COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 2002/2003

This past year our Club has reflected in miniature all the activities and difficulties associated with such organisations generally. Following the election there was some member disquiet regarding the management of proxy votes. The proxy form has now been altered to allow a member to instruct his or her proxy exactly how to vote. The new form, showing candidates standing for election (if an election is necessary), is issued to all members and they may indicate on the form exactly how they wish to vote. The Board was able to make this change within the existing scope of the Articles of Association.

The new pontoon was completed and under the watchful eye of John Jeremy and with slight adjustment to the mooring system has successfully passed its defects period.

Space in the Mosman Boatshed remains fully leased with the SCEGGS school activities very much central to its success. The OK dinghy sailors continue to welcome the youth and on Thursday afternoons it is inspiring to watch a group of children, all new to the sport, sail out of the bay towards Athol Bight. The launch *Patrick Whittington* has been used extensively for these activities and has proven to be a useful asset.

The Adams 10 *The Amateurs* has been sailed more often than ever with a group of young men and women that surely represent the Club's future.

Our offshore group was represented once again by *Mark Twain* in Hobart. I believe that was her last trip south under the ownership of Mr O'Neill. It is sad to reflect that the nature of this event has changed to the degree that its attraction for the slower yachts and crews has considerably reduced.

Distracted by other matters, notably the risk of discharges to the harbour from the slipway, the Board has not completed the full risk management analysis started earlier in the year. However it continues and evidence of its effects may be seen with the erection of fences here and there.

Captain Amora suffered damage at her mooring and this has been repaired on our slipway. The matter of pollution and the slipway is under constant review. The Board is working with other slipway owners to assess just what standards will be applied now and in the future. Our priority is to maintain our yard in operation. Members are requested to be particularly vigilant and be aware of and understand their responsibilities regarding the prevention of unlawful waste from entering the harbour. Bear in mind that local Council officers may report an incident of pollution and any stained water visible off the end of our slipway may invite trouble.

Thank you to all that have assisted the Club during the year. Faye Buckley, Patrick Munn, Maggie Stewart, Denise Macintosh, Rod Phillips and the boatshed staff have again contributed enormously to the Club's smooth running. Robbie White has been far more than a tender driver, watching over us at the weekends and often closing the club building after the members have left.

FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Committee: Tony Clarkson, Tony Saunders, Richard Lamrock, and Fred Bevis.

The Club finished the year with a strong surplus of \$13,708 after charging depreciation of \$60,607. This compares to the last year surplus of \$3,316 and \$39,235 depreciation charge.

Operating revenue increased from \$552,219 last year to \$599,020 this year. Shipwright sales increased from \$159,496 to \$198,869 and this reflected the return to normal levels of activity on the slipway with Rod Philips' continued improvement from injury. Club labour was used to maintain club assets and this work was valued at \$9,320 compared to \$17,795 last year. The offset to this internal revenue is in the repairs and maintenance costs in each department.

Cash reserves, including deposits on call, have declined from \$229,222 to \$100,798.

The major use of the cash reserves this year has been the replacement of the pontoon for a total cost of \$164,580 of which \$142,720 has been in the current year. The new pontoon is being depreciated to provide funds for its future replacement, continuing the Club's normal conservative practice.

A new crane pylon has been successfully installed with Bob Lawler overseeing the work and the assistance of Club members. The Board has resolved to capitalise \$7,000 of the cost.

The Club had to face significant increases in insurance costs this year. The cost increases were anticipated and some club charges were adjusted, at the beginning of last year, to recover the increases.

I would like to thank Faye Buckley and Patrick Munn for their help and smooth running of the Club accounts during the year. Richard Lamrock has again been a tremendous help in preparing the final accounts for audit.

BOATSHED

The last year has been a particularly busy time for the boatshed at the Sydney Amateurs. The boatshed has achieved record sales, made a substantial move towards EPA compliance, resolved several major safety issues, maintained the Club's boats in first class order, and kept our moorings in good order and fully occupied.

