One of our Club's great traditions for its Commodore is to present to members the Annual Report. Our 123rd report is no exception, particularly for me, as the July A.G.M. signals the end of my stewardship of our proud sailing club.

The financial stability and strength of our club continues, and reflects the effort and resolve of our current Board of Directors.

We were again able to improve club facilities from accrued resources, with major investment in the Club's starter boat "Captain Amora". We end this club year, at last, without debt and able to finance future expenditure when required from within.

At this time I wish to express my gratitude for the co-operation and support given me from fellow Flag Officers and Directors over the last three years.

I also thank our members whose patronage of the Club's many activities during this period, ensures our continued success well into the future.

Boatshed

Rising costs and a general downturn has effected this department.

- Fred Bevis with his team have worked hard to maintain a quality service for our members over the last year. Sadly this has not resulted in additional revenue.
- Our new committee will clearly need to raise the game plan in this department if the boatshed is to once again be a positive achiever.

House Committee

Ross Munn again organised and managed a very successful social year for our members.

The conscious support from his house committee, also the genuine enthusiasm Ross has received from the skippers of volunteer duty boats throughout the Friday Twilight Social Races is a credit to all.

Our Friday night social has become legendary and I congratulate Ross on his stirling effort as Rear-Commodore during the last three years.

Club Racing

Club racing strategies again rightly dominated a large portion of our racing committee's time this year.

The recent survey was part of the ongoing management of this department, and by season end a new and innovative program was presented to the May General Meeting, also the June Board Meeting, and will be the basis for club racing during the 1995-96 season.

As previously mentioned this young and enthusiastic committee, together with our divisional captains and chaired by Philip Brown has organised a racing program I believe to be the most innovative in the club's history and designed to meet the modern members busy lifestyle, allowing all members to race at a time best suited to them.

The new program will detail our traditional two season point score series.

Within the Spring/Summer season two additional point score races of five race duration will be held concurrently.

It is also intended to reintroduce a non-point score opening of the season regatta race.

During late spring we will hold an invitation regatta open to all members, also yachts from visiting Sydney clubs.

A short series three day point score regatta is also included in the program.

With the above plus Sunday metre racing, also Tuesday or Friday twilight racing, the potential to produce the most comprehensive racing season for us all is exciting and I urge our members to join in and participate in the club's new season.

Finance

Tony Clarkson now with a full financial year behind him, has certainly settled down into our club administration admirably and I thank him for this ongoing enthusiasm.

Tony has kept a close eye on expenditure thus ensuring the club lives within its means and I thank him for his continued support regarding the club's financial responsibility.

The 1994/95 balance sheet shows a close to break even year.

Disappointingly a decrease in slipways revenue has accounted for the bulk of the club's drop in revenue this year and will need close attention to detail during the 1995/96 year.

We also had some once off catchup regarding wages plus some carry over expenditure from last year.

Not forgoing the above, in all it was a good year and the club is certainly in a good financial state.

Starters

Both Vic Dibben and Peter Garrow between them, have started 95% of all Club racing this year.

Vic predominantly starting Saturday point score racing, as well as most Sunday metre boat racing and also some of our feature races.

Peter, who introduced Friday Twilight racing while Commodore, continues to be club starter for this series as well as the Tuesday Twilight Point Score series and also some of the club's feature races.

Both Vic and Peter have donated many of their leisure hours to club racing duties, as well as the time required to perform their club responsibilities as

Club Directors and I thank them both for their genuine and enthusiastic support.

The club would certainly be poorer without their individual effort.

Administration

The Club like all organisations is made up from the threads of many, and all help weave the rich tapestry we call the S.A.S.C..

The smooth well oiled machine that helps keep our Club functioning for all members to enjoy, is our staff.

Largely working quietly throughout the year their individual efforts can be measured and makes the difference regarding quality services to each of us.

So, on behalf of our members, I thank our permanent staff for their individual contribution to Club's welfare: Faye-Administration, Jeanette-Social, Roy-Racing, James-Clubhouse, Phil and Rod-Boatshed.

As I near the end of my report to you for 1995, also my Commodore's term, I pass on with pride the Club's helm to our new Commodore and Committee.

For me the position has been fun, it has involved extra responsibilities and work, but equally balanced by social and job satisfaction, also in the knowledge that our club continues to prosper and maintain that rich tradition that is the Amateurs.

