

COMMODORE'S REPORT

We are going through interesting times — quite without precedent in the history of Australia. My concern in this report is not political, or economic in a Federal or State sense, but how best can our Club adapt to the situation. I don't think that responsibility has ever before weighed so heavily on our Board of Directors than in the last twelve months or during this current period of extreme inflation and my sincere thanks go to that body of men for their dedication to the task.

We function primarily as a sailing club and our high tradition in this capacity has been well maintained by the Racing Committee together with Jack Millard and his starting crew. However, even the best organisation cannot function to full effect without good spirit among the participants and I congratulate all our members, particularly the racing fleet, on maintaining a fellowship that I think is unique among Sailing Clubs.

We have enjoyed the functions arranged by the Clubhouse Committee under the Chairmanship of Vice-Commodore Brian Woods, whilst the Boatshed Committee under Rear Commodore Rhys Withers has effectively furnished our practical needs. One of the most productive but perhaps least heralded groups has been the Development Committee, chaired by Director Bob Skinner. The well documented and prepared plans for Clubhouse development are unfortunately lying for the time being in frustrated abeyance; the cost of building relative to Club resources and income is so disproportionate at the moment that the Board has deferred further consideration of this matter for some months.

However, despite the most unsatisfactory state of affairs at present prevailing in the general areas of business and commerce, your Directors have maintained Club finances in a healthy and viable state. As this report is being written they are currently considering ways and means of improving our present facilities whilst at the same time husbanding Club resources.

During the year the Club had the pleasure of admitting Bill Gale to Honorary Life Membership for long and distinguished service to both the S.A.S.C. and sailing; I extend to him congratulations and thanks for his selfless devotion and enthusiasm. My sincere appreciation goes to all Committee men and women who have so generously given their time and effort for the enjoyment and benefit of us all. In like sentiment I thank Mrs. Kartzoff, Tony Ashleigh and Carl Speers for the loyalty and support it has always been my pleasure to receive.

The table shows a decrease in total membership relative to the previous year, however this is not altogether unexpected in view of the prevailing economic conditions in Australia; in fact, the movement is very close to the otherwise normal fluctuations that have occurred over recent years.

In December a more up-to-date system of accounting was introduced in our office, together with a moneyflow record to inform Directors each month of the cash movement in Club finances. This will be of great assistance in making finer judgements on internal efficiency and in maintaining Club business in a healthy viable state.

Club costs and general efficiency have been kept under strict surveillance with a view to offsetting as much as possible the increased financial pressure that is now part of everyday life. The modest increased charges that have been forced on us reflect the success of this work.

In November, 1974, private commitments led to Mr. Rod Glassford's resignation from the position of Administrator. This was received with great regret, however during his term of office he introduced new record systems in the boatshed and chandlery which has been of considerable benefit and we thank him for his contribution to the Club in this regard.

BOATSHED

The year under review has seen a healthy expansion of boatshed business with respect both to increasing revenue and to improvement of facilities. Through the planning of the Development Committee and by the personal efforts of a number of members, a third slipway cradle has been built on an extension to No. 2 slip. This has effectively increased the capacity of the Boatshed operation for slipway work by 50% and the financial benefits from this additional facility should become clearly evident in the next twelve months.

A severe storm occurring in the Sydney area on May 25th, 1974, caused damage to some boatshed facilities, including a number of moorings and the club tender. The ramifications of this damage became clear during the year under review when it was found that many moorings had become displaced and required relocation, and also that the club tender had been damaged beyond economic repair. For passenger-carrying purposes the Club has now purchased a replacement tender named the "Iliad" from the Flying Boat base at Rose Bay. This vessel is undergoing refit at present and a full tender service will be restored by the commencement of the next racing season.

Unfortunately the Boatshed operation has not been isolated from general increases in costs. This has resulted in unavoidable increases in charges to members for boatshed work and for the use of boatshed facilities. It remains, however, the strongest determination of the Club to maintain charges to members at the lowest level which is economically compatible with the provision of adequate facilities.

The Boatshed Committee is indebted to Tony Ashleigh, Nan Kartzoff and Carl Speers for their very considerable personal contributions towards the smooth operation of this important facet of Club activities.

The year under review has been marked by a number of further events of interest to members.

On the building side, a certain amount of necessary renovation has continued. A long overdue electrical contract was let and we are assured of ample light and power for the future.