Rod Phillips and his now apprentice, Brett Hobbs, have been fully occupied all year on the slips with their usual fare of clean and anti-foul jobs, complemented this year with several major restoration and full repaint jobs. The skill and dedication they have shown is a credit to them both and to the Club.

This was the year we had the long-anticipated environmental audit by the Environmental Officer from North Sydney Council. With the help of several of our members, Mike deBurca in particular, we are well on our way to achieving EPA compliance for the medium term. Members will see the changes when they use the slips, with the waste water from cleaning operations now being collected and pumped off-site.

The boatshed committee has continued to monitor the various safety issues involved in running the slipway and boatshed as part of the club's risk management procedures. In doing so various safety issues have been identified. With the help of Mark Brady an electrical safety audit was completed and any problems found rectified. Members will note that all our power tools and leads have now been checked and tagged. Gates and signs have now been erected around the slipway area as part of our ongoing safety program.

Robbie White, 'Robbie on the Nancy K', has again excelled himself with the tender service he has provided and with the condition in which he has maintained the Club's boats. Captain Amora and Nancy K continue to give sterling service and should do so for many years to come.

This year Peter McCorquodale has overseen the maintenance and allocation of our moorings and has managed to very smoothly ensure that the regular maintenance program has been maintained with near 100% occupancy.

For the future, with the members' support, your current committee is committed to continuing to improve the services currently offered to members while working on the long-term continuity of our slipway operation. This may well require, in the future, changes to the slipway environment. To this end the boatshed and development committees have started to look at our options, and now that the pontoon is finished this may well be the Club's next major project.

And finally my thanks to all those who have helped in the running of the boatshed this year, in particular, Rod, Robbie, Brett, Faye and the boatshed committee.

DEVELOPMENT

Following approval by the Waterways Authority of NSW, construction of the new pontoon began in October 2002. The contractor, The Jetty Specialist of Caloundra in Queensland, leased an area in White Bay for the job which was carried out by them with the assistance of some local sub-contractors. The old pontoon was removed on 4 November and taken to White Bay for disposal. The new pontoon was launched on 7 November and placed in position the same day. Installation was completed on 14 November.

The pontoon has performed well in one of the most difficult of locations, with its exposure to ferry wakes and rough conditions in southerly gales. Some minor modifications have been made to pile guides to reduce clearances and consequent noise.

With the completion of this major project attention is being directed to future plans for the Club, in particular the means to ensure environmental compliance at our slipways. The Boatshed is testing pollution control measures which can be introduced with modest expenditure and performance will be monitored to provide guidance for the development of any necessary long-term changes.

Apart from some necessary repairs to the pontoon ramps, no major development was begun during the year at the Mosman Boatshed. As indicated last year, priority is being given to the needs of our Cremorne headquarters.

There has been plenty of activity since the start of 2003. The National Regatta at Lake Macquarie was once again the culmination of months of training and preparation. Having arrived at the lake with a new mainsail and new No.1 headsail, we sailed five of the six races beyond the top-end range of a very tired and fat No. 3 headsail (we expect to redress this deficiency in our wardrobe prior to the next National Regatta). The one race held in strong No. 1 headsail conditions saw *The Amateurs* finish in a creditable second place.

Overall, we came away from the Regatta with a third on handicap and an eighth on scratch, one place behind last year's winner. As always, it was an exciting Regatta, leaving those involved thirsty to do it all over again.

The Amateurs continues its involvement with Club racing — Summer Series and Winter Series.

The Amateurs is once again campaigning in the CYC Winter Series. The CYC series affords excellent training opportunities due to the very exhilarating racing and spinnaker rides from the large and competitive fleet. In the 2002 racing year, *The Amateurs* came in second overall in Division C. After race five in the 2003 CYC Winter Series, *The Amateurs* was in fourth place overall.

