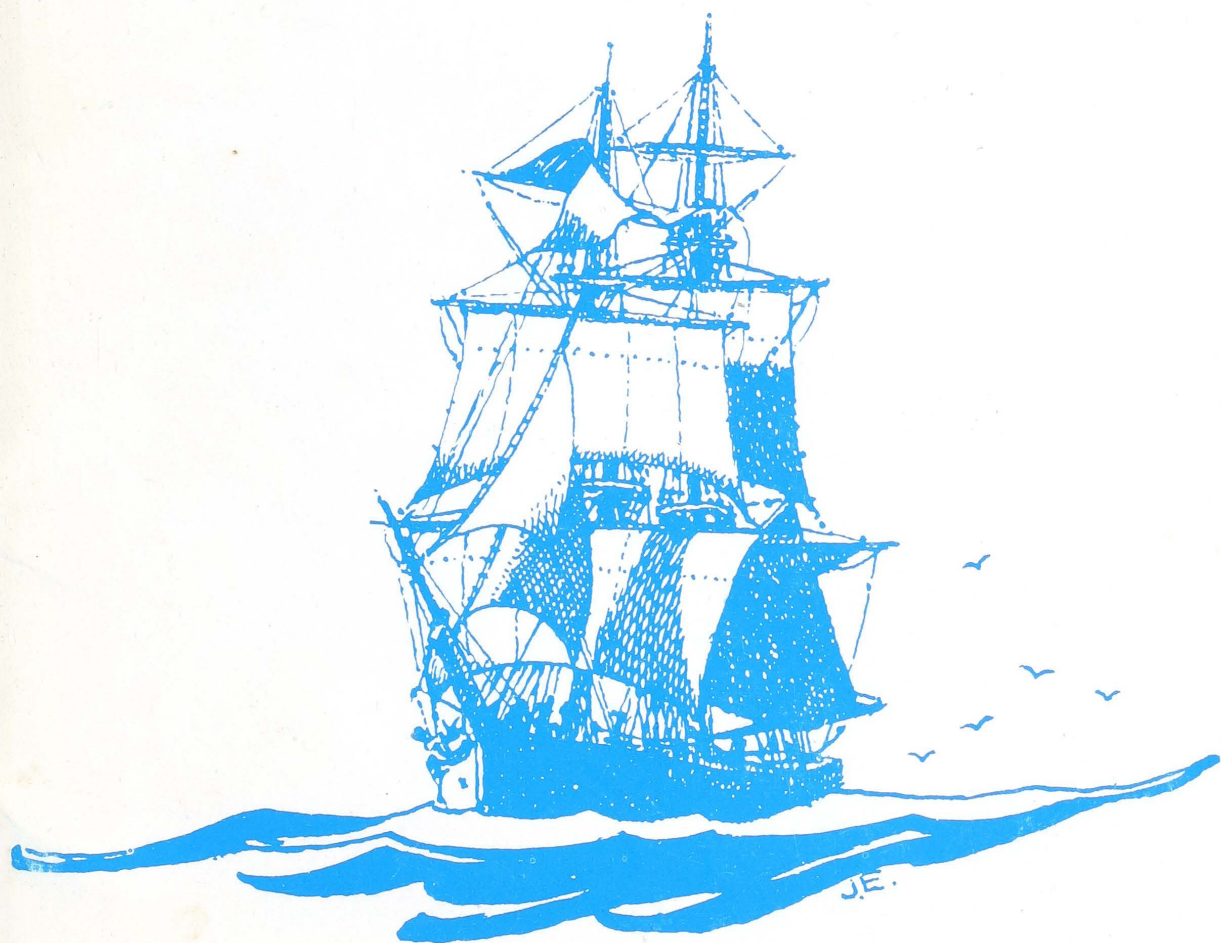

## COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 1985-86

I am pleased to present the 114th Annual Report of the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club.

Firstly, I was particularly grateful to the Directors for electing me to this very important position of Commodore in the Club and in the yachting fraternity when Mr. David Willis resigned.

The past year has been one of importance, both to the members and in the history of the Club, due to the completion of the extensions to the wharf area, and a new service wharf.

The new wharf will enable greater access to the Club from the water, and provide further mooring facilities when members are visiting the Club in their yachts.

A "Furniture Fund" was started with the objective of raising funds to purchase new furniture for the Clubhouse, and at the time of writing this report, the amount of money to accomplish this is building up very well.