General Meetings were supported with a slightly revised format. Your Committee sought to alternate between speakers and films for this year. We were indeed grateful to all who supported these activities. In particular to Warren Anderson who spoke on "Tuning"; to Vic Bahr for a very informative talk on weather forecasting and, finally, to Alistair Merrick and his supporting cast who produced an interesting and informative evening entitled "Be your own Sea Lawyer".

Among films shown was the outstanding presentation "Tall Ships Race, 1972", which was especially flown out from the U.K. by its sponsor, Cutty Sark Whisky Limited, and was one of the finest films ever seen at the Club. Other social functions during the year included a very successful Flag Night and a well attended wine bottling and barbecue. The Annual Dinner Dance is again on the agenda and is scheduled for the last Saturday in June.

Once again your Committee has sought to provide light refreshments during the racing season and thanks to the efforts of Laurie Schneider, crews returning from an afternoon's racing have been able to enjoy a variety of tasty snacks and beverages. Plans are currently in hand to expand this service during the coming racing season.

Your Committee's report would be incomplete without expressing our thanks to Mrs. Kartzoff for her usual outstanding co-operation and assistance.

DEVELOPMENT

Progress on the planned development of the Club's premises has been inhibited by the general downturn of the economy of the country.

Working drawings and specifications have been prepared for alterations to the Clubhouse and Boatshed, but calling of tenders for the work has been postponed.

No. 2 slipway has been extended and a second cradle for the slip was constructed by a working bee. This cradle is intended for members to use for extended slipping periods.

Portion of the old "flat" building has been converted to a chandlery store and a workshop.

RACING

We had 118 yachts on the programme racing in 8 divisions, which is about the norm over the last few years.

The weather was kinder to us than usual, for although the breeze proved as fickle as ever it only rained on one Saturday for the entire season. Committee members are not taking the credit for this in case they can't pull it off again next year.

Organisationally the season had remarkably few incidents, thanks to the efforts of the Committee. With the elimination next year of two separate fleets rounding marks in different directions we are looking forward to 1975/76 being better still.

It is not usual to highlight the performance of any particular yachts, but two of our yachts had such outstanding seasons they require special mention. Firstly Warren Anderson's "Granny Smith" had a wonderful season highlighted by his performance in the Hobart race, and secondly Laurie Schneider in "Larriken" won the Point Score, Kelly Cup and State Thunderbird Championships. Special mention is also due to: Mrs. Kartzoff who, in spite of being thrown from a horse and having to work from her home for two months, still managed to produce programmes and keep track of the point score; Jack Millard, Ray King and Doug Quane, who are so effective in our Starter's Boat; and our enthusiastic Racing Secretary, Peter Hamilton.

SYDNEY AMATEUR SAILING CLUB DIRECTORS' REPORT

In accordance with a resolution of the board of directors, the directors report as follows with respect to the club's profit for the financial year ended 31st May, 1975, and the state of the club's affairs at that date.

1. The directors in office at today's date are as stated on the previous page.

2. The principal activities of the club in the course of the financial year comprised sailing club, boat repairs and social activities. No significant change in the nature of those activities occurred during the year.

3. The net profit of the club for the financial year amounted to \$2,173. The results of the club's operations during the financial year were not, in the opinion of the directors, substantially affected by any item, transaction or event of a material and unusual nature.

4. The directors recommend that no dividend be paid.

5. Before the profit and loss account and balance sheet were made out, the directors took reasonable steps to ascertain details of the action which had been taken in relation to the writing off of bad debts and the making of provisions for doubtful debts and to cause all known bad debts to be written off and adequate provision to be made for doubtful debts.

6. At the date of the report the directors are not aware of any circumstances which would render the amount written off for bad debts or the amount of

the provision for doubtful debts inadequate to a substantial extent.

7. Before the profit and loss account and balance sheet were made out, the directors took reasonable steps to ascertain whether any current assets, other than those to which paragraph 5 applies, were unlikely to realise, in the ordinary course of business, their value as shown in the accounting records of the club. If in their view there was a deficiency they caused those assets to be written down to an amount which they might be expected to realise, or made adequate provision for the difference between that amount and the value shown in the accounting records.

