have to be reviewed early in the life of next year's Committee.

The Committee wishes to record its sincere appreciation for the co-operation and able assistance provided by Tony Ashleigh in the boatshed and Mrs. Kartzoff in the office, together with their respective assistants.

CLUBHOUSE

1973/74 has been an interesting year, one of progress and consolidation. Perhaps most notable among the functions run was the wine tasting and Barbecue, the proceeds covered our expenses for Northcott Day besides enabling the Club to make a suitable donation to the James Craig Restoration Fund and the Maritime Museum. The Committee wishes to record its thanks to Andy Banyai and Ian Giles for their willing assistance in running the function, and also to those individuals and firms who generously supported our efforts in entertaining the children from Northcott School.

At the time of going to press, arrangements have been made to hold the Annual Dinner Dance and Prize Giving at Sebel's Town House—a new locale for the Club, which promises to be an enjoyable and successful evening.

The Clubhouse continues to receive our attention. Presentation plaques are being prepared and fixed to the various items we have acquired in past years, so their origins will not be lost in the course of time. However, your Committee to date has been unable to trace the history of the Barograph (fixed to the wall above the Binnacle) and would be glad to hear from anyone who could contribute this information. Recent acquisitions include a most comprehensive knotboard donated by Tom Selby, a fine teak ship's wheel donated by the elected officers of the Club to commemorate our Centenary, and a stainless steel mooring buoy given by Garth Barraclough, which is at present being prepared for mounting beside the front door. Through the good offices of Tony Pfeiffer we have also acquired a scale model of "Gretel I". It is, however, taking a little time to recondition for display.

Your Committee has been conscious for some time of the need to make available snacks and refreshments during the racing season. Subsequent to a number of teething problems with the service, we appreciate the efforts of Laurie Schneider in taking the catering arrangements in hand, thus making possible this enjoyable finish to a good afternoon's sailing. Whilst on the subject of food, the present high cost of catering is one aspect of social functions that is of major concern to your Committee. We believe the Club is obligated to provide for members and not vice versa, but how to do this without incurring a high per head charge is at the moment an unsolved problem.

Those who frequent the Club on Sundays will be acquainted with Carl Speers and his quiet efficiency in maintaining the Clubhouse and its precincts in good order to be enjoyed by all. On behalf of members we thank Carl for his devotion to a job well done, and to Mrs. Kartzoff for her generous co-operation and understanding in administrative matters, we are sincerely grateful.

DEVELOPMENT

Significant decisions have been taken during the year further to improve the facilities of the Club.

The master plan has now been completed and represents the physical needs of the Club in the immediate and middle future, as well as can be forecast that far ahead. It means that incoming Boards of Management will have a standard reference against which decisions of the future can be made. The Board has decided to proceed with extensions to No. 2 slipway to permit its use for two cradles in tandem, thus adding some 50 per cent to the Club's capacity for boat repair and maintenance work. Of greater impact is the decision to proceed with re-building and alteration work to establish a new workshop and chandlery department which will replace part of the old cottage. The alterations provide the main boatshed with increased dinghy storage. The work represents Stage 1 of the master plan.

Architect's plans have been prepared and a contractor is now being organised to execute the work.

RACING

Racing was again successfully conducted from our Starter's Boat by Jack Millard, Ray King and their assistants, and we sincerely thank them for contributing to the excellent racing during the season.

Race entries were just two (2) short of our record, at 121 yachts, racing in nine (9) divisions. There were thirty-two (32) new registrations for the season. With two (2) new courses for No. 1 and Metre Division, we now have a total of thirty-one (31).

We again had close and exciting racing as evidenced by the point score. Most divisional point score winners were decided in the last race.

Our plans to fix the "Daydream Shield" permanently to the wall of the Clubhouse came unstuck when Middle Harbour Yacht Club won back this excellent Teams Racing Trophy. Next season ???

