# Sydney Amateur Sailing Club COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 2005/2006

Some time ago your Board made a decision to concentrate on the development of the Club's core business, yachting on Sydney Harbour. This year we saw the results in all areas of the Club's activities, sailing, social and boatshed.

Our sailing fleet has expanded to levels not seen since our heyday in the seventies, with the addition of the Super 30s building our Saturday fleet to maximum starting fleet of over 90 boats. Our two twilight and Sunday fleets took our total starts in our busiest week to over 140 yachts, not bad for a club with just over 400 members.

The extra racing activity brought with it increased numbers at all our social activities and the deck at SASC has become the place to be after racing on a Summer Saturday. The major social event on the calendar was, of course, Gaffers' Day, with the Gaffers' Day Committee organising not only a brilliant event but also a brilliant day to hold it on.

The OK Dinghy World titles at Lake Macquarie have seen the virtual end of our OK fleet at the Mosman Boatshed with the school program likely to take over more of the shed next year. The Saturday morning Cadet fleet is very much a part of the Mosman Bay scene and will next year, we are told, will be joined by at least three Yngling keel boats for the senior students.

The slipway and the crew who work on it continue to maintain our boats and keep them racing. This service provides the Club with a moderate profit and an invaluable asset for the members.

Again our Treasurer has produced a conservative set of accounts showing a small loss with an increase in our cash reserve. This is, as predicted, slightly better result than last year and will put the Club in a good position if and when we proceed with the plan to upgrade the slipway.

And finally I would like to give my thanks, and I am sure those of all the members, to the employees and volunteers who have made it all possible. Patrick Munn and Megan Keogh in the office, who have made dealing with the office at SASC such a pleasure; Maggie Stewart and Denise Macintosh who have organized not only our busy racing calendar but also this year an outstanding Gaffers' Day; Rod Phillips, who with Brett and Ashley who have looked after our boats; Russ Chapman and the starters who again provided such excellent racing; John Jeremy who has produced our excellent newsletter and last but not least the Board members and other volunteers who have worked so hard this year.

# DEVELOPMENT

Over the last eighteen months the Board, with the help of Patterson Britton & Partners, has been working towards approval for an environmentally-friendly slipway. We now have the landowner's consent from NSW Maritime and will shortly be lodging our development application with North Sydney Council. On approval, which we would expect to be forthcoming, we will, after obtaining estimates for the work, call a general meeting so that the project can be fully discussed and assessed by the members before any commitment to proceed is made.

Minor works are currently underway to upgrade the kitchen, office and ladies change room.

# FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Whilst the deficit reported (\$3,556) is greater than last years (\$1,581), the financial results for the year show some improvement from last year. Cash reserves have increased by \$118,775 to \$373,610 partly due to the sale of the Adams 10 (\$39,000). Membership subscriptions increased by 10% (i.e. 5% above the fee increase). Revenue from race entries increased by \$9,643 (31%) (excluding race entry fees from Gaffers' Day). Social receipts were up 33% as was the cost of catering. Total insurance costs fell almost 40% from last year.

The year included Gaffers' Day. All income and expense has been allocated to the two accounts. The accounts show a deficit of \$6,644 from the function.

Whilst shipwright sales were up 14% from last year, the wages and materials bill was up 24%. The slip facility now operates on a labour cost to income ratio of 71%. Annual time utilisation of the slips is at 47%. The ratio of labour hours worked to hours sold was 62%.

Behind the small deficit for the year are provisions for the maintenance program currently underway at the Club. The provisions cover refurbishment of the kitchen and ladies toilet, new electrical distribution panel and office modifications.

As the Club has now accumulated substantial cash reserves, fees and charges increases for next financial year will be minimal.

I would like to think that the proposed expenditure on the slipway upgrade will be scrutinised by all members from a position where all are fully informed. In my opinion slipway services are an essential component of this Club's activities.

I would like to thank all the administration staff in particular Patrick Munn and Megan Keogh for their contributions to the smooth running of the Club during the year. I thank all members of the finance committee for their support. It is indeed an honour once again to have served as Treasurer of the Club.