A Committee has been formed for an S.A.S.C. Sydney-to-Jervis Bay race. Preliminary work resulted in expressions of co-operation from the Navy, interest by other Clubs and an exploratory voyage to Jervis Bay.

Despite magnificent efforts by S.A.S.C. Skippers and crews we failed to win the Daydream Shield, and it remained with the MHYC.

However, our members had their reward in the Canada Week Yacht race, and we won several of the major trophies competing against MHYC yachts.

The highlight of the racing was the end of the season barbecue at the Club when the competitive spirit on the Harbour was replaced by the pleasure of socialising with opposition yacht crews.

I am very pleased to have the support of the Vice Commodore Peter Garrow, and Rear Commodore Frank Tebbutt; and particular thanks to the Immediate Past Commodore John Jeremy; and to each of them for their continued interest in the promotion of the Club.

The Chairman of the Development Committee, John Rickards, is to be commended for his efforts in handling the supervision of the contract and erection of the new service wharf project.

Members are very fortunate that we have Fred Bevis as Treasurer; he deserves a great deal of credit for the successful financial state of the Club, and I refer members to his report.

To the Directors, Secretary, Treasurer and Committees for their co-operation; Jack Millard and the Starters, Mrs Suzie Blay, Mrs Nan Kartzoff, Peter Wargent, Adam Fitzgerald, Eric Ode and to all who helped make this such an outstanding year, thus helping to maintain the high standard of the Amateurs — my personal thanks.

As you will see from the above table, membership numbers are being maintained despite the difficult time being experienced. However members should make every effort to encourage applications and introduce new members to build our numerical strength in order to increase income and thereby keep costs down, and enable the club to provide more and better facilities.

The cost of \$93,000 (approx.) for the new wharf facilities is in line with the estimates provided to members earlier in the financial year, and it is anticipated that the repayment period for the loan of 5 years will be achieved and probably bettered.

The net surplus for the year after payment of all expenses and making all necessary provisions was \$17,179.00 compared with last year's surplus of \$4,844.

Subscriptions and charges for the coming year have been advised to members and are in line with those forecast by the treasurer at the Members' Meeting in June.

The Club's buildings, slipways and other assets have been fully maintained by the Club's staff and through efforts of the members in working parties during the year.

## **BOATSHED**

Vice-Commodore — P.T. Garrow (Chairman)

The past twelve months have been extremely active in the Boatshed area with the completion of the improvement to the slipways, repairs to the sliprails and further concrete work in the slip area.

Despite the time spent by the Boatshed staff in effecting this necessary work, the Boatshed Department has been able to finish the year ahead of its income budget and approximately 13% ahead of last year.

This excellent result in a year of economic restraint is a tribute to the hard work of Peter Wargent and his assistant Adam Fitzgerald. Both have worked with great enthusiasm during the year and deserve our congratulations on a job very well done.

During the year the Boatshed staff have been ably assisted by Eric Ode who apart from many facets of his responsibilities in the Club house has assisted in the Boatyard when the work pressure has intensified and has worked diligently to bring both the Captain Amora and the Nancy K to their present top condition.

A major re-organisation of the dinghy shed has been undertaken with the dinghy rack situated on the western wall being moved to the northern doorway. In the re-organisation we have found room for an increased number of dinghy racks and up to 30 new lockers (10 to be built immediately) and more as demand requires.

The new catamaran ferries with their heavy wake have caused a great deal more wear to moorings in the Bay, with the resultant increase in mooring maintenance fees. We are at present examining this problem and have called tenders from three major mooring service companies in an effort to reduce cost.

The esprit-de-corps prevailing within the Club made itself evident when a 'Working Bee' was organised to burn off and re-paint the Clubhouse and dinghy shed. A very large number of Members turned out with burners, scrapers and brushes and in a very short period the entire Clubhouse was burnt off and received 2 coats of paint. The third coat was later added by Adam Fitzgerald. My thanks to those Members who attended and obviously enjoyed this 'Working Bee'.

The installation of the new wharf facility created some inconvenience to Members wishing to launch dinghies. Whenever possible, we operated a tender service to assist Members and I would thank those Members inconvenienced for their patience during this period. I feel sure, the new facility will be well worth the trouble.

It was with a regret we accepted the resignation of Peter Wargent, effective 31st May 1986. In the three years he has managed the Boatshed, he has introduced many innovative ideas and re-organised much of Boatyard to the benefit of our operation. We wish him the very best of success for the future.

At the time of going to press with this report we are in the process of appointing a successor.