Congratulations and thanks to Mrs. Kartzoff, who very ably prepared and mailed our sailing instructions to us on the first day of each week.

Our Protest Sub-committee probably set a record for hearings, averaging one each week of the season. Many of the skippers will, no doubt, be wiser on the subject of Yacht Racing Rules, and will enjoy their racing even more in the future. Sincere thanks to Chairman Ernest Merrington for a job well done.

The Skippers' Meetings were, as usual, well attended and much useful constructive comment was recorded for consideration by the Racing Committee. It is regretted that our Racing Secretary Geoff de Looze will be transferred to Western Australia in the Spring and will not be available next season. Many thanks for an excellent job Geoff.

During the season the Racing Committee has worked well and the Club is fortunate that we have these enthusiastic fellows who are prepared to devote so much time to the organisation of our racing.

SYDNEY AMATEUR SAILING CLUB DIRECTORS' REPORT

In accordance with a resolution of the board of directors, the directors' report as follows with respect to the club's profit for the financial year ended 31st May, 1974 and the state of the club's affairs at that date.

- 1. The directors in office at today's date are as stated on the previous page.
- 2. The principal activities of the club in the course of the financial year comprised sailing club, boat repairs and social activities. No significant change in the nature of those activities occurred during the year.
- 3. The net profit of the club for the financial year amounted to \$2,729.
- The results of the club's operations during the financial year were not, in the opinion of the directors, substantially affected by any item, transaction or event of a material and unusual nature.
- 4. The directors recommend that no dividend be paid.
- 5. Before the profit and loss account and balance sheet were made out, the directors took reasonable steps to ascertain details of the action which had been taken in relation to the writing off of bad debts and the making of provisions for doubtful debts and to cause all known bad debts to be written off and adequate provision to be made for doubtful debts.
- 6. At the date of the report the directors are not aware of any circumstances which would render the amount written off for bad debs or the amount of the provision for doubtful debts inadequate to a substantial extent.
- 7. Before the profit and loss account and balance sheet were made out, the directors took reasonable steps to ascertain whether any current assets, other than those to which paragraph 5 applies, were unlikely to realise, in the ordinary course of business, their value as shown in the accounting records of the club. If in their view there was a deficiency they caused those assets to be written down to an amount which they might be expected to realise, or made adequate provision for the difference between that amount and the value shown in the accounting records.
- 8. At the date of this report the directors are not aware of any circumstances which would render the values attributed to current assets in the accounts misleading.
- 9. At the date of this report
 - (i) No charge exists on the assets of the club which has arisen since the end of the financial year and secures the liabilities of any other person.
 - (ii) No contingent liability exists which has arisen since the end of the financial year.
- 10. No contingent or other liability has become enforceable or is likely to become enforceable within the period of twelve months after the end of the financial year which, in the opinion of the directors, will or may affect the ability of the club to meet its obligations when they fall due.
- 11. At the date of this report the directors are not aware of any circumstances not otherwise dealt with in the report or accounts which would render any amount stated in the accounts misleading.
- 12. In the interval between the end of the financial year and the date of this report no item, transaction or event of a material and unusual nature has arisen which is likely, in the opinion of the directors, to affect substantially the results of the club's operations for the next succeeding financial year.
- 13. Since the end of the previous financial year no director of the club has received or become entitled to receive a benefit (other than a benefit included in the aggregate amount of emoluments received or due and receivable by directors shown in the accounts, or the fixed salary of a full time employee of the club) by reason of a contract made by the club, or a related corporation, with the director or with a firm of which he is a member, or with a company in which he has a substantial financial interest.

In accordance with a resolution of the directors of SYDNEY AMATEUR SAILING CLUB, we state that in the opinion of the directors the accounts of the club are drawn up so as to give a true and fair view of:

RACING REGULATIONS

1. Control. The Committee shall have control of all matters connected with racing and shall fix race entry fees, set courses, divide yachts into divisions at its discretion and shall decide any question which may arise which is not provided for in these regulations, but a yacht shall always have the right of appeal to the Yachting Association of N.S.W. against a disqualification as a result of a protest.