It would be remiss of me in closing not to thank Lillian my wife and sailing partner who has supported me throughout my club career since joining the Club's Board of Directors . A club member in her own right, Lillian has made a positive contribution to our Club and its members.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION MEMBERSHIP

Unfortunately, membership has declined slightly during the year with 18 new members joining and 27 resigning. Membership totalled 403 at the years end.

FINANCE

The Club has reported a deficit for the year of \$4,308, compared to a deficit last year of \$1,595. The result includes maintenance to club boats of \$14,677. Poorer revenue from the Slipway operations have been somewhat offset by improved results from Clubhouse activities resulting in a similar result to last year. Whilst cash has not increased, the Club ended the year in a stronger overfall financial position due to the substantial reduction in the Club's liabilities.

Total revenue fell from \$488,404 last year to \$457,477, a decrease of 6%. Fewer new members joining and poorer slipway sales were the main causes for the lower revenue.

Slipway sales fell from \$164,672 last year to \$137,466, a decline of 17%. The reduction of profit from these activities has been partly offset by lower repairs and maintenance resulting in a surplus for the year of \$27,896 compared to \$36,454 last year.

On the other hand Clubhouse receipts increased from \$78,800 last year to \$84,441 this year, and increase of 7%. No doubt the continuing popularity of Friday night racing is largely responsible for this improved result. With lower repairs and maintenance during the year, the Clubhouse reduced its deficit from \$38,183 last year to \$24,961 this year.

Revenue from race entry fees also decreased during the year, from \$23,227 to \$21,074, a decrease of 9%. Whilst we were not required to make substantial back payments to the YA for buoy maintenance, the Directors did decide the refurbish the "Captain Amora" at a net cost of \$8,916 to the club. But for the sponsorship of Hempel Paints, this cost would have been substantially higher.

Spending on capital items totalled \$7,598 compared with \$13,661 last year and included a new racing computer, new office printer, more chairs for the clubhouse, better storage for solvents and a new blue phone.

As I have mentioned earlier, I believe the finances of the Club are in good shape for the coming year and we would be able to satisfactorily cope with planned expenditures.

Finally, I would like to thank Faye Buckley for the continuing high standard of her work, her efforts to reduce club overheads and for the assistance she has given me during the year. I would also thank all club employees, the Directors and Officers for their co-operation which has enabled the successful operation of the finance and administration function.

BOATSHED

Vice Commodore's Report

Activity on the slips has declined from the previous year, which was an exceptionally good year, but remains at reasonable levels compared with past years. The slipway charges have been reviewed to help encourage members to make more use of them. The package of competitive rates, being able to work with slipway staff, the use of Club facilities and tools remains a great asset to members.

During the year Bernard Connellan resigned for personal reasons and his position has been filled by Rod Phillips who brings to the slipways his shipwright skills. Phil McWilliams has continued his good work running the slipways and has many fine spray jobs to his credit.

Considerable work was undertaken by the slipway staff on both the "Captain Amora" and the "Nancy K" and both boats are now in good shape.

Slipway operations in the future will attract more attention from an environmental aspect and it is with this in mind, the Club is undertaking work shortly to have catchments across the slipway to help prevent material removed from boats hulls being washed into the harbour.

Thanks to the Boatshed Committee for their help during the year and to the boatshed staff for their continued good work and support. The tender drivers have continued to provide a good service with Andrew Bustos coordinating. Thanks go also to Faye, who with her timely reminders, has saved my bacon a number of times.

DEVELOPMENT

During 1994/95, work on the Club's facilities concentrated on maintenance tasks, and work which will extend the life and usefulness of existing assets. Work carried out during the year to improve the starter's boat " Captain Amora" falls into this latter category.

No progress was made during the year on the planned improvements to the external appearance of the clubhouse which had been forecast in last year's report. It was considered that other needs were of a higher priority and cosmetic improvements can be undertaken as resources permit in later periods.

Plans for improved pollution control on the slipways have been finished and this work is expected to be completed early in 1995/96.

The Board has also approved a major upgrading of the fire protection arrangements at the club by the installation of a sprinkler system and the upgrading of the water supply to fire hoses and other club services. This work is also expected be completed early in the coming year.

These projects, together with continued maintenance of slipway facilities and the pontoon, are expected to absorb most of the available resources for the coming year. As the work proceeds, future planning will benefit from the work previously done on a long term plan, as described in last year's report.

