### ADMINISTRATION

The site should be kept in mind by Committee however as it would be acceptable and quite workable if the whole, not half, could be procured.

A recommendation was made to Committee which resulted in £500 being placed on a fixed deposit with the Rural Bank.

## RACING

The season opened with the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron Regatta on the 17th September when the Club fleet was invited to race in conjunction with the fleet from the Middle Harbour Yacht Club. Invitations were received from the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron, Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club, Royal Prince Edward Yacht Club, Royal Naval Sailing Association and Middle Harbour Yacht Club for our fleet to compete in their Regattas and Flag Days.

Some of our yachts also competed in the Anniversary Regatta, the Pittwater Regatta and the Woolahra Centenary Regatta.

The Committee wishes to record its appreciation of the courtesies which were extended to our yachts and racing members by the various Clubs and Regatta Committees.

As usual the highlight of the Club's racing season was our own Annual Flag Day which was held on October 29th and on which occasion 13 races were contested. The following fleets took part.

Excellent racing was enjoyed by spectators and competitors alike.

The yachts which started from Kurraba Point comprised all the Sydney Yacht Clubs affiliated with the Yachting Association of N.S.W. and thanks are due to the race officials who ensured the success of the Regatta. These officials were: W. J. Millard, W. S. Chambers, J. Shaw, L. T. Burgess, G. W. Sweeney. We would also like to thank our own club starter, Mr. W. J. Millard for the excellent service which he has provided throughout the Club's racing season. Mr Millard spends a considerable amount of his time in capably carrying out his official duties as starter and judge as well as ensuring that the results are published in the Sydney press. Thanks are also due to our racing Secretary, Mr. John Jackson, who has organised a most successful season and when it is realised that our programme each week has listed approximately 58 yachts, it is felt that our members will be aware of the task which these honorary officials undertake and carry out so capably.

This year we have also introduced Winter racing. An average entry has been approximately 10 or 11 yachts and the races have been keenly contested. During the current year the new racing rules have been in force and it is felt that the success of these rules is reflected in the low number of protests which your committee has had to settle. There have only been two protests and both were due to a misunderstanding of the new racing rules.

Ocean racing has been restricted because of the introduction of new regulations, but it is hoped that the problems will be overcome and ocean racing will be included in the programme again next year. The Junior Off Shore Club also joined our Club in races on three occasions.

The exceptionally large amount of donations that provided a favourable Balance Sheet for the '59-'60 Season is not in evidence in the '60-'61 Season, thus the Balance Sheet is not as buoyant. The contributing factors to this state of affairs are:—

- (a) Less donations
- (b) Increase in running costs
- (c) Less profit from social events

The Committee, being fully aware of these facts, resolved to (a) Increase the Racing Fees to £7/10/0 for all events, including Anniversary Day Regatta. (b) Run social functions at a profit, without increasing costs, but by obtaining greater membership support.

Your Committee desires to show appreciation to those affiliated Clubs who have unstintingly entertained and allowed our officials and members the use of the Clubhouses and facilities over the past season. Major steps taken during the season will be consolidated in the season to come and your Committee believes that the period, though calm, has been one of progress.

The Monthly General Meetings this season have shown a marked improvement in average attendances, due mainly to the very large attendances at "The Hobart Yacht Race" narrated by E. J. Merrington and "The Presentation of Prizes". However, your Committee takes heart from these improved figures and thanks you, one and all, for the assistance and interest shown in affairs of the Club and hopes that more members will attend next season's functions.
