## FINANCE — ADMINISTRATION

The Finance and Administration Committee has pleasure in reporting that the Club has enjoyed a successful season financially, mainly due to the functions organised in our Clubhouse Premises.

A fully dissected system of Budgetary Control has been in operation during the season and a close watch kept on all activities.

Certificates have been issued to all Registered Term Note Holders and claims for interest met.

Close contact has been maintained with the various Local Government Departments in whom is vested control of the site we occupy.

## RACING

This season has seen greater racing activity than before, due to the interest stimulated by the new Clubhouse.

As well as conducting races every Saturday for the three divisions and the Blue Bird Fleet, we have had several extra races finishing at the Clubhouse.

Another innovation was a race from our usual starting line round Lion Island in Broken Bay and return to finish in Taylors Bay. This race was for a trophy donated by the Junior Offshore Group. Six starters completed the course, all equipped with safety rails and safety equipment. The J.O.G. yachts competed on the same course on this day, as they have on several other occasions.

The most improved division this season was No. 1, which has the best fleet ever. All of the fourteen yachts are well matched, many have fitted masthead extras, and the competition has been keen, with some very close finishes.

In all divisions the season's point score has been closely contested and none were decided until the last point score race.

The final results being:

Blue Bird Division "SAN-JOJA", B. Bailey (Gold Medal). Blue Bird Division "ZEEHAN", L. Wildman (Scratch Point Score).

1st Division "WATHARA", B. Cameron (Gold Medal). 2nd Division "ONDINE", N. Cassim (Gold Medal). 3rd Division "JOALAH", G. Jackson (Gold Medal).

The Kelly Cup, which was competed for by all divisions, was won by "QUESTING", G. Crichton, and the Oxby Trophy by "WENDY", R. M. Tyson.

The sailing committee has met frequently and put considerable effort into their task. Particular praise must be given to John Jackson for the time spent and the work he has put into producing the racing programs. There is no doubt that racing is the major club activity and the standard of our programs is such that the members may be justly proud.

During the year the members conferred honorary membership on Jack Millard as a mark of appreciation for his work as starter and judge. The members are much indebted to these officials who keep the club functioning smoothly with their honorary efforts.

Club Flag Day was again a huge success when yachts from R.S.Y.S., R.P.A.Y.C., R.P.E.Y.C., R.N.S.A., C.Y.C. and M.H.Y.C. competed in our regatta.

We are indebted to these clubs for their co-operation on this day and the invitation races they hold throughout the season for our yachts. Also for the assistance and the goodwill their officials have always shown our club.

The season concluded with Closing Day, finishing at the Clubhouse at Cremorne Point. This break with tradition proved a great success. Novelty races were held and refreshments were available for crews and visitors at the Clubhouse.

Short winter races were conducted throughout the winter months.

Your sailing committee consider this one of the most successful seasons the Club has ever had and are sure that the Club will progress in the future years.

#### **BOATSHED**

A rather sorry sight greeted the members of the committee when they held their first meeting at the boatshed on 2nd August last year.

The shed itself had an alarming lean; doors would not close and it was filled with the strangest collection of junk.

The slipway was far from serviceable; the landing ramp had sunk and was in a dangerous condition.

The so-called equipment and tools were either absent or in disrepair. Moorings, on examination, were virtually non-existent, some had sunk, others consisted of a marker held in position with a small concrete block.

To cap this rather bleak outlook we were advised by the Finance Administration Committee that funds were severely limited.

Keeping in mind our responsibility to the members in ensuring that the acquisition of the boatshed did not become a financial burden and in fact became a source of income, we issued a circular during August setting out our objects and requesting shed facility bookings.

With the assistance of voluntary labour and under the active leadership of Eric Upward and David Rayment, we proceeded to knock things into working order.

It would be impossible to list in the space available the names of the members who have given such valuable assistance both in labour and materials during the year. Gentlemen, the committee joins me in thanking you for making our work so much easier.

Beset by various trials and tribulations, the facilities have steadily improved.

The employment of a skilled part-time boatshed hand since late January has been most successful.

We now have twenty-one serviceable moorings, of which nineteen are occupied and are shedding twenty-seven dinghies and small boats.

The buildings and ramps, if not in perfect order, are at least tidy and reasonably functional.

The slipway and cradle, which has never been entirely satisfactory, is at present undergoing extensive repairs and renovations.

A plan of proposed alterations to the boatshed which envisages demolishing the present large shed and replacing it with a new structure is at present being investigated by a select committee.

The boatshed is supplying members with shedding and moorings at reasonable cost and at the same time laying the foundations of a new era in the history of the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club.

## CLUBHOUSE — SOCIAL

On behalf of the Clubhouse and Social Committee I am happy to report that the advent of the new Clubhouse has created for the 1962-1963 season a transformation in club spirit and social enjoyment, culminating in the Club's most successful season "social calendar" for many years. From drab beginnings and lack of facilities, the Clubhouse is developing into one where our members can relax in an atmosphere suitable for yachtsmen with all the facilities needed for their catering needs.

