#### DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st MAY, 1972

To be presented to Members at the Ordinary General Meeting to be held on 19th July, 1972.

#### COMMODORE'S REPORT

The Club's one hundredth Annual Report marks a milestone in its history, and I have a very deep sense of honour to be reporting as Commodore at this time. We all look forward to celebrating the Centenary of the Club's foundation and to the production of our Centenary Publication during next season. The past year has not been particularly eventful. However, thanks to the efforts of the various committees our activities have been maintained at their usual high standard.

Our racing fleet continues to grow. The successful introduction of two new divisions and the reforming of the Bluebird Division last season gave us a total of eight divisions, which is more than we have ever had in the past 100 years. The ability of our Sailing Committee to provide racing of such a high standard for this enlarged fleet is a great credit to them and I would like to express my appreciation for a job so well done.

The Boatshed business has been well conducted and continues to be a useful source of revenue to the Club whilst at the same time providing members with efficient and economical facilities for the maintenance of their boats. To the Committee and staff I express my gratitude.

The Clubhouse Committee has given us most enjoyable functions thanks to their untiring efforts and I would like to thank the Slocombe family in particular for the work they have done to maintain and develop the happy atmosphere of which we are all justly proud.

The Development Committee having successfully completed Stage 1 of the redevelopment of the Club's premises, is now tackling Stage 2. Only those who have been involved fully appreciate the amount of work required to handle this important function which has been faithfully carried out in the best interests of the Club.

It is pleasing to note that 51 new members joined the Club during the past year and I wish them many years of happy participation in Club activities.

I regret having to report the death during the year of two Life Members, Mr. Arch McKenzie and Mr. Arthur J. Stone, and wish on behalf of the members to extend our sympathy to their families.

It is difficult to single out anyone for special mention in a Club which has always thrived on the devotion of so many who voluntarily give their time and energy, and it is my belief that the success which the Club enjoys is due in no small measure to the high calibre of its members as a whole and to the excellence of the staff it employs.

#### FINANCE/ADMINISTRATION

Commodore S. B. Lloyd (Chairman), D. M. Stokes, B. W. Woods, N. G. Cassim, J. A. Middleton, A. W. Merrington.

As can be seen from the Annual Balance Sheet, the Club's finances are in a healthy state. Comparison should be made between the turnover and the salaries paid, when it will become apparent that the administrative costs of running the club are offset by the amount of voluntary work done, thus enabling subscriptions to be kept to a minimum level.

Many hours have been spent during the year considering amendments to the Club's Articles of Association, and in his capacity as Hon. Solicitor Mr. Cassim rendered invaluable service in this respect.

The Committee gratefully acknowledges a bequest of \$400 from the late Mr. Arthur J. Stone. It was resolved by the Directors that this sum be used by the Club to perpetuate the memory of Arthur Stone.

#### BOATSHED

Financial: Work volume sold during the first nine months of the year to end of March was satisfactory at 69.67%. Average for the two previous years being: season 1970/71, 68.3%; 1969/70, 52.8%. However, last April in common with most sheds on the waterfront, showed a temporary but marked decline in work. May recovered to normal levels and present indications are that we should complete the year with average work volume sales, slightly below that of 1970/71 season.

In an economic atmosphere of rising costs your Committee is continually seeking ways and means to insulate members from increased charges — it is fair comment to say the inevitable must occur at some time but with your support, for which we thank you, we have endeavoured to maintain a viable operation on charges that we believe to be the lowest in the industry. On the basis of showing a reasonable margin as contribution towards the Club's overall financial results and at the same time supplying members with an adequate service at the lowest practical cost, we consider the year has shown satisfactory results.

**Property:** The boatshed, slips, moorings and general facilities have all been maintained in good order. The tender was extensively re-fitted in the latter part of the year and is now in as good if not better condition to perform its intended function than when first launched.

**Development:** Dinghy stowage continues to be difficult and after detailed consideration of alternatives, the Committee believes the best solution rests in using the entire boatshed for stowage. This will involve re-location of the office-workshop which the Development Committee will consider in their plans for future alterations. It is proposed that this work be done in conjunction with the extension to No. 2 slip landwards to carry a second cradle, so facilitating long standing out of the water without interfering with our normal short term work.

The Committee wishes to record its sincere appreciation of the co-operation and sterling work performed by Tony Ashleigh in the boatshed and Mrs. Kartzoff in the office, together with their respective assistants.