2. Racing Rules. Races shall be conducted under the current racing rules of the International Yacht Racing Union, the prescriptions and Appendix 9, Part 2 of the Safety Regulations of the Australian Yachting Federation and the appropriate class rules all as modified by the Sailing Instructions.

3. Class Rules. The Bluebird Division is open to all yachts registered with the Bluebird Association.

The Thunderbird Division is open to all yachts registered with the Thunderbird Association. Yachts racing in the Thunderbird Division shall comply with the Constitution and Specifications of the Class Association.

4. Entries. Entries shall be made in the form adopted by the Club or as may be otherwise determined by the Racing Committee, and shall be forwarded to the Hon. Racing Secretary, Sydney Amateur Sailing Club, Green Street, Cremorne 2090. All entries are subject to the approval of the Sailing Committee.

5. Person in Charge. A member of a recognised Yacht Club shall be in charge of each yacht competing in a race conducted by the Club.

6. Number of Starters. Unless three (3) yachts start in a Club race, it will be at the Starter's discretion to cancel the race, in which case no prize will be awarded and unless four (4) yachts start, no second prize will be given and unless six (6) yachts start, no third prize will be given.

7. Prizes. The Committee shall award the prizes subject to these rules, but before they do so, the owner or his representative may be required to sign the prescribed declaration that the yacht has conformed to all Rules and Regulations.

8. Sails and Rigging. Any alteration affecting the declared dimensions of hull, spars, sails or rigging, propellor, etc., shall be advised in writing to the Hon. Racing Secretary six days prior to the event to which the alterations will apply. The spinnaker boom shall be set from the mast in such a manner that the distance between the mast and the outer end of the spinnaker boom cannot exceed half the overall length or twice the moulded beam, whichever is greater. No headsail or spinnaker shall be hoisted from any spar above the masthead.

9. Alternate Helmsman. Change of regular helmsman shall be notified to the Honorary Racing Secretary or the Starter at least 24 hours before the race. A yacht may be disqualified for failing to notify. The Committee reserves the right to alter the handicap for a change of helmsman.

10. Dress. Helmsmen and crews of all yachts competing shall be suitably attired, the minimum requirements in this respect being shorts and shirt.

11. Motors. A yacht may be propelled by motor or towed until two minutes before it crosses the starting line.

12. Entry Fees. All Divisions and Classes—\$30.00 per boat for the Season or \$2.00 per race.

Racing Rule Books are available from the Club Secretary.

Sale of Yachts. Where a member disposes of his boat or sails it shall be his duty to protect the interests of the Club by removing any registered markings from the sails, withdrawing his burgee and notifying the Hon. Racing Secretary.

Club Racing Flag. The Club has on sale Racing Flags and the Racing Committee recommends that yachts racing with the Club use these to help our officials to recognise our yachts. Two sizes are available, 10" x 7" and 9" x 5", both priced at \$2.00 plus 9c postage.

2. Life Saving Equipment. For each member of the crew, either One buoyancy vest certified to Australian Standard AS 1499 (AS Z28) OR

One lifejacket certified to Australian Standard AS 1512 (AS Z27)

3. Bilge Pump and Buckets. Two buckets of $1\frac{1}{2}$ gallon capacity and each fitted with a lanyard.

Bilge pump is not compulsory but recommended.

4. Fire Precautions.

- 1. Yachts equipped with an engine or any other apparatus using gas or liquid fuel, either fixed or portable, shall carry at least one approved dry chemical fire extinguisher of a minimum capacity of 1 kg (2 lbs) or alternatively an approved CO_2 extinguisher of a minimum capacity of 2 kg (4 lbs). Fire extinguishers must be inspected and tested by the manufacturer or his approved agent annually and marked or certified to that effect.
- 2. Efficient flame trap and drip trays shall be fitted to the carburettors of all fixed petrol or kerosene engines. Tank vents shall lead to open air. Tank fillers to be positioned so that spillage into vessel is not possible.
- 3. Fuel line to a fixed engine must have a flexible connection to engine or sufficient coils in the pipe to allow for effects of vibration, and be firmly clipped in place.
- 4. Portable fuel containers should be of metal, securely stowed.