Finally I would like to express my thanks to the dedicated Members who comprised the Boatshed Committee — Tony Saunders, Max Miller, Bill Grant, Bob Lawler and Bill Brown happily gave of their time and expertise during the year and were of tremendous assistance in planning the boatshed operation over the past 12 months. To this very helpful group my sincere thanks.

From the outset the Sub-committee decided to pay attention to one of the major outcomes of the survey conducted by the Club several years ago — namely to provide cheaper functions. The Sub-committee felt that quite apart from heeding members' wishes, we might attract members other than the usual faithful, and perhaps including some of the younger members and their families.

Flag Officers' Night was an extremely pleasant and relaxing evening, embellished by an interesting and amusing after-dinner speech by our Immediate Past Commodore, John Jeremy.

On Gaffers' Day, the Sub-committee was responsible for organising the catering for the V.I.P. boat and for providing drinks and food at the Clubhouse for members, friends and visitors alike. It was a big day, and the efforts of our extended Sub-committee — including Bob and Dinica Carruthers, are to be commended for the service provided at this important function.

The Sub-committee felt that a change was needed for Christmas. We tried a Christmas Breakfast, with Santa arriving by tender for the children (and adults?). To our great satisfaction 113 guests thoroughly enjoyed the occasion, the profits from which enabled us to purchase the new Club barbecue. This equipment has been available along with unbelievably priced steaks, bread and condiments for Divisional get-togethers, and for members and their families and friends after the races on Saturdays.

Our Country and Western Night was intended to attract more of our younger members. This function was experimental, and while socially successful, failed to draw the numbers hoped for. Those present enjoyed the barbecue, the dancing, toss the horseshoe, hoopla, the numbered bottle game and the health remedies (farmers cuticles) provided by our resident con man from the east.

Our May breakfast was a sell-out, a rainy night giving way to a perfect day.

Dissatisfaction with our past venue for the Prize-giving Dinner Dance caused a widespread search for suitable alternate venues. Finally the Macquarie University Function Centre was booked. It is a much more flexible location, easy to get to, much more comfortable, and with a good reputation for its cuisine. It is also slightly more expensive, but with good company, a good meal, a much larger dance floor and a seven-piece jazz band, it is a venue befitting this most important function of our year. We look forward to an outstanding attendance — bookings at the time of writing being well ahead.

Our Monthly General Meetings at the Club are regarded as most important for the membership. We have had some extremely interesting speakers with a mix of topics to attract both racers and cruisers, and every effort is being made to keep up the high standard. Good attendances have been noticeable.

These activities have not been carried out without the assistance of the members of my Sub-committee. Though all are busy people, they have been noticeable for their concern to provide the membership with the best of service no matter what the personal inconvenience. I have the greatest admiration for their selfless efforts.

A special word of thanks is due to Jeanette Percival who has unfailingly helped us to enjoy our refreshments each racing Saturday and on General Meeting nights.

## **DEVELOPMENT REPORT**

During the year the Board received approval of the MSB for the engineering design of the new service wharf and ramp. Following a special General Meeting of Members on 20 November 1985 a contract was let with R. Jenkins Constructions Pty Limited for the new installation. At the time of writing the project was virtually complete subject only to the installation of safety guards and the cost was within the estimates submitted to the November meeting.

The Boatshed Committee will be publishing rules for the use of the service wharf, however, Members should remember that while the pontoon weighs approximately 40 tonnes there will be significant movement in surge conditions between the pontoon, the piles and the ramp. It is important that all safety notices and guarding are observed, and that care is taken not to damage the structure when berthing or loading or unloading heavy items.

During the year, the Club was fortunate to obtain a sponsorship for the Captain Amora Starting Boat from AGC Limited. The contract is for 3 years and will provide for the running costs and maintenance of the boat for this time. Congratulations to Tony Saunders on an excellent effort.

## RACING

This year completes our first year using a computer to "crunch the numbers". It has resulted in far less reliance on the starting officials to process results and sets up the Club's Racing System to be more tolerant of untrained volunteers as they may be needed in future. It paves the way for the results to be radioed in from the finishing vessel and computed before many have returned to the Clubhouse. It further relieves pressure on the Race Committee as its logic can be blamed for the handicaps although the Club reserves the right to make arbitrary changes. We are indebted to Ross Munn, origins Middle Harbour Yacht Club, for his application in this matter. (We use the same program as M.H.Y.C.)

The Amateurs lost the Daydream Shield to Middle Harbour again by a close margin. The Offshore boys made it to Hobart in greater numbers this year and it is worth noting that as the size of members' yachts gradually increases our Ocean fleet is building.

