Sydney Amateur Sailing Club COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 2003/2004

My last year as Commodore has highlighted the pride I have in our Club. It has been an interesting year. All the Board members have worked hard and I thank them for the support they have given me over the last three years.

SCECGS continues using the Mosman Boatshed and will shortly move into the larger end currently occupied by the OK dinghies. Realistically the OK operation will probably only continue for a few more years and the Club must then decide how best to use the balance of this facility. It seems a pity to employ the area just for storage but that may free up space at the main Clubhouse allowing some expansion for social activities on twilights.

As I predicted a couple of years ago, the question of insurance of the Club's assets has surfaced to be the most vexing question currently facing the Board. The cost represents a significant portion of the membership fee and it is a tribute to the Treasurer that we have remained cash positive in such times. The matter is not yet fully resolved and I believe that some innovative approach may be called for.

There is considerable work to be done at the Club in the next few years. Wharf repairs are required at both premises and a solution for pollution-free operation has to be found for the slipway. The boats are generally in reasonable order with the exception of the fast tender *Jack Millard* which is due for replacement. A sub-committee will investigate suitable vessels. At the same time the *Patrick Wittington* may well be sold as she is a little slow for our purposes. Mind you, one of my favorite memories of this year is the time when my third son and I set a windward/leeward course and started two races for the OK Dinghy Harbour Championships from the little vessel all by ourselves!

I always like to mention the volunteers that are essential to the Club functioning well. Once again I thank the Race Officials, the Division Representatives, the protest panels under the direction of David Willis and all others that have assisted the Club during the Year. Faye Buckley (about to retire), Patrick Munn, Maggie Stewart and the Boatshed staff have again contributed enormously to the Club's smooth running and Robbie White (since retired) has been a very cherished tender driver. John Jeremy has ensured that the Club Newsletter is one that we can all view with great pride. Some may forget that the Directors are volunteers and I thank them all for their time during the year. So all in all a terrific little Club with which I am proud to be associated.

I wish it and all members the best for the future.

FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

The surplus for the year was \$11,177 compared to \$13,708 last year. Depreciation charged in the accounts this year is \$73,313 compared to \$60,607 last year. The surplus and depreciation have contributed to the increase in the Club's cash reserves from \$100,798 to \$179,920.

The cash reserves should grow again this coming year by at least \$50,000 and help provide for most of the major expenditure required to upgrade the slipways to meet the latest environmental standards. An environmentally compliant slipway will be a rare item east of the bridge and a significant asset of the Club for the use of its members in future years.

Revenue increased from \$599,020 to \$640,168 this year. Shipwright sales again grew strongly from \$198,869 to \$223,510. The level of activity in the Boatshed continues to make a significant contribution to the Club's finances.

A review of the insurances arrangements has been conducted and the increased rates and insurable values applicable in the coming year will cause a further increase in the total insurances costs. It is a cost that will need close review and possible re-negotiation of the terms of the Mosman Boatshed lease to be able to contain the cost.

I would like to thank Faye Buckley for her great contribution to the smooth running of the Club for so many years. I wish her good health and happiness in her retirement. She has made mine and other Treasurers life a simpler task. Patrick Munn and Richard Lamrock have again been a great help to me during the year.

I am not standing for the position of Treasurer or as a Board member and would like to take this opportunity to thank all those members and staff who have, over many years, assisted with advice and help. It has been an honour to have been able to have made a contributed to the progress of the Club.

BOATSHED

This last year has been a year of steady progress for the boatshed at Sydney Amateurs. The boatshed has again achieved record sales, made progress with our EPA compliance, maintained the Club boats in good order, and serviced the fully occupied moorings.

Rod Phillips and Brett Hobbs, now the NSW Apprentice of the Year, have been fully occupied all year on the slips with their usual fare of clean and anti-foul jobs complimented this year more shipwright and full repaint jobs. The increasing skill and experience of these two tradesmen give SASC members one of the best facilities in Sydney.

Your board has decided to proceed towards full EPA compliance on the slipway with the current sketch plans for a concrete slab hard-stand to be to be developed up to full working drawings in the near future. A fully compliant slipway will ensure that SASC members will continue to have the facility to work on their own boats into the foreseeable future, something becoming increasingly rare around Sydney Harbour. A level hard-stand will also make it easier and safer for the members to work on their boats. The design, consent, planning and construction of our new hard-stand will take at least two years and, like the new pontoon, prove again the wisdom of our treasurer's financial policy of high depreciation of our assets combined with the maintenance of a cash surplus.

Robbie White, "Robbie on the *Nancy K*" has retired to be replaced by Michael Power, another master mariner, who I am sure will continue the great tradition of service we have had from Robbie over the last six years. Robbie, until his retirement, continued to maintained our boats in excellent condition.

Again this year Peter McCorquodale has overseen the maintenance and allocation of our moorings and has managed to very smoothly ensure that the regular maintenance program has been maintained with near 100% occupancy.

