Eighty-seventh Annual Report and Balance Sheet

The Committee has pleasure in presenting its Report and Balance Sheet for the year ended 31st July, 1959.

COMMITTEE MEETINGS

During the year the Committee met on twelve occasions and a summary of attendances is annexed to this Report.

At the first Committee meeting in the new year the following Sub-Committees were formed:—

Administration:

Commodore A. W. Furse; Hon. Secretary B. Cameron; Hon. Treasurer W. Oxby; E. J. Merrington.

Racing:

Vice Commodore G. Crichton; Hon. Assistant Secretary G. Brackenbury; Rear Commodore H. Begg; W. S. Chambers; H. E. Pfeiffer; C. Mecham.

Social:

W. MacRae; F. P. Fletcher; D. M. Helliwell.

The Administration Sub-Committee met on one occasion to discuss the acquisition of Club Premises and a recommendation that this was desirable for the development of the Club and that a "Club Facilities Appropriation Fund" be created was subsequently adopted by General Committee.

Another objective of the Administration Sub-Committee, the revision of the Club Rules has not yet reached fruition.

The Racing Sub-Committee met frequently during the year and functioned well.

RACING

Vice Commodore Grant Crichton; Rear Commodore H. M. Begg; Hon. Assist. Secretary G. Brackenbury; W. S. Chambers; C. Mecham; H. E. Pfeiffer.

Yachts were divided into four divisions for the season which commenced with an invitation to the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron's Opening Day Regatta, at which S.A.S.C. yachts raced in conjunction with the fleet of the Middle Harbour Yacht Club.

During the season other yacht clubs and regatta committees invited us to take part in their racing programmes, and we desire to express our appreciation for their courtesy. These clubs and committees were, Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron, Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club, Royal Prince Edward Yacht Club, Royal Naval Sailing Association, Middle Harbour Yacht Club, Cruising Yacht Club of Australia, Lake Macquarie Yacht Club, The Anniversary Regatta Committee and Pittwater Regatta Committee.

On November 1st, the club held its Annual Flag Day Regatta at which the Racing fleets of all yacht clubs affiliated with the Yachting Association of New South Wales participated. Races were conducted for fourteen Divisions and Classes including our combined races with the Middle Harbour Yacht Club for the Daydream Shield.

Our ocean race to Long Reef and return for the Merrington Trophy was held on November 15th, while in the harbour, yachts not participating in the ocean race competed for the Flag Officers Trophy and a "Bluebird" Division point score race.

The second of the two series of races for the Daydream Shield was held at the Middle Harbour Regatta and crews and friends were afterwards entertained by members of the Middle Harbour Yacht Club at their clubhouse. Once again the Shield is retained by the Middle Harbour Yacht Club.

The Club's Rendezvous at Store Beach on February 21st was as usual very popular and greatly enjoyed by all.

This year The Ladies' Day race was held on a Sunday and was started and finished in Taylor Bay, giving our families an opportunity to meet.

The Kelly Cup Race, for the leading five yachts in each Division's point score competition was as usual very keenly contested.

At Easter, the "Bob" Brown Trophy race to Broken Bay was held in very light conditions but was nevertheless enjoyed by all who took part.

On April 11th, the Season ended with a southerly gale which, however, did not prevent crews and friends from having a pleasant afternoon aboard the ferry "Kubu" moored off Point Piper after the race.

The committee once again wishes to thank Mr. Jack Millard, our Honorary Starter, for his work during the Season. Mr. Millard's interest in this work adds greatly to the enjoyment of our racing and all racing members have much to thank him for.

SOCIAL

The first function of this year was the Annual Ball and prize-giving held on the 4th July, 1958. On this occasion a change of venue was made, and a very convivial gathering was held at the Hotel Wentworth Ballroom when some 250 members and friends gathered to enjoy a very pleasant evening.

Flag Day and Closing Day were again the two main social functions held on the Harbour. Both of these proved most successful and gave members and their friends the opportunity to meet one another. Unfortunately the weather on Closing Day was very adverse, and was responsible for preventing a lot of yachts reaching the starting line, and also kept a lot of people at home. Nevertheless almost 300 members and friends enjoyed the comfort of the larger ferry on this occasion. A higher loss was made this year than the previous Closing Day but it is felt that this expense is warranted on such a day as it is recognised as one of the highlights of the season by the yachting fraternity. The wet weather certainly did not dampen the enthusiasm and spirits of the competitors in the various events at the Rendezvous.

Our thanks to the Middle Harbour Yacht Club for an excellent day's racing at their combined meeting, and for their excellent hospitality at their Clubhouse for afternoon tea and the barbecue at night.

The informal gathering at the Basin after the "Bob" Brown Trophy Race was held again at Easter, but, here again, this was upset by a sudden storm, and members had to leave hurriedly to look after their yachts.

The Rendezvous at Quarantine Bay was another well attended and successful outing for the members and their crews. We would like to see more of the regular boats racing attend this week-end as it gives members the opportunity to get to know one another in an informal manner.

Appreciation must go to the Cruising Yacht Club, for making their premises available for the Christmas and Close of the Season Cocktail Parties. Both of these functions were most successful, and well attended. Over 200 members and friends were present at the Christmas Party. A special vote of thanks must go to the ladies who provided such beautiful food on each occasion.

The monthly meetings held at History House were well attended and your Committee would like to place on record their appreciation of those persons who provided entertainment by talks and motion pictures. It is felt that some thought should be given to the charge made at these meetings as the catering cost for supper in many instances is not recouped.

It should be noted that all social functions, except Flag Day and Closing Day, resulted in a profit to the Club. In the absence of a Club House, it is felt that these expenses are essential, as it is necessary to reciprocate to other clubs for hospitality extended to our officials and members, and that this should be on a scale befitting the prestige of this club.

A meeting of Boat-owners and Skippers was held on June 8th, at Tattersall's Club, Sydney. This meeting was well attended and after a discussion on the next season's racing, members adjourned to supper. A pleasant evening was enjoyed by all.

OBITUARY

During the past year the death occurred of a number of highly esteemed members of the club and the sympathy of all members is extended to their relatives.

The late Walter Rayment died in April of this year and at the time of his death was an Honorary Life Member of the Club. He

joined the Club in 1907, and was at one time Club Captain. He had the remarkable record of continuous service as Flag Officer or Committeeman from 1909 to 1953.

The late A. M. Merrington joined the Club in 1928 and was at one time Vice Commodore.

The late L. Robertson joined the Club in 1921 and was a Life Member at the time of his death.

The tragic passing of Mrs. E. J. Merrington has also to be recorded with deep regret. The late Mary Merrington was very active in Club affairs and her sudden death is a great loss to the Club.