Championships for the Cavalier 28's and Thunderbirds were conducted and judged well run events by all involved. Again the Computer was invaluable. Idle Hour Day and the Bob Brown Race to Pittwater remain two Club events that are well attended and popular.

This year we launch a Winter Series which is based on the success of a mid-winter race and raft-up in Middle Harbour last year. At the time of writing entries are very promising and I believe that the once every three week series is here to stay.

Special thanks to Jack Millard, Ray King and their starter's crew. Their consistent ability and knowledge is a model for other Clubs. Rosemary Hay, Race Secretary has again performed her duties tirelessly and has put a great deal of effort into de-bugging the computer program. It would not have happened without her! The Race Committee has met irregularly in person but many times over the phone in the past year. I thank all the Division Representatives for their co-operation.

The size of the Racing Fleet continues to concern some, as numbers have dwindled a little in the past years. I do not see this as a problem with the Amateurs but rather a social change in boat owners and their means. In brief, the typical member of some years ago with a small boat, limited finances and a "do it yourself" attitude finds that the time and money to keep a boat in the lower Harbour is beyond his ability. Thus, up river Clubs have gained numbers and Ocean Racing Fleets have increased in size as the Harbour is very crowded on Saturdays.

Our Racing will thrive if we, as Competitors, gain a solid reputation for good sportsmanship, close racing and general keenness. It rubs off, and each individual can attract others if he sells the Club's Racing in his attitude. Sharing fleets with other Clubs promotes Racing overall, generally strengthening our position with relation to outside bodies which occasionally threaten our rights to use the Harbour. It's over to you, with the new pontoon nearly finished I look forward to meeting many more of the racing personalities back at the Club House after the Saturday Racing!

**2. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY OF THE CLUB**

The principal activity of the club during the financial year was to promote the sport of amateur sailing.

There was no significant change in the nature of that activity during the year.

**3. TRADING RESULTS**

The net surplus of the club for the year ended 31st May 1986 was \$17,179. No provision for income tax was necessary.

**4. REVIEW OF OPERATIONS**

The club successfully continued to conduct its Saturday racing program and other special events.

During the year work commenced on the construction of the pontoon project and the extension of the boatshed wharf.

The volume of work being undertaken by the boatshed was similar to the past year.

Membership numbers have remained in line with last year and it is expected that the current year would not see any major change.

**5. SIGNIFICANT CHANGES**

A loan of \$50,000, repayable over five years, was negotiated with the State Bank to finance a little over half the pontoon project cost of \$95,971.

The starters boat and work boat have been revalued at a directors valuation as at the 31st May, 1986 of \$18,000 and \$3,500 respectively.

**6. EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO BALANCE DATE**

In the interval between the end of the financial year to the date of this report, no matter or circumstance has arisen that has significantly affected or may significantly affect—

- (i) the operations of the club;
- (ii) the results of those operations; or
- (iii) the state of affairs of the club in subsequent financial years.

## 7. LIKELY DEVELOPMENTS IN THE CLUB'S OPERATIONS

The club will continue to promote the sport of amateur sailing through its racing and training programs.

It is anticipated that upgrading and replacement of the clubhouse furniture will be undertaken in the coming year.

## 8. DIRECTORS' BENEFITS

Since the end of the previous financial year no director of the club has received or become entitled to receive a benefit by reason of a contract made by the club with the director or with a firm of which he is a member, or with a company in which he has a substantial financial interest.

### NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of the club's accounts. Unless otherwise stated such accounting policies were also adopted in the preceding year.

- (a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and do not take into account changing money values.
- (b) Bank Overdraft:  
Cheques drawn and not presented at the club's bank at 31st May are classified as creditors.
- (c) Depreciation and amortisation of fixed assets:  
Fixed assets are being depreciated or amortised on the straight line method by sufficient charges to write off the costs of the assets over their expected useful lives.
- (d) Long service leave:  
The long service leave liability has been recorded in the accounts in respect of employees having completed at least five years service with the club. The liability in respect of employees who will have nine years service or more will be reflected as a current liability.
- (e) Stock on hand:  
Stock on hand has been valued at lower of cost and net realisable value.
- (f) Income tax:  
No provision for income tax is necessary as the club is exempt from taxation by virtue of the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.
- (g) Financial reporting by segments:  
The club operates predominantly in one industry — the promotion of amateur sailing, and in one geographical area — Sydney.