#### **CLUBHOUSE**

During the 1971/72 season many members and their friends were entertained at the clubhouse with two dinner-dances and two party nights. The "Christmas Party Crazy Hat Night" and the "Hawaiian Night" were exceptionally successful and we hope that the club will be able to offer similar entertainment in the coming season.

Double doors have been fitted to the north-western wall of the club-house. This has improved accessibility from clubhouse to wharf and added to the comfort and convenience of members attending club functions. When weather permits it will also enlarge our total entertainment area. The interior of the clubhouse is undergoing a "face-lift" with new paint and varnish. New carpet for the foyer and new curtains for the windows are also planned.

Northcott Day was marred by inclement weather which, however, did little to dampen the enjoyment of the children from both the Manly-Warringah and Northcott Homes. The day was, as usual, a great success—made possible only by the generous help from so many members who made their yachts available or assisted at the clubhouse. We also thank members of Parramatta Rotary for their splendid help and co-operation.

Our monthly meetings were highlighted by several excellent films and the "America's Cup Story" was voted the best ever. Our thanks go to those organisations who made their films available to us, and to our several guest speakers who addressed us on a variety of interesting topics.

Idle Hour Day went off without a hitch and Bob Amorsen and Bob Banta (now back in New York) who made the necessary arrangements were rewarded by a wonderful attendance at Store Beach after the race.

This brief report would not be complete without our thanks to the hard-working members of the Social Committee. In particular we thank the ladies of the Committee who gave so much of their time to make the club functions such a success.

#### RACING

Two new divisions were formed at the start of the 1971/72 season, Special Division for 5.5 metre type yachts and an Endeavour-Southerly Division. The Bluebird Division was formed again, as a Handicap at Start fleet, while the remainder of the yachts were divided into four handicap divisions.

As always, when divisions are recast the handicaps took some time to adjust. In particular some yachts raised to 1st Division from 2nd Division just refused to recognise the superiority of larger yachts.

Entries at the end of the season were 6 fewer than our record, being 117 yachts. However the number of starters was at least equal to any past

year. The Thunderbird Division remains very strong with 18 entries, and this Club ran the 1971/72 State Championships for this Class. The winner was KALDARI, Richard Wilson, 2nd was VENTURER, Michael Nash, and 3rd was CHRISTINA, Dick Christian.

The racing was at least as keen as ever, and the point score result in most divisions was only decided in the last race. In the Bluebird Division there was a tie for first place between IMPALA, Kevin Tindall, and TALUNA, John Jacob. To the best of anyone's knowledge this is the first time a tie for first place has occurred.

Middle Harbour Yacht Club again retained Daydream Shield, though it was a very even contest. Next year we obviously need some unfair advantage — members' ideas would be appreciated!

The Sailing Committee worked very well, and we are fortunate to have so many keen men, who are prepared to devote their time and energy to handicapping, courses, protests and the organisation of our racing.

Our Racing Secretary, Paul Slocombe, did an excellent job in preparing the programmes, but he is not going to continue as he has received instructions to report to the Army. Many thanks, Paul, and we look forward to your return to racing.

Our record of having the sailing instructions in the post the first day after the week-end has been sustained for another season, and our congratulations and thanks go to Mrs. Kartzoff. Her cartoons on some programmes were also very popular.

Our Starter's Boat was supplied by Geoff Cambridge, and with Jack Millard or Don Skinner in charge we again received excellent starts and accurate finishes. Our sincere thanks go to the three of them, and to their helpers on the boat.

Next season will see further changes, with an Offshore Division, a different Starter's Boat, several new office-bearers, certainly some different divisions and with only one handicap for most divisions. With the Skippers' Meeting being so well attended, and with a keen committee doing their best to improve our systems, our racing can only be better than ever.

#### DEVELOPMENT

During the year the club has completed landing steps to the fitting-out berth, has completed the crane which is now becoming well-known as one of the best cranes of its type available for yachtsmen, and has recently completed a new set of doors leading from the Clubroom to the wharf, which will be a considerable amenity on social occasions.

The Committee has principally concerned itself with the preparation of a master plan for the development of the premises. This is not easy, bearing in mind the limitations of the site and the various attitudes of statutory bodies. A brief has been prepared and an architect has been invited to accept a commission to negotiate with these Authorities and to prepare a master plan for the development of the Club's physical facilities.