# BOATSHED

The boatshed has had a steady year, with income showing a modest increase over last year. There has been some useful analytical work carried out by our Treasurer in reviewing the financial performance of slipway and boatshed sales. The aim of this work is to keep directors and members informed as to the efficiency of our boatshed operations. One of the difficulties with this type of analysis is comparing 'eggs with eggs'. Our slipway and boatshed cannot be realistically compared to similar (commercial) slipways, because the SASC facility is run for the benefit of our members, not as a commercial operation.

My thanks to Rod Phillips, Brett (star apprentice) Hobbs and Ashley De Abel for the cheerful and efficient way they deal with their workload and the whims and demands of members who invariably think that work on their boats should be done in half the time for a quarter the cost in the face of storm, tempest, pestilence and the other normal day to day interruptions at the Amateurs.

Some of you will recall that a major clean-up was held during the year, which resulted in approximately 10 cubic metres of rubbish being removed from the Dinghy Shed, with no apparent aesthetic or environmental improvement discernible after a day of hard work. Nobody has complained so they either don't know it has been thrown out or they don't care.

After years of discussion and masterful inactivity a winch has finally been installed on the small crane adjacent to *Jack Millard*. Members should note that this is not just a winch, this is a big and powerful winch, designed to protect aging directors and club members from damaging their backs while retrieving *Jack Millard* from Mosman's Bay.

*Captain Amora* and *Nancy K* have continued to provide sterling service. *Nancy K* in particular has probably just finished her hardest year yet if the increased numbers in our racing fleets are any indication. Apart from a couple of water pump impellers, *Nancy* has proved to be consistently reliable. Finding free days for maintenance is a difficult problem, such is the demand. I would like to thank our tender drivers, Mike Power and Warwick Brooks who provide such an excellent service ferrying members too and from their boats.

I would like to also thank my fellow directors for their assistance and advice. The Treasurer in particular has assisted my appreciation of the beauty of figures and increased my understanding of what is possible with MYOB.

Gaffers' Day and the Annual Prize Giving were two other occasions where the club was able to show off all that makes our location so exceptional.

Which leads me to remind all members that this is your clubhouse, and that you are welcome to use it as often as you like. The barbeques have been replaced (again) and are in great working order. The kitchen has been rearranged, and a number of pieces bought to increase its use, such as pots and serving plates, and we have plans to further upgrade the kitchen in the next year. It is always good to come down to the club on a Sunday afternoon and see a group, or groups of members enjoying their club. Remember to book in with Patrick or Megan if you are planning a large group.

Unfortunately due to a need to focus on my own business I will not be standing for re-election this year. I would like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow directors, and all members, for their support and feedback. I hope to again serve this wonderful club in the future.

# RACING

The 2005–2006 racing season at the SASC has been a huge success with increased numbers of boats sailing in most divisions. The introduction of a Super 30 Division added to this success.

At the most recent Race Committee meeting the Division representatives gave an outline of their divisions:

**The Cavalier 28 Division** reported that they appear to be at a crossroad as their numbers for the long series have dwindled, however their short series was still well attended. They have decided that the Cavaliers will only sail every second weekend next season around their state titles and the Audi Sydney Harbour Regatta, a total of eleven races.

The Classics and Sunday reported that the new Saturday split division was working well and it will continue into the new season.

**Division 2** reported that the long series numbers were satisfactory however the short series seemed very popular with numbers increasing.

**The Super 30 Division** reported they had a very successful season with 18 regular starters each week increasing to 24 for the short series. The only changes requested for next season was to have a Sunday short windward-leeward three-race series included in the programme prior to Christmas, similar to the Audi Sydney Harbour Regatta, with these races included in the point score. The Division representative, Richard Lavers, offered a thank you to the SASC on behalf of all Super 30 boat owners for running the Super 30 series and they hope that it will continue with the Club for many years.

**The OK Dinghies** reported a disappointing season after the World Championships that were held at Belmont in February 2006. The number racing with the SASC since then has reduced to around three boats.

**Division 1** reported that racing numbers were still low but more than the previous year. They are now considering going back to scratch starts and want to increase the series from 10 to 12 races over the season.

**Division 6** reported that numbers of boats that competed was similar to the previous season. Generally the series is very popular with the competitors but all agreed it should be promoted more, particularly to the competitors in the Friday Twilight series which is also non spinnaker.