5. First Aid. First aid kit shall comprise of:

- 1 small pack of combined dressing or army field dressing.
- 2 x 3" crepe bandages.
- 1 packet of waterproof bandaids.
- 2 ounces of cotton wool.
- 1 pair of rustless scissors.
- 6. Torch. Each yacht shall carry an effective waterproof torch.

7. Propulsion. If not fitted with an engine, each yacht shall carry two (2) paddles or oars of adequate size.

Club Point Score Competition—A Gold Medal will be awarded to the Club member who accumulates the greatest number of points during the season whilst he is a member.

A Silver Medal will be awarded to the Club member who accumulates the second greatest number of points during the season whilst he is a member. A Bronze Medal will be awarded to the Club member who accumulates the third greatest number of points during the season whilst he is a member.

- **Spring Point Score**—A trophy will be awarded to the yacht in each division leading in the handicap Point Score at Christmas (with no discards).
- Summer Point Score—A trophy will be awarded to the yacht in each division earning the most points in the handicap Point Score from January onwards (with no discards).
- Scratch Point Score—A trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Scratch Point Score in those divisions which have Scratch racing.
- Handicap Competition Points—Points will be scored as follows: Each yacht finishing will score points equal to the number of entries in the race less the number of yachts beating her. In addition seven points will be awarded for first place, four points for second place, two points for third place. Retiring yachts will receive one point.

Only yachts entered for the whole season or for the remainder of the season, if a late entry, are eligible to receive points.

Each yacht must discard the points of three races in the season. A race in which the yacht did not start or finish can be discarded. Otherwise the races earning the least points will be discarded.

Scratch Competition Points—In Divisions providing Scratch races points will be awarded on the following basis:

Each yacht finishing will score points equal to the number of entries in the race, less the number of yachts beating her. Retiring yachts receive no points.

Each yacht must discard the points of three races in the season. A race in which the yacht did not start or finish can be discarded. Otherwise the races earning the least points will be discarded.

Handicapping:

An automatic handicap penalty will be applied of 5 minutes or 3 per cent for a win, 3 minutes or 2 per cent for second, 2 minutes or 1 per cent for third. A yacht which does not start in three consecutive races will have an automatic reduction of handicap.

Handicap variations may be made at the discretion of the Racing Committee.

- Kelly Cup—Perpetual Trophy for competition between the leading yachts from all divisions in the Point Score competition.
- **Gretel Trophy**—A perpetual trophy of a Gold Cup presented by the late Sir Frank Packer to the winner of the No. 1 Division Point Score.
- **H. S. Lloyd Memorial Trophy**—A perpetual trophy presented by the Lloyd family to the winner of the Second Division Point Score.
- John Taylor Cooke Memorial Trophy—A perpetual trophy presented by H. E. and J. E. Pfeiffer to the winner of the Third Division Point Score.
- **P. J. Worrall Trophy**—A perpetual trophy awarded to the winner of the Thunderbird Division Scratch Point Score.
- Daydream Shield—A perpetual trophy donated by Mr. Peter Fletcher for competition between M.H.Y.C. and S.A.S.C., in inter-club races.

Nominated Skippers' Race—Yachts to be sailed by a crew member other than the regular skipper. A trophy is presented to the winner in each division.

Centenary Plate—Each skipper who wins a gold medal scores a point towards the Centenary Plate. The first skipper to score 3 points wins the trophy outright.

Centenary Trophy—As a result of the race held closest to Founder's Day (19th October) a perpetual trophy awarded to the skipper who, on handicap, wins by the greatest margin within his division.