Back at the Clubhouse, the Adams 10 Committee has been involved in two fundraising events this year; the *Trim Course* evening with Ian MacDiarmid and the *Starting Procedures and Crew Teamwork* evening with Neville Wittey. I am sure all who attended these functions appreciated the expert instruction, good fare (provided once again by Fiona Fitzgerald) and good value. It is hoped the Adams 10 Committee can continue with more presentations in this vein. I look forward to direct feedback from members about future events and subjects of interest. At the time of writing, a *Rules* evening is flagged prior to the start of the spring racing season.

The Adams 10 Committee, together with regular crew, has carried out the annual maintenance routine for the boat including slipping the boat and anti-fouling. A thorough inspection of the mast and standing rigging resulted in the replacement of all the rigging screws and through-deck bolt fittings at the chain plates and fore-stay through-deck fittings.

As always, I would like to emphasise that the Adams 10 is a Club training vessel available for all members and their guests. For any bookings or enquiries please contact the SASC Office.

RACING

During the 2002/2003 racing season the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club conducted around 60 races and more than 170 different boats competed in those races. Many of the boats came from other clubs on Sydney Harbour and some boats that competed in the Endeavour Regatta came from as far away as Lake Macquarie and Botany Bay. Those visitors who made it back to the Amateurs for drinks or prizegiving all agreed the SASC is one of the best and friendliest sailing clubs in Sydney — a great endorsement of the Club and its members.

However the series with the greatest number of starters was the Friday night twilight series with 54 entries. This year we introduced two new incentives for competitors. They were a trip for two (sponsored by Concise Systems) to Lord Howe Island which was won by Andrew Bird in *Lotus IV* and bottles of wine for the winners of each division. It has been agreed by the Board that similar prizes would be offered next season if a suitable sponsor can be found. Based on the number of entries the winter series of five races is the next most popular with a total of 42 entries — at time of writing this series is still underway.

The Race Committee met in April 2003 when the divisional representatives reported on the past season.

Saturday Racing

Division 1 — The number of starters this season was very disappointing with only six entries. The committee discussed the possibility of dropping the division or amalgamating it with Division 2 for those boats that wished to remain racing with the Amateurs. It was agreed that Division 1 would be kept in the programme next year to see how numbers went. It was also suggested that handicap starts be introduced.

Division 2 — Again this year the division hosted a very healthy fleet of 26 boats entered in the short series with 13 to 15 regular starters in the long series. *Impala*, owned and skippered by Kevin Tindall with his seasoned crew, took out nearly all the honours for the season.

Classic Division — Bill Gale reported that there were no complaints with the handicapping from the 16 starters in both long and short series. As every boat competed in the long series it was decided to drop the short series for the 2003/2004 season. A new NE course was introduced for the past season that worked very well.

Cavalier 28 Division — Jonathon Rosenberg reported that there were 16 to 18 regular starters in the Norm Brown (short) series with 8 to 10 starters in the long series. This year the Cavaliers had their State Championships with the RPEYC and all agreed it was a successful series.

OK Dinghies — The division's representative reported a reasonable fleet of nine boats, with a regular five to six starters. Four SASC Members also participated in the Australian and Inderdominion Championships held in Victoria over Christmas and in the annual teams race at Wangi on Lake Macquarie where they finished a credible fifth. The OK sailors are pleased to announce that the NSW OK association was successful in their bid to hold the 2006 OK Worlds at the Belmont 16 Skiff Club on Lake Macquarie — a number of our OK

sailors will be heavily involved in the organisation of that event.

Sunday Racing

Division 6 and Sunday Gaffers — these series again proved very popular with members with another a successful season.

Tuesday Racing

The Paul Slocombe Trophy series sailed on Tuesday evenings was particularly successful and the winner was decided in the last race with several boats possible winners. It was recommended to the Board (and agreed) that the Paul Slocombe series would be a medal series next season.

