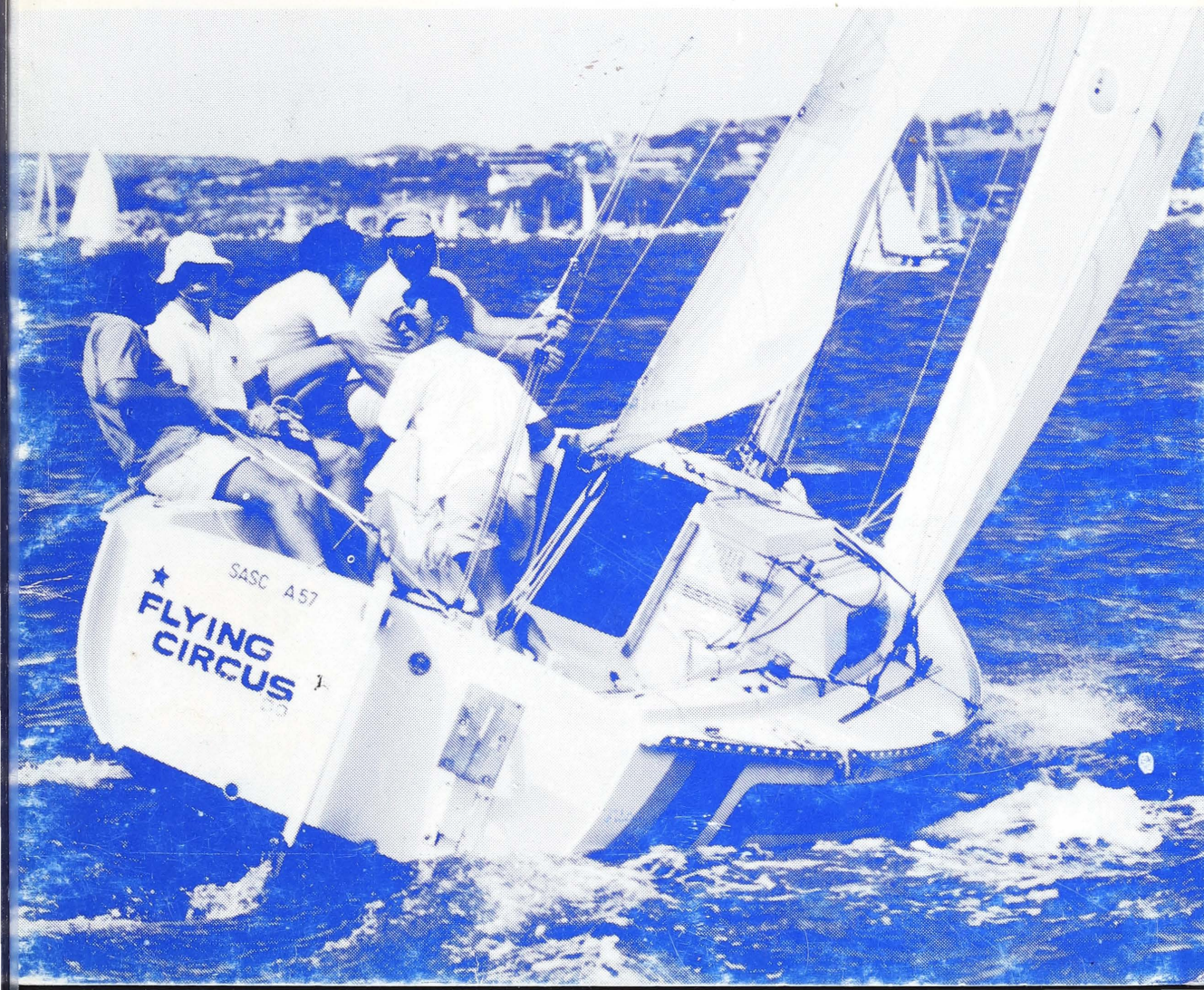

## COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 1987-88

It is with great pleasure in this, Australia's Bi-centenary year, I present the 116th Annual Report of the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club.

The Club continued, during the past year, to make excellent progress in almost every department, in no small way influenced by the very hard work invested in the Club by many dedicated members.

Perhaps the highlight of the year was the Bi-centennial Gaffers Day. Although for the first time we were faced with less than perfect weather, the day was still an outstanding spectacle and a huge success. We were extremely proud to have for the first time as our guest, our Patron, the Governor of New South Wales His Excellency Air Marshal Sir James Rowland, A.C., K.B.E., D.F.C., A.F.C., accompanied by Lady Rowland. Joined by all our honoured guests on the *M.V. Mantaray*, I believe our Club presented itself in the very best possible fashion.

A record of over 100 entries, with representatives from every state in Australia, made this a day for the Club to long remember.

My sincere thanks to Bill Gale the Gaffers Day Chairman, John Jeremy the parade co-ordinator, Geoff McCorquodale, Jim Davern, the Flag Officers and all who worked so hard to ensure this day's success.