This year has been notable for a number of socially and financially successful functions, made possible only by the eager support of the members and the Ladies' Auxiliary. My committee's heartfelt gratitude is extended to the newly-formed Ladies' Auxiliary, who have catered with taste for all our functions and provided the Clubhouse with a good deal of its catering

facilities from their funds.

The year commenced with a Games Night held on the 23rd September, 1962, which was well attended and succeeded in gaining valuable funds for the committee, which put them to good use in providing for the next function which was possibly one of the best of the year. This was the Clubhouse Opening and Flag Day Cocktail Party on the 26th October, which was attended by approximately 200 people, who included a large number of visitors from other clubs.

Members will have many pleasant memories of various functions held during the year, including a Wine Tasting Night and Christmas Dance Social and a particularly enjoyable evening for presentation of prizes, which was a "packed house" affair. The suitability of our site for social occasions combined with sailing activity was well demonstrated on the Nominated Skippers Day, Closing Day and Flag Officers Day, and on various days where boats tied up and had picnics on the lawn.

The Closing Day this year is worthy of mention as being one of the most memorable for many years. Blessed with fine sailing weather, a record number of boats attended and enjoyed good company and entertainment,

as well as Tony Wheeler's ever present sausages.

It is noteworthy that this year our Club was able to entertain the Yachting Association of N.S.W. delegates at the Clubhouse for the first time and drew favourable comments for its arrangements for the meeting. Members all agree that monthly meetings are increasingly well attended and particularly those nights of the Americas Cup film and of Peter Mounsey's world trip.

All this progress could not have been made possible without the community and individual efforts of a number of people. There have been donations, painting, plumbing, carpentry and a host of odd jobs performed by many people, but I would like to make mention of David Rayment for his donation of a binnacle, Bill Gale for his photographs, Margaret Warren for her screen, Terry Bockenham for his plumbing work, Jack Rogers and all those who turned up continually to paint, Peter Cane, Bob Howe, J. S. Gallant for flags and signs.

I must express my personal thanks to the Commodore, who was an invaluable guide and worker in assisting my committee. A great deal of our

success is due to his continuing assistance.

It cannot be said that there is no room for further improvement. There are plans afoot for an improved locker system, for further decoration, furnishing, increased facility for more extensive weekend use by members and

for possible lettings for private functions.

In retrospect, this year's success has justified in itself the Clubhouse's acquisition. It has welded members together with mounting club spirit and its social activity and increased our familiarity, comradeship, friendliness with each other. The Club is on a stepping stone to higher achievement next year when facilities will be increased and the Clubhouse furnished. This year of achievement can only be the beginning.

## LADIES' AUXILIARY

The Ladies' Auxiliary was formed on 12th September, 1962.

To raise funds it was decided to hold a Games Night, which raised a clear ninety pounds for general funds.

The Ladies' Auxiliary undertook to cater for all future functions at a price per head to be agreed upon by both committees, the monies so raised to be used for equipment and decoration of the Clubhouse. M. Warren donated thirty pounds and N. Nossiter ten pounds.

We regretfully record the passing of three (3) of our members. Honorary Life Member R. H. C. Down, Life Member L. C. Waterman, Ordinary Member A. C. Barber.

We extend our sincere sympathies to the friends and families of these respected and familiar figures. Suitable letters of condolence and, where possible, floral tributes, have been forwarded on your behalf.

The late R. H. C. Down was best known as Commodore, which position he held for twenty (20) years (1914-1934). The late L. C. Waterman, who joined the Club in 1906, held the Club's second longest membership at the time of his death. The late A. C. Barber, a Captain in his own right, was a well known Marine Surveyor.

## FINANCIAL

The audited balance sheet reproduced elsewhere has been modified to embrace the activities of the new Clubhouse and Boatshed.

Special emphasis has been placed on the underwriting of the redemption fund and ample depreciation has been allowed for the Boatshed, Plant and Moorings; so that renewal of the Boatshed itself will keep the final value of the "Assets" in reasonable proportions.

Considerable expenditure has been involved in bringing the Clubhouse premises into decent working order, nevertheless a profit was shown on the year's activities.

Available monies are only moderate and will be needed to cover general expenses for the year. Any rebuilding therefore will have to be balanced by fund raising activities, as in the past season.

## APPRECIATION

To those affiliated clubs who have allowed our officials and members the use of their clubhouses and facilities, we desire to show our appreciation and we also appreciate being able to reciprocate.

The Directors desire to place on record their very sincere thanks to the numerous members who have assisted in so many ways and request that you provide the same solid support and assistance to the incoming Directors.

The attendances at Monthly General Meetings, held in the Clubhouse, this season have been double and in two instances triple the attendances at History House last season. This clearly shows the members' appreciation and with additional facilities and more amenities in the coming season these figures should rise again.
