COMMODORE'S REPORT

It was my pleasure to have been the Commodore of the S.A.S.C. during the past year. I was fortunate that, due to previous development, the Club was a smoothly running organisation, and I feel that, with the aid of competent and enthusiastic officers on the Committee, my task this year has been greatly simplified.

It is pleasing to note that the expansion of the Club has steadily continued as to the number of new members and boats, so that we have now a record number. We have just completed one of the most delightful sailing seasons for many years, which provided a very satisfactory racing and social year for the Club.

This year has basically been one of consolidation of past development; but, as well, we had the satisfaction of completing our own Boatshed building and its facilities, and for the first time a club office has been established with a paid assistant secretary. A new point score system has been evolved, which appears to be working satisfactorily. The insurance scheme has proved most successful, and the Club is trading on a commercial basis with its mooring and slipping facilities.

I would especially like to record my thanks to those officers and members who have assisted in performing the many duties which, with the extension of the Club, are becoming more onerous in point of responsibility and time.

I would particularly like to thank the Secretary, the Racing Secretary, Treasurer, Starter, Sub-Committeemen, Publicity Officer, and all those people who gave their time at Club functions during the year. A number of members have donated prize money and their debentures to the Club, which has proved of very great assistance, and I would like to extend my thanks to these members.

The coming year will present a number of problems that will be cast upon us merely because of our growth, e.g., starting facilities may be overtaxed, and our social functions, which are becoming more popular, may be more crowded. I am sure that the incoming Committee will find adequate ways to overcome them and to extend to the members the same enjoyment from the Club as they had this year.

FINANCE—ADMINISTRATION

The Finance Administration Committee met a number of times during the year and immediately set about its first problem, namely, controlling the Club overdraft accommodation. This was extended to the Club for the first time during its existence.

I feel that this Committee has kept its budgeting control within reasonable limits, and the completion of the Boatshed venture was effected without overtaxing the Club resources.

A new accounting system for the control of the Boatshed Accounts has been set up, and thanks are due to Mr. Brian Woods and our Treasurer for the work they have put in in this regard, as it has proved very successful. The part-time assistant to the Secretary has also proved financially successful.

I would like to extend my thanks to my colleagues on the Committee for their regular support.

RACING

In the season 1964-65 your Club has maintained the progress that has been evident in our racing fleets in the last few years.

The season concluded with 87 yachts on the weekly Saturday point score programmes.

The Thunderbird division which was established at the beginning of the year had grown to 13 competitors when the season closed. The speed of these yachts in light conditions was demonstrated in the Kelly Cup race, in which all divisions were represented, and was won by F. Wrobel's "Thunderbird."

First Division has enjoyed some of their best racing in recent years. The yachts are closely matched, and on many occasions the majority of the entire fleet finished within minutes. There were at the end of the season 21 entries in this division.

Second Division is our largest, with 23 entrants, but not, on average, as many consistent starters as First Division.

The Third Division, with 13 entrants, on some Saturdays only started six yachts.

The Sailing Committee, when considering the trophy order values for next year, will probably relate this to the number of starters or entrants in each division. In this way, relating value of the distribution to yachts instead of divisions.

A new method of scoring points based on a modified ladder system was adopted, replacing the old system, which had been in operation for about 30 years. The new system has proved satisfactory. It favours the consistent starter, and variable points are gained by all competitors, whereas by the old system, after the first six boats, all other points were the same.

F. Wrobel very ably carried out the Secretarial work. J. Millard again with his assistants filled the position of Starter and Judge, and the members are very grateful to these people for their continued support.

We would also like to record our appreciation of the hospitality of the R.S.Y.S., R.P.A.Y.C., R.P.E.Y.C., R.N.S.A., C.Y.C. and M.H.Y.C. for the invitation races they have held for our yachts, and the co-operation and assistance shown by their officials throughout the season.

BOATSHED

The season was begun with the erection and completion of the new boatshed, preliminary design and plans for which were organised by the previous Committee. The job was erected and completed in good time by the builder, Mr. E. F. A. Montgomery, who provided us with an excellent building ready for the opening of the sailing season.

The cost of this work required the Committee to adopt a policy of consolidation throughout the season, but where it was necessary for the proper functioning of the boatshed and its activities, it was equipped and fitted out in various ways. Drawings were prepared, a contract let, and the pontoon and ramp erected. Thirty tubular steel dinghy racks were installed by a scheme of donation by members of material cost and erection by voluntary labour. Provision has been made for a further fifteen racks, which will be installed as soon as the necessity arises. Under a similar arrangement, twelve lockers have been installed and space allocated for more as demand requires. An office has been constructed in the north-east corner and fully equipped for all secretarial work. Currently under construction within the shed is a toilet providing shower and changing space.

In respect of the activities of the Boatshed Committee, the season has been a good one. Apart from our building operations, the number of moorings maintained by the Club and the number of boats registered on our moorings has risen from 23 to 30. It is, of course, hoped that this number can be increased in forthcoming seasons, to approach the shed capacity of 45 to 50 boats.

Our moorings are the main source of revenue for the boatshed, and an important factor in the overall financing of the Club. Income from the moorings has shown a trading profit for the year, and also helped to carry the burden of servicing capital borrowing for both the new boatshed and clubhouse.

Maintenance of the moorings has been a continual and demanding task for Norm. Beadle throughout the year. At the beginning of the season they were all raised, checked, and put in first-class order. It is intended that they will continue to be annually checked at the beginning of every season and maintained in constant good repair. During the year, experiments have been made with floatation chambers on some of the deeper moorings. When a satisfactory system is developed, steps will be taken to equip those moorings requiring them with suitable buoyancy.

The slipway has been in continual use throughout the season, and has coped admirably with the demand on it. However, there is scope for a slipping service superior to that offered by the present structure. Although the cost is a barrier to an immediate solution to this problem, it will be recommended to the incoming Committee that investigations be made, directed at installing a second slip of larger capacity, capable of handling the biggest of yachts in our fleet.

Without the assistance of the Shed Captain, George Brackenbury, and other stalwart members of the Committee, the year's programme could not have been achieved, and my appreciation and gratitude goes to them for their unfailing assistance.

Over this period your Committee has introduced professional caterers, and at little additional cost to members we have been able to lift much of this heavy burden from the Ladies' Auxiliary. However, the co-operation of the ladies on Flag Day and in providing over 150 lunches for the Northcott children's outing contributed largely towards the obvious success of these days.

We are very grateful to Mrs. Minier and Mrs. Vidler (Stella), who have assisted us so capably with the catering, and our thanks go in particular to Murray Woods and Tony Ashleigh and to all members who have supported our functions, thus helping to maintain the friendly atmosphere within our club.