And finally my thanks to all those who have helped in the running of the boatshed this year, in particular, Rod, Robbie, Michael, Brett, Faye, Patrick and the boatshed committee.

The Amateurs THE CLUB YACHT

The 2003/2004 season has been a quiet year by previous standards, due in some part to the absence of a Division 1 racing program within the SASC calendar. It is expected that this situation will change for the up-coming season with plenty of interest being shown by potential Division 1 competitors.

A lighter racing calendar has meant that revenue from *The Amateurs* is slightly down on previous years, despite an increase in daily racing charges to \$12.50 per crew member.

One fundraising event has been held in the past season. Tony Mooney presented a very interesting and successful 'Rules' evening in September 2003. My thanks to the team of people who again put in their time and effort to make the occasion and, particularly, Fiona Fitzgerald for her marvellous contribution in the kitchen.

The Adams 10 Championships were held at Middle Harbour Yacht Club in January and saw a very strong performance by *The Amateurs*. James Bevis took the helm and sailed a very good regatta. The first three race finishes gave us a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place respectively. We certainly had their attention! Typically, the starting line became a little crowded for the remaining three races with results of 11th, OCS and 8th. This gave *The Amateurs* an overall result on scratch of fourth, the best result to date. A highly commendable and satisfying performance in an extremely competitive fleet.

The Chairman of the Adams 10 Association has approached the SASC about hosting a two-race invitational regatta for Adams 10s. It is proposed that one race be held early in the SASC spring sailing season with a second race late in the SASC summer racing season. The objective of the regatta is to offer other Adams 10s from 'up the harbour' an opportunity to become involved in one-design racing without the long sail to a MHYC start. At the end of each sailing day competitors would be invited to return to the Club for results and prize giving. The Board has endorsed the proposal in principle.

The Amateurs is being actively campaigned by an enthusiastic crew in the CYC Winter Series and SASC Winter Series. *The Amateurs* continues to maintain good relationships with and is well regarded by the other clubs on the harbour, as is increasingly evident when we visit other clubs.

Once again we thank our sponsors, Sturrock's Marine Products and MacDairmid Sails, for their continued support. Without their ongoing commitment, *The Amateurs* would not remain as competitive or hold its value as a club asset.

RACING

The SASC has had another successful season of racing and, with the exception of Division 1 all the divisions were well supported. Unfortunately, due to insufficient numbers, Division 1 failed to get on the water however we have high hopes that the division will make a comeback next season. The Middle Harbour Yacht Club has also expressed interest in joining us for a couple of races with their Adams 10 fleet next season.

The Classic Division had nine to ten starters each week from around 17 entries. After a keenly raced series the winner was *Celeste* (Rob Evans), from *Eventide* (Bill and Jim Merrington), and in third place was Bill Gale's *Ranger*.

Division 2 remains strong in both the long and the short series. The long series went to down to the wire with Peter Campbell skippering *Hornblower* to win from Hershel Smith in *Shambles*, and in third place was *Clewless?* (Guy Irwin). The short series results were reversed with *Shambles* winning, followed by *Wind Shadow* (Mark and John Brady), and *Great Expectations* (Pat O'Brien). *Hotspur* (Bill Hogan) won the Spring Series and the Summer Series went to Dominic Crosby in his Beneteau 32 *Ca Va!*.

The Cavalier 28s changed their racing pattern by holding a mini-series of three short windward-leeward races with the RSYS. The divisional representative Jonathan Rosenberg reported that this type of racing provided variety for the skippers and helped improve their racing skills. Most honours for the season went to Rod and Craig Mitchell in *Centaurus* who won the scratch and handicap point score. Second place on handicap went to *Quambi* (J. Pelly and S. Rahilly), with third place to *Joka* (Cec Williams and B. Moore). The Cavaliers' Norm Brown Series was won by *Trikerie Bay* (B. Bowden and S. Lamb), second was *Marabou* (Pam Joy) with *Shoshana* (Jonathan Rosenberg) in third place. The Cavalier State Championships were conducted again this year by the RPEYC and was won by *Centaurus*. Unfortunately two races out of the six planned were abandoned due to strong winds.

The OK Dinghies continue to roll along with the season honours going to *Panache* (David Coleman), followed by *Penguin Goes Whoosh* (Peter Wallace) and *Aquarius* (Bill Tyler).

The very popular Sunday racing enjoyed good winds and an uncluttered harbour during their series. *Quicksilver* (Rod Weir) revelled in these types of conditions to win Division 6 followed by *Wind Shadow* (Mark Brady) with third place going to *Magic Dragon* (Greg Dwyer). The Sunday Gaffers are still going strong although it has been noted that a few Bermudan-rigged boats will be filtering in — Bill Gale assures us is not a problem and we should leave the series name unchanged! Bill is obviously happy anyway because he won the series in *Ranger* with *Rob Roy* (J. B. Rousselot) second, with *Sylvia* (Philip Kinsella) in third place. As this series has now increased to eight races it has been upgraded to a medal series for the next season, and another course will be added to accommodate south-west winds.