RACING REPORT 1994/95

The diversity of the racing programme mentioned in the last annual report has continued this past season, and is about to be improved significantly for the coming season following the results of a member survey conducted prior to Easter 1995. Generally racing attendances have been greater in number of boats than for the 93/94 season, with doubling of entries in the midweek and winter series races but declining participation in full season pointscore series raced on Saturday afternoon, reflecting changing work patterns and lifestyles. The great enthusiasm and spirit of enjoyment and cooperation in the racing by Members and their crews has been a most notable feature of this past season, and remains a key to the Amateurs atmosphere.

During the 1994/95 racing season the SASC conducted Saturday afternoon racing for the Divisions 1, 2 and 7, Traditional, and Cavalier 28 fleets; Sunday racing for the Metre and Traditional boats; weekday twilight events based on A and B Division mixed fleets on Fridays (20 non-pointscore races) and on Tuesdays (5 spinnaker pointscore races); a Winter series for A and B mixed fleets (4 pointscore races); and an offshore pointscore series for SASC

yachts based on the combined yacht club race series. In addition we held annual special events including Idle Hour Race, Daydream Shield (retained by SASC against MHYC), Ladies Day, Kelly Cup/Tara Ipo Trophy, and the Bob Brown Race to Pittwater on Easter Thursday. The SASC also conducted championships for the Cavalier 28 fleet (NSW Titles) and the S 80 fleet (National Titles). The combined SASC/RSYS Half Ton fleet raced with the RSYS during 1994/95 season.

The Saturday pointscore racing continues strongly in Division 2 with 15 regular boats, and in Division 7 with 10 regulars in it's 8 race series. However the Saturday fleet diminished in numbers causing the combining of the Traditional Divisions into a single fleet of 17 boats, and the suspending of Division 1 for the Summer half season. A new format is to be introduced this coming season for Saturdays providing two shorter series of only 5 races for Division 2 and Traditionals within the usual full pointscore series, plus a series of Division 1 Harbour races which will not conflict with the combined SOPS series.

The 1995 Winter and the Friday Twilight Series each have regularly attracted 50 to 60 boats onto the water. This year SASC welcomed the RSYS winter fleet for our 4 races adding 16 boats to the 50 SASC entries. We saw a doubling of the entries for the short Tuesday night Twilight Pointscore Series to 25, perhaps encouraged by the 6.20 pm start and very keen competitive racing. The Bob Brown fleet was the biggest seen for some years with 25 yachts arriving at the Basin.

This season our Starters Boat "Captain Amora" and Tender "Nancy K" took on a smart new livery courtesy of new sponsors Hempels Paints. Both boats not only look very trim but are now in excellent condition as a result of the refit work carried out by the SASC yard.

New events for the 1995/96 racing calendar will see the reintroduction of an Opening Regatta, once quite a spectacle with ferries provided for the families and friends of participating sailors. Your Race Committee looks forward to attendance by all SASC boat owners on this non pointscore gala day, even if it is the only race day your boat appears. In mid September SASC will conduct a race to Lion Island and back, also reintroducing an old tradition. In addition SASC will conduct an Invitation Regatta 10 days prior to Christmas for a variety of divisions, with races on Saturday and Sunday of the same weekend.

Sincere thanks must go to all those Members and volunteers who have made this past season of racing possible, these include our Starters Vic Dibben and Peter Garrow and their crews, special events Starters, and members of the Race Committee consisting of Division Representatives, Starters, Safety and Protest Officers. My personal thanks to Race Secretary Paul Foster and our executive Assistant Race Secretary Roy Simmonds for their efforts and assistance during the season.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with, applicable Accounting Standards and the Corporations Law, including the disclosure requirements of Schedule 5 of the Corporations Regulations. The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the accounts.

DEPRECIATION OF FIXED ASSETS

Fixed assets are being depreciated on the straight line method by sufficient charges to write off the costs of the assets over their expected useful lives.

STOCK ON HAND

Stock on hand has been valued on a first in, first out basis at the lower of cost and net relisable value.

INCOME TAX

No provision for income tax is necessary as the club is exempt from taxation by virtue of the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Provision is made in respect of the company's liability for annual leave and long service leave at balance date. Long service leave is accured in respect of all employees with more than 5 years' service with the Club.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred. The company has no legal obligation to provide benefits to employees on retirement.

FINANCIAL REPORTING BY SEGMENTS

The club operates predominantly in one industry - the promotion of amateur sailing, and in one geographical area - Sydney.
