

Eighty-Fourth Annual Report and Balance Sheet

To be presented to Members at the Annual General Meeting
to be held at History House, 8 Young Street, Circular Quay,
on Thursday, 23rd August, 1956.

The Committee has pleasure in presenting its Report and Balance Sheet for the year ended 31st July, 1956.

RACING

The Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron opened the 1955/56 season with a Regatta on 10th September, when the Club's fleet was invited to race in conjunction with the fleet of the Middle Harbour Yacht Club.

Invitations to take part in racing on other occasions during the season were also extended to the Sydney Amateurs by the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron, Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club, Royal Prince Edward Yacht Club, Royal Naval Sailing Association, Lake Macquarie Yacht Club, Middle Harbour Yacht Club, and the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia. The Anniversary Regatta and Pittwater Regatta Committees also invited the Club to compete in races. The Committee desires to record its appreciation of the courtesies extended to our racing members by the Clubs and Regattas referred to.

The Club's biggest race day of the season, the Annual Flag Day Regatta, was held on 12th November, when thirteen races were started from Kurraba Point comprising all the divisions racing with the Royal Clubs, the three divisions of the Sydney Amateur fleet, and the R.N.S.A. Service Whalers and Island Class Dinghies. A very good day's racing was enjoyed by the competitors and the spectators. Next season it is anticipated that the Middle Harbour Yacht Club will join in the Flag Day Regatta on Sydney Harbour, thus providing racing for all the Sydney Yacht Clubs affiliated with the Yachting Association under the burgee of the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club. The race officials for the day were Messrs. F. F. Buchanan, W. S. Chambers, and N. M. Goddard, in addition to the Club's regular starter, Mr. W. J. Millard. The Club is very much indebted to these gentlemen for the work carried out during a busy afternoon.

Mr. W. J. Millard, the Club's regular starter, rendered yeoman service in this capacity during the past season. In addition to starting and finishing the races, the starter also has the long job of getting the race results to the press by telephone, and a considerable amount of time has to be devoted to conveying the details in the hope that the Sunday papers will find space for the results.

The competitions were closely contested and the Committee desires to congratulate the winners for consistent sailing in their respective divisions. Details regarding racing are given later in the Report.

SOCIAL

The Club's social activities comprise Flag Day and Closing Day on the Harbour, and those meeting nights when it is possible to arrange for the ladies to attend, and last but not least the Annual Ball. Both Flag Day and Closing Day were noted for good weather and good sailing breezes in a season that was generally wet, and members and their friends had an enjoyable afternoon aboard the motor vessel "La Radar" on each occasion. The novelty events conducted at the Rendezvous on Closing Day are a feature of the sailing season that is much enjoyed by the younger visitors.

Ladies' Nights were held at the October and December meetings. At the October meeting the Honorary Treasurer screened some interesting films, including "City Sailors," and at the December meeting Mr. Neil Munro, of the New Zealand Government Tourist Bureau, screened selected films of scenery and sport in New Zealand. These evenings proved most popular.

The Club is also indebted to Mr. R. V. Gale for his talk on rounding marks; to Mr. A. V. Likely for his screening of colour slides illustrating his trip overseas; Mr. Russell Slade and Dr. Alan Campbell, for a talk and slides on the last Hobart race; and at the April meeting, Professor A. V. Stephens for his interesting and instructive address on the aerodynamics of sailing. It is regretted that Professor Stephens, who has been a keen racing member during the past season, will not be racing with the Club next year as he has accepted an appointment at the Belfast University.

The Annual Ball and Presentation of Prizes took place at the "New Commodore" for the third year in succession, on Friday, 22nd June. As before, the arrangements were largely in the hands of Mr. Grant Crichton and Mrs. Crichton, to whom members are indebted for a most successful evening.