8. At the date of this report the directors are not aware of any circumstances which would render the values attributed to current assets in the accounts

misleading

9. At the date of this report no charge exists on the assets of the club which has arisen since the end of the financial year and secures the liabilities of any other person. No contingent liability exists which has arisen since the end of the financial year.

10. No contingent or other liability has become enforceable or is likely to become enforceable within the period of twelve months after the end of the financial year which, in the opinion of the directors, will or may affect the ability of

the club to meet its obligations when they fall due.

11. At the date of this report the directors are not aware of any circumstances not otherwise dealt with in the report or accounts which would render any amount

stated in the accounts misleading.

12. In the interval between the end of the financial year and the date of this report no item, transaction or event of a material and unusual nature has arisen which is likely in the opinion of the directors, to affect substantially the results of the club's operations for the next succeeding financial year.

13. Since the end of the previous financial year no director of the club has received or become entitled to receive a benefit (other than a benefit included in the aggregate amount of emoluments received or due and receivable by directors shown in the accounts, or the fixed salary of a full time employee of the club) by reason of a contract made by the club, or a related corporation, with the director or with a firm of which he is a member, or with a company in which he has a substantial financial interest.

TROPHIES AND PRIZES

Club Point Score Competition—A Gold Medal will be awarded to the Club member who accumulates the greatest number of points during the season whilst he is a member.

A Silver Medal will be awarded to the Club member who accumulates the second greatest number of points during the season whilst he is a member. A Bronze Medal will be awarded to the Club member who accumulates the third greatest number of points during the season whilst he is a member.

- **Spring Point Score**—A trophy will be awarded to the yacht in each division leading in the handicap Point Score at Christmas (with no discards).
- **Summer Point Score**—A trophy will be awarded to the yacht in each division earning the most points in the handicap Point Score from January onwards (with no discards).
- **Scratch Point Score**—A trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Scratch Point Score in those divisions which have Scratch racing.
- Handicap Competition Points—Points will be scored as follows: Each yacht finishing will score points equal to the number of entries in the race less the number of yachts beating her. In addition seven points will be awarded for first place, four points for second place, two points for third place. Retiring yachts will receive one point.

 Only yachts entered for the whole season or for the remainder of the season, if a late entry, are eligible to receive points.

 Each yacht must discard the points of three races in the season. A race in which the yacht did not start or finish can be discarded. Otherwise the
- Scratch Competition Points—In Divisions providing Scratch races points will be awarded on the following basis:

races earning the least points will be discarded.

Each yacht finishing will score points equal to the number of entries in the race, less the number of yachts beating her. Retiring yachts receive no points

Each yacht must discard the points of three races in the season. A race in which the yacht did not start or finish can be discarded. Otherwise the races earning the least points will be discarded.

Handicapping:

An automatic handicap penalty will be applied of 5 minutes or 3 per cent for a win, 3 minutes or 2 per cent for second, 2 minutes or 1 per cent for third. A yacht which does not start in three consecutive races will have an automatic reduction of handicap.

Handicap variations may be made at the discretion of the Racing Committee.

- **Kelly Cup**—Perpetual Trophy for competition between the leading yachts from all divisions in the Point Score Competition.
- Gretel Trophy—A perpetual trophy of a Gold Cup presented by the late Sir Frank Packer to the winner of the No. 1 Division Point Score.
- H. S. Lloyd Memorial Trophy—A perpetual trophy presented by the Lloyd family to the winner of the Second Division Point Score.
- John Taylor Cooke Memorial Trophy—A perpetual trophy presented by H. E. and J. E. Pfeiffer to the winner of the Third Division Point Score.
- **P. J. Worrall Trophy**—A perpetual trophy awarded to the winner of the Thunderbird Division Scratch Point Score.
- Daydream Shield—A perpetual trophy donated by Mr. Peter Fletcher for competition between M.H.Y.C. and S.A.S.C., in inter-club races.

- Nominated Skippers' Race—Yachts to be sailed by a crew member other than the regular skipper. A trophy is presented to the winner in each division.
- Centenary Plate—Each skipper who wins a gold medal scores a point towards the Centenary Plate. The first skipper to score 3 points wins the trophy outright.
- Centenary Trophy—As a result of the race held closest to Founder's Day (19th October) a perpetual trophy awarded to the skipper who, on handicap, wins by the greatest margin within his division.
- **Tempest Memorial Trophy**—A perpetual trophy presented to the winner of the 5.5 division point score.
