FINANCE — ADMINISTRATION

Throughout the year this Committee has generally continued its expense and budgetary control procedure and a close watch kept on all matters of finance.

Approvals have been secured from the appropriate authorities for the reconstruction of the boatshed and a successful approach has been made to the Club's bankers for overdraft accommodation should it be required to finance this venture.

The appointment of a paid part-time assistant to our Secretary has also been investigated.

RACING

The Club has just concluded what is probably one of its most successful seasons as far as racing is concerned.

At the conclusion of the season our Saturday's points score program was catering for 65 racing yachts, 48 of which were consistent starters throughout the year.

Races were conducted on 36 different days during the summer season, and when it is considered that on most occasions 4 divisions were catered for, the total number of races is quite considerable.

The first division enjoyed keen competitive sport with 13 consistent starters throughout the season, all being well matched and only small margins separating most finishes.

Our second division with 23 yachts on the program but only about 14 consistent starters, although not less keen, showed more variable finishing times. This may require some adjustment next season as there is considerable difference of handicap in these yachts due to a greater variety of design and type.

The third division with 12 yachts on the program and 8 or less regular starters sometimes suffered on this account and could be a little stronger.

The Sailing Committee has been giving thought to a re-classification of second and third divisions and the possibility of forming another division to obtain better handicapping.

Separate races will be provided for Thunderbirds.

The Bluebird division was approximately as the previous year, with 16 entries and 13 regular starters. However it is hoped that this may be stronger next year.

The winds throughout this year were most consistent and only one race had to be postponed through lack of breeze, namely the "Kelly Cup" which, when re-sailed, was very skilfully won by Brian Kirkwood with his Bluebird "Lewana".

We wish to place on record Club Members' appreciation of the associated Clubs and their Officers who have contributed to the success of the season by providing the various invitation races throughout the year.

Also to our honorary starter and judge, Jack Millard, and his assistant with the starter's boat, A. Greenhalg, for their never-failing efficiency in ushering so many of us across starting and finishing lines on so many occasions.

Firstly, I wish to thank the members of my Committee for their support and assistance.

The Committee was enthusiastic and dedicated to making the boatshed both a service to members and a means of supporting the Club's finances. I believe that both these objectives have been achieved, as expenditure has been kept to a minimum.

Plans for the new boatshed have been finalised and the re-building can be proceeded with as soon as finance is made available.

Although I do not wish to single out individual members of the Committee, I feel I would be remiss if I did not mention the sterling work Bill Gale has done controlling the moorings. Some members may not be aware that moorings require consistent attention and supervision to ensure that they are not lost or become unserviceable.

During the year there have been cases of damage to moorings by members but these have been repaired and all our moorings are in first-class condition. We now have 27 moorings all occupied and intend placing a further 3 moorings within the next few weeks.

The slipway is still under the able control of Eric Upward. The cradle has been re-built, the rails and winch will be modified when funds are available.

I am very proud to report that we have not altered our rates and that there is every indication that the present rates carried forward to the 1964/65 and 1965/66 Budgets will continue to provide the Club with a source of income.

During the latter part of this year we altered the methods of charges for boatshed services. This was done to ensure that the charges for the facilities provided is equally and equitably divided amongst the members using the facilities. For instance, it would be farcical for a member to pay 12/6d. for a mooring and not be debited with dinghy storage. In reverse, it would be bad business practice for a member to pay 5/-d. for dinghy storage and moor his boat on a mooring not owned by the Club, and in either case have the use of the other facilities provided.

S.A.S.C. development is such that we must continue to run our boatshed on business lines so that it will never become a drag on the general funds.

An interesting point that was very evident this year is the drying up of voluntary labour and I recommend to the incoming Committee that they base their proposed improvements and maintenance on the use of paid labour and materials.

I would like to take this opportunity of documenting how much I regret that due to health reasons I will not be able to carry on such an active position in the Club and wish the incoming Boatshed Committee and Flag Officers every success.