FINANCIAL

The Honorary Treasurer's Balance Sheet and Financial Statement show a small deficit for the year just ended. This would have been greater but for the surplus of receipts over expenditure in respect of the Ball, and the donations by members during the season, a list of which is published elsewhere in the Report. The Committee desires to express its appreciation of the generous donations which have enabled the Club to continue its activities.

During the year the members approved of an alteration to the rule providing for the title of Life Member for those members who are not liable for any further subscription, having been members of the Club for at least thirty-five years.

OBITUARY

It is with sincere regret that the Committee records the death during the past year of Messrs. W. E. Arnott, Dr. H. S. Kirkland, J. D. MacLurcan, and Dr. Kevin Byrne.

Mr. Arnott, who joined the Club in 1923, was an active sailing man of earlier days. Dr. Kirkland, who joined in 1925, remained an active yachtsman to the last, being taken ill at the tiller of his yacht "Tehane" during last racing season. He was a Committee man of the Sydney Amateurs for some years, and raced the Prince Class yacht "Riawena" (now "Waiheke") with the Sydney Amateurs many years ago. J. D. MacLurcan, who joined the Club in 1945, raced the "Hoana" with the Sydney Amateurs in the years following the war. Dr. Byrne, who joined the Club in 1937, owned the Prince Class yacht "Prince Alfred" before the war.

The Committee desires to express its sympathy with the relatives of the deceased members.

GENERAL

At the last Annual General Meeting the members approved of an alteration to the Racing Regulations, removing the restriction on the height of extra halliard sheaves in bermudian rigged yachts. This brings the Sydney Amateurs into line with the other yacht Clubs in Sydney which allow masthead extras except in Class races, such as the Dragons and the Restricted Division.

The Sydney Amateurs have not been yachtsmen to stay within the confines of Port Jackson more than is necessary, and many coastal cruises have been undertaken by yachts on the register of the Club. In these busy days few however can find the time for extended cruising.

Long cruises in the past have been those of the "Stormy Petrel" (a name continued on the Club register by Stanley Spain) to Torres Strait many years ago, and during the nineteen-thirties the voyages of Bill and George Clark in the "Maluka" and later the "Mathana," Lord Howe Island, Hobart, and the Barrier Reef being visited.

Peter Fletcher has now joined these ranks by first of all building his own dream ship at his home in Bondi, and then sailing it to Auckland. After taking part in several short ocean races in New Zealand he competed in the long race to Suva, striking very hard weather on the way. His letters to the Club describing his experiences have been most entertaining.

From Suva he intends to sail to the New Hebrides, New Caledonia, the Barrier Reef, and thence back to Sydney by the end of the year.

A feature among the trophies at the Annual Ball was a polished and mounted turtle shell which Peter Fletcher won in the Auckland-Suva ocean race. He has donated it as a perpetual Inter-Club trophy for races between the Sydney Amateurs and the Middle Harbour Yacht Club.

COMMODORE'S REPORT

In putting my signature to this report on behalf of the Committee, I must pay tribute to the work of our Honorary Secretary, Mr. L. P. Jones. He has carried out his duties for ten years in a most capable manner. Members are indebted to Les for the many hours he has spent on Club affairs during this period.

Reports such as the above, correspondence, and general Club business have been handled with judgment and efficiency, and it has been a pleasure to have been associated with him during my term of office. His first job with the Amateurs was Starter and Judge in 1936, and later as Assistant Secretary, and he has taken an active part in Club affairs since then. He has had the assistance of Mrs. Jones in typing Club correspondence.

The Club will lose a capable Secretary with the retirement of Les Jones from this position, and the Committee will ask members at the Annual Meeting to vote Honorary Life Membership to him in recognition of his untiring effort on behalf of the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club.

I would also like to place on record my appreciation of the co-operation and assistance rendered by the other Flag Officers, Honorary Officials, and Committee throughout the year. This applies particularly in the case of Mr. A. W. (Tony) Furse, who is retiring from the position of Vice-Commodore this year, after having been a Flag Officer for several seasons.