**Friday Twilight Series** continues to be well supported and the improved catering and bar service is getting good reports. This support is evidenced in the greater numbers staying on for the barbeque in the evening.

**The Paul Slocombe Series** continues to be well supported and is one of the most keenly sought after trophies at the Club.

The Winter Series had a record number of entries this season with many entries from other clubs which at sail in our summer divisions. A combined clubs non-point-score race with RSYS and RANSA has also been introduced into the middle of the series and if successful it will be included in future winter series.

**Offshore Racing** (Lion Island and Bob Brown) both races were again well supported with no changes to either race anticipated. However it was suggested that the Opening Regatta should be moved to the week prior to the Lion Island Race so competitors can compete in both races. This was agreed by the Race Committee and the next Opening Regatta will be sailed on 2 September 2006, with the Lion Island race a week later on 9 September. Saturday point-score racing will begin on 16 September 2006.

The Race Committee also discussed a number of other matters including:

- New YA marks that have been laid at the south end of Shark Island and Rose Bay. They have been laid to replace the southern Shark Island Cardinal Mark and Rose Bay East Mark as rounding marks. All courses and course rounding for next season will be reviewed to reflect these new marks and to observe an instruction from NSW Maritime that islands and navigational aids in Sydney Harbour are not to be used as race marks of any course.
- Changes to start positions were discussed and it was agreed that the Saturday Course O start position might move from SE of Kurraba Point to the western part of Athol Bight in an area in front of Little Sirius Cove between the Mosman Bay and the Zoo Wharf ferry lanes. Consideration will also be given to moving some of the other easterly course start positions to this area.
- Idle Hour Race to be moved back to the October long weekend and a review will be undertaken to moving the finish from Store Beach to a more suitable picnic spot, away from the little penguins and the beach-access restrictions.
- Kelly Cup/Tara Ipo Trophy to be combined into one race and called the Club Championship Race. The Kelly Cup will be awarded to the winner and the Tara Ipo Trophy to the runner up. A third trophy will be provided for third place. Spring and summer race series will be added to those existing series which qualify for the Championship Race.
- Audi Sydney Harbour Regatta the SASC will continue to support this series as are all other Sydney Harbour Clubs. Full Saturday and Sunday season series race entry fees will cover the regatta fee.
- The Young 88 and S80 Associations have approached SASC to run a weekend race series in the spring season probably around the first weekend in October 2006. The series will include one race on the Saturday with short windward-leeward races on the Sunday. The Super 30 Division request to have a short windward-leeward Sunday race day will be accommodated in conjunction with this series.
- **Daydream Shield** unfortunately the SASC lost the shield to the MHYC this season but there are moves afoot to win it back.
- **Race Management Software** We are currently reviewing a race management software package and, if suitable, consideration will be given to purchasing and modifying it to suit SASC requirements.
- Starting Procedures All series start sequences will be changed to accord with the Blue Book (RRS 2005–2008).

The Race Committee is confident that the 2006–2007 Season will be as good as or even better than 2005–2006 with the enthusiasm and interest shown by members and visitors racing at the SASC and the changes outlined above.

Congratulations to everyone involved for helping make the 2005–2006 season such a success — in particular all the starting crews and our race secretary Maggie Stewart.

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial report covers Sydney Amateur Sailing Club Limited and is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

#### (a) Income Tax

No charge has been made in respect of income tax as the Company relies on the exemption from income tax granted by Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. Therefore, it is not appropriate to adopt the principles of tax effect accounting.

#### (b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first in first out basis.

#### (c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows, which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to the economic entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

#### (d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. Long service leave is accrued in respect of all employees with more that 5 years' service with the Company.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

#### (e) Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred. This basis is representative of the pattern of benefits derived from the leased property.

#### (f) Receivables and Revenue Recognition

Trade debtors are recognised and revenue is taken up when the Club services have been provided to members and visitors. Sales revenue represents gross proceeds received and receivable from customers. Collectability of trade debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectable are written off. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where some doubt as to collection exists.

#### (g) Comparative figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation of the current financial year.

#### (h) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the in the statement of financial position are show inclusive if GST.

# 2. IMPACT OF FIRST TIME ADOPTION OF AUSTRALIAN EQUIVALENT TO INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS (AIFRS)