The Paul Slocombe Trophy Series (Tuesday twilights) was again strongly contested this year and was won by *Double Happy* (David and Kitty Lowe). *Rambull* (Dal Wilson and Mick Brennan)came second with third place going to *Jellicle* (G. Pierce and M. Jansen). The Board has also approved the Racing Committee's recommendation that this series becomes a medal series now that it is six races.

Friday Twilights were again well supported with 51 entries. *Camalais III* won the draw for the series prize of a trip for two to Lord Howe Island.

Our Winter Series is still underway at the time of writing but I can report a keenly fought series with three divisions totalling over 50 boats. Unfortunately the three races completed so far have been shortened due to flukey winter winds which have tested the mettle of the skippers and their crew.

Both our offshore races, the Lion Island and the Bob Brown were big successes. A 15 to 20 knot south-easter greeted the boats at the start of the Bob Brown race resulting in a quick spinnaker run up the coast to the Basin. All boats were reported anchored or moored by 1730 with festivities commencing soon after. The only mishap was when Richard Lamrock in *Ça Va* decided to beach his boat for a while in the bay — and let everyone else catch up! *Azzuro* (Jim Lawler) won line honours with *Wind Shadow* (John Brady) in first place on handicap followed by *Paper Moon* (Denis Williams) and *Aroona* (Duncan Hill).

The Lion Island race was again well attended with all boats finishing under the 10-hour time limit. Line honours went to *Merlin II*, Caprice of Huon (David Champtaloup) the winner of Division A with Capricious (Michael Evans) taking out Division B. The RSYS has again included this race as their first offshore race for next season which should ensure good-sized fleets.

The Idle Hour was again blessed by good weather and those who competed enjoyed the festivities at. Store Beach. Peter Horn in *Mezzaluna* won from Richard Lavers in *Manhattan Transfer*.

The SASC won the Day Dream Shield for the second year running. It is MHYC's turn to conduct the series in 2004 and they are very keen to regain the trophy.

The Kelly Cup was won this year by *Clewless?* (Guy Irwin). Second was *Shambles* (Herschel Smith), and third was *Centaurus* (Rod and Craig Mitchell). Michael Morris and David Dale in *Wait for What* won the Tara Ipo Trophy followed closely by Bill Hogan in *Hotspur* and Fred Bevis in *Brigadoon*. The Racing Committee to make the Kelly Cup and Taro Ipo Cup races next year a gala day with festivities and eats to finish the last day of the summer season. It has also been decided to reintroduced an Opening Day race to start next season's sailing programme. The race will be conducted in the Harbour in conjunction with the Lion Island Race. There will be one division only with a handicap start. The race will be open to all boats not competing in the Lion Island race and entry fees will be waived for boats entered in any SASC race series.

Other aquatic events held at the club during the year included Gaffers' Day, the Ranger World Championships and the Putt Putt Day .

Finally I would like to express my sincere thanks to all the starters and their helpers, to our Racing Secretary Maggie Stewart, to all the divisional representatives and last but not least to all the competitors who make racing at the Amateurs — "Only The Best"

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated

Income Tax

No charge has been made in respect of income tax as the Company relies on the exemption from income tax granted by Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. Therefore, it is not appropriate to adopt the principles of tax effect accounting.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost or at fair value less any accumulated depreciation.

The carrying amounts of property, plant and equipment stated as valued at cost is reviewed annually by directors to ensure they are not in excess of the recoverable amounts from these assets. The recoverable amounts are assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present value in determining recoverable amounts.

The carrying amounts of property, plant and equipment stated as valued at fair value is reviewed annually by directors to ensure that they represent the amounts for which the assets could be exchanged between knowledgeable and willing parties in arm's length transactions.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is depreciated on a straight-line basis over their useful lives to the Company commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in at call deposits with banks or financial institutions.

Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the Company's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Long service leave is accrued in respect of all employees with more than 5 years' service with the Company.

The provision for employee entitlements has been measured at their nominal amount and is allocated between current and non-current liabilities, the current liability being the amount that is due to be paid in the ensuing twelve months. Because the Company has relatively few employees, the adoption of this basis is believed to produce a result which is not materially different from the present value method prescribed by AASB 1028: Accounting for Employee Entitlements.

Contributions are made by the Company to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred. This basis is representative of the pattern of benefits derived from the leased property.

Receivables and Revenue Recognition

Trade debtors are recognised and revenue is taken up when the Club services have been provided to members and visitors. Sales revenue represents gross proceeds received and receivable from customers. Collectability of trade debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectable are written off. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where some doubt as to collection exists.

Comparative figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation of the current financial year.

Other Income - MASC Merger

MASC members were given discounted membership terms for five years to 31 May 2005 to compensate for the value of assets acquired in the merger namely *Patrick Whittington* and the MASC Boatshed. This unearned income is included in the statement of financial position as deferred consideration and amortised over five years in the accounts as "other income".