### FINANCE

**Overview:** Gross revenue of approximately \$318,800, an increase of 17% compared to the previous year has again left a small surplus, some \$5,800 after meeting all outgoings and a debt reduction. The Club continues to pay its way while supplying various services to members at reasonable cost and keeping its assets in working order. In overview, the Club is in a sound position, has no loan, but must pay regard to rising costs and the need to maintain the tender, to make improvements to the Starters boat and the slipways. With careful management these requirements can be met.

As to the major cost centres:-

**Administration:** Revenue credited of \$66,014 was an increase of 8% over the previous year. Outgoings were well contained and left a surplus of \$8,633 compared to a small under-recovery in the previous year. The major variations contributing to this were lower interest charges, a small decrease in salaries paid and in bank charges. Off setting were increases in insurance and in printing postage and stationery but there are no causes for major concern.

**Racing:** This department always runs at a loss but this year the deficit was only \$928 compared to \$5,754 last year. Total outgoings were very close but the additional entrance fees from the successful Twilight and Winter series contributed significantly to the favorable end result.

**Boatshed:** Gross revenue to the boatshed account from mooring fees slipway work, dinghy stowage and locker hire was up 12% on the previous year, a significant contribution being income from the 12 additional moorings. The cost of these moorings was written off to expense rather than to capital and accordingly affected the end result. Of serious concern is the fact although revenue from slips and slipwork is up 8% labour and material costs have increased by 18%. In other words the Club is not gaining the net income it ought to be from this activity. This problem has been recognised and is being addressed. A major gain in this account was the large reduction in insurance, mostly workers compensation, that was successfully negotiated during the year.

**Clubhouse:** Receipts from social events were in excess of related outgoings by some \$9,786 or 26% but overall, this cost centre, as in previous years was again in deficit. This is because the account bears the cost of running the clubhouse and maintaining the building for which there is no directly allocated income.

## **BOATSHED**

### **Vice Commodore's Report**

From the commencement of this year the Boatshed Committee Members have been kept busy with both maintenance works and planning of upgrading works aimed at preserving the Club's assets.

The pontoon guiding systems have been modified with a considerable measure of success, however the performance of some of our U.T.A. ferry drivers is such that continual maintenance will be required.

The new fore and aft moorings have presented some minor problems which have been largely overcome. The benefit of the additional mooring has justified the Development Committee's actions in acceding to the M.S.B. pressures for concentrated mooring systems.

The two major projects in hand are the refurbishing of the Club tender and the replacement of slip rails on No. 1 slip. Both projects are long overdue and the need for repairs involved is obvious. The Committee apologises for inconvenience caused to members by the temporary absence of tender and slip facilities. Progress so far is on budget thanks to member's volunteer labour and assistance with provisions of materials.

New projects for which the Board has given approval in principle are:

1. Re-building of No. 2 slip cradle to accommodate yachts of wider beam and greater draught; and
2. Building of galley facilities and internal refurbishing of the Club Starter's boat.

It is envisaged that these works will be completed before commencement of the 1988 Spring season.

A special vote of thanks is due to Boatshed Committee Members and to Club Members who have been most generous with their time in getting our maintenance and upgrading programmes under way at a cost which maximises the benefits available from the Club's financial resources. I trust that this willingness to get in and help will spread to the new members joining the Club and the old traditions of the Club in this regard can be maintained.

Finally, I wish to record my appreciation of the efforts of Glenn Dickson, Adam Fitzgerald and Eric Ode in establishing work standards of a very professional level which can only serve to attract more business and provide a first-class service to members.

The main project this year has been the completion of the fore and aft mooring system in the North-Western and Eastern side of Mosman Bay. In the last report it was mentioned that the Club had appointed an official yacht broker. It is pleasing to report that this venture has been a success and a steady income flow has resulted.

During the year a number of development projects were considered by the Board. The major project currently being investigated in detail is the refurbishment of the Men's Changeroom. Depending upon the cost (and the Treasurer smiling kindly) we will keep members informed of progress.

## RACING

The 1988 Cavalier 28 State Championships did not have the inter-club element, the fleet being mainly S.A.S.C. yachts. However they spent most of their time chasing a visiting boat crewed by 18ft sailors.

Both Championships were wound up back at the Clubhouse with S.A.S.C. hospitality ensuring the success of these events.

## NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of the club's accounts. Unless otherwise stated such accounting policies were also adopted in the preceding year.

- (a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and do not take into account changing money values, except to the extent to which they are reflected in the revaluation of certain assets.
- (b) Bank Overdraft:  
Cheques drawn and not presented at the club's bank at 31st May are classified as creditors.
- (c) Depreciation and amortisation of fixed assets:  
Fixed assets are being depreciated or amortised on the straight line method by sufficient charges to write off the costs of the assets over their expected useful lives.
- (d) Stock on hand:  
Stock on hand has been valued on a first in, first out basis at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
- (e) Income tax:  
No provision for income tax is necessary as the club is exempt from taxation by virtue of the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.
- (f) Financial reporting by segments:  
The club operates predominantly in one industry—the promotion of amateur sailing, and in one geographical area—Sydney.