Offshore Races this year included the Lion Island Race, with 25 entries, and believe it or not all 25 boats started and enjoyed a very pleasant sail to Pittwater and back. The new format that limits the race to 10 hours to qualify as a Category 4 race proved very successful. The RSYS are including the race in their calendar next season, so we should expect even larger fleets. The Bob Brown was again a popular event, sailed this year in quite strong winds, a contrast to the previous year.

The 2002-2003 Opening Regatta was so poorly attended last year that it has been decided that it would be discarded next season. Special festivities will be arranged in conjunction with the opening point score race. The combined RANSA/SASC winter series was also poorly supported — and due to lack of interest may not be continued next season.

Special events included the Kelly Cup — won by *Reverie* and the Tara Ipo Trophy won by *Celeste*. The Daydream Shield competition with the Middle Harbour Yacht Club was held in March. The shield was retained by SASC with a convincing defeat of the MHYC by 14 races to 4.

Finally, I must thank my fellow Board members, the starters and their legion of helpers, SASC staff, and in particular an extra-big thanks to Maggie Stewart for all the help, assistance and guidance I received during the season.



PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES OF THE COMPANY

The principal continuing activity of the Company during the financial year was to promote the sport of amateur sailing.

TRADING RESULTS

The operating profit after income tax of the Company for the year to 31 May 2003 was \$13,708.

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

The Club's sailing, slipways and social programmes all continued satisfactorily.

Funds were expended on maintenance of the clubhouse and vessels. Other assets were satisfactorily maintained during the year. The replacement pontoon has been completed and the final payment made for a total cost of \$164,580 and this compares to the contract sum, including Waterways engineering report, of \$163,265. During the year the crane was

rebuilt and \$7,000 of that cost has been treated as capital expenditure. Expenditure will be required for the refurbishing of the Mosman Boatshed subject to appropriate justification. Such expenditure is not committed at this point in time.

The Club had 26 new members during the year. Membership now stands at 411.

DIVIDEND

No dividend has been recommended or paid during the year, as the Company's Articles of Association do not permit payment of dividends.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN STATE OF AFFAIRS

No significant changes have occurred in the state of affairs of the Club.

No matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Company, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Company in subsequent financial years

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated

Income Tax

No charge has been made in respect of income tax as the Company relies on the exemption from income tax granted by Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. Therefore, it is not appropriate to adopt the principles of tax effect accounting.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost or at fair value less any accumulated depreciation.

The carrying amounts of property, plant and equipment stated as valued at cost is reviewed annually by directors to ensure they are not in excess of the recoverable amounts from these assets. The recoverable amounts are assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present value in determining recoverable amounts.

The carrying amounts of property, plant and equipment stated as valued at fair value is reviewed annually by directors to ensure that they represent the amounts for which the assets could be exchanged between knowledgeable and willing parties in arm's length transactions.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is depreciated on a straight-line basis over their useful lives to the Company commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in at call deposits with banks or financial institutions.

Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the Company's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Long service leave is accrued in respect of all employees with more than 5 years' service with the Company.

The provision for employee entitlements has been measured at their nominal amount and is allocated between current and non-current liabilities, the current liability being the amount that is due to be paid in the ensuing twelve months. Because the Company has relatively few employees, the adoption of this basis is believed to produce a result which is not materially different from the present value method prescribed by AASB 1028: Accounting for Employee Entitlements.

Contributions are made by the Company to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred. This basis is representative of the pattern of benefits derived from the leased property.

Receivables and Revenue Recognition

Trade debtors are recognised and revenue is taken up when the Club services have been provided to members and visitors. Sales revenue represents gross proceeds received and receivable from customers. Collectability of trade debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectable are written off. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where some doubt as to collection exists.

Comparative figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation of the current financial year.

Other Income - MASC Merger

MASC members were given discounted membership terms for five years to 31 May 2005 to compensate for the value of assets acquired in the merger namely *Patrick Whittington* and the MASC Boatshed. This unearned income is included in the statement of financial position as deferred consideration and amortised over five years in the accounts as "other income".
