COMMODORE'S REPORT

The 1972/73 year was a memorable one during which we celebrated the Club's Centenary, and after 100 years the Club is stronger than it has ever been with 414 members and 184 yachts on the register.

We now have our own Starter's Boat and our racing last season was as keen and enjoyable as ever with a fleet of 120 on the programme, divided into seven divisions.

Our assets and finances are in good order notwithstanding heavier than usual commitments during the year to honour suitably the Club's 100th anniversary.

All the regular committees have worked well during the year, and several special committees, which were responsible for the various functions, performed their tasks with great enthusiasm and credit.

The Historical Publications Committee, under the chairmanship of Jim Middleton, produced for us a book of which the Club has every reason to be very proud.

The Centenary Celebrations Committee, chaired by John Jackson, did a magnificent job in planning and co-ordinating the various aspects of our celebrations. Over the past few years John Jackson had given a tremendous amount of time and thought to the work of this Committee and it was most unfortunate that he sustained a serious accident during the year which spoiled to a large extent his enjoyment of the culmination of his efforts.

The Centenary Regatta Committee, with Bill Gale at the helm, planned and organised the manoeuvre for vessels carrying a mainsail spar, which must have been the most spectacular and noteworthy gathering in the Club's history.

Vice-Commodore Hugh Jackson's Clubhouse/Social Committee, with the help of Bill Merrington and Colin Crisp, did an excellent job of organising a very exacting programme of functions which included the Centenary Dinner at which we were honoured by the presence of our Patron, His Excellency Sir Roden Cutler, V.C., K.C.M.G., K.C.V.O., C.B.E.

I sincerely thank the chairmen and members of all committees for their invaluable contribution to the smooth running of the Club.

The activities of all these committees resulted in a very onerous work load for our Assistant Secretary, Mrs. Kartzoff, and I should especially like to thank her for a job so well and graciously carried out.

Finally I thank all the members and our staff for their support of the Club during this our Centenary Year.

FINANCE/ADMINISTRATION

Commodore S. B. Lloyd (Chairman), D. M. Stokes, B. W. Woods, A. W. Merrington, J. A. Middleton.

As will be seen from the Treasurer's Report and Balance Sheet the Club's finances are in a very satisfactory position. However, due to ever-increasing costs, it has been necessary to increase slightly our fees and charges.

Some changes in administration have been effected, giving the Assistant Secretary increased duties to assist some of our honorary officials and to permit the boatshed staff more time to attend to the work load of yacht and property maintenance.

A new By-Law has been prepared, setting out the procedures required to be followed for the application and election of new members.

It is gratifying to note that Brian Woods, who has been a member of this Committee for twelve years, and has given countless hours of his time, has received worthy recognition of his services by his election to Honorary Life Membership.

BOATSHED

Rear Commodore E. C. Slocombe (Chairman), I. D. V. Ralfe, F. D. Bradshaw, D. W. Gale, R. G. Hopkins, B. G. Ironside, D. Kelly, R. Amorsen.

Work volume carried out during the year was satisfactory in relation to past seasons; however, in common with all industries, we experienced a rise in operating costs including a 400% increase in mooring fees by the Maritime Services Board. The policy of the Club is to provide its members with an adequate service at the lowest practical cost and at the same time show a reasonable margin as a contribution to the Club's overall financial results. Because of these increases in our operating costs it became necessary to review our scale of charges, and adjustments for some of the services we provide became inevitable. Whilst we were reluctantly compelled to increase labour charges and mooring fees, slipping charges were unaltered and your Club still provides all these services at the lowest rate on the Harbour. No works of a major nature were carried out this season, but the boatshed, slips and general facilities have all been maintained in good order.

Polypropylene rope has been fitted to a number of moorings, which has eased handling, particularly on the deeper sites. All moorings will be converted to this system as replacement of chain becomes necessary.

Dinghy stowage remains a problem and there appears to be no short-term solution. However, the Development Committee is taking this into consideration in its plans for future alterations. The Boatshed Committee wishes to record its appreciation and express its thanks for the help and co-operation given by Tony Ashleigh and Mrs. Kartzoff and their assistants throughout the year.

CLUBHOUSE

With this report, so we complete the Centenary Year and the celebrations that all enjoyed to mark that occasion. The regular features of Club social activity through the twelve months were given a special Centenary flavour in addition to the extraordinary functions organised to complete the programme.

The Vice Regal Banquet, V.I.P. Cocktail Party, Ladies' Luncheon and the weather on every occasion smiled in our favour. The day of the Gaffriggers Race saw perhaps more members and friends at the Club than have ever gathered there at the one time before.

The dignity of the Club was assisted at all times by the tidy and attractive surroundings, maintained under the careful ministrations of our groundsman.

Little was done by way of reconstruction throughout the year owing to the Centenary celebration commitments. However, the repainting of the buildings (surprisingly there was general approval of the colour) freshened the external appearance, whilst the rearrangement of photos, honour boards, pennants and other decor maintained the pleasant atmosphere to which members have become accustomed.

Now our 100th birthday is behind us, we will be reverting to the less formal social life of general practice. One of the immediate tasks as seen by your Committee is the production of income to offset the burden generated by Centenary activities, and thought is currently being given to the variety and number of functions that can be run to achieve this object.

In conclusion the Committee thanks all those who have given so much assistance through the year, the ladies who man the food department, the generous donors of goods and work for Northcott Day, and Mrs. Kartzoff for her willing efficiency.

RACING

The season opened with eight divisions and the hope of an offshore division; however, this division had to be abandoned as there were insufficient starters.

Races were conducted this year from our own Starter's Boat by Jack Millard, Ray King and other helpers. Once again we thank them for a job very well done.

Three Tasman 22's were added to the Endeavour/Southerly division making a total of 17 entries. A second G.R.P. division was formed consisting of boats 24 to 26 feet L.O.A., with 16 entries. The Bluebird Division lacked numbers and so was absorbed into the other divisions for the summer point score.

The Thunderbird and Metre divisions functioned successfully once again, and we are hoping to receive five to ten new entries in the metre division next year.

Geoff de Looze did a first-class job as Racing Secretary. His work was made even more arduous by my prolonged illness in the second half of the season.

My thanks go to Geoff, to Mrs. Kartzoff and to the Racing Committee whose efforts resulted in such a successful racing season.

DEVELOPMENT

Events of the Centenary Year, assuming a position of greatest importance to the Club, made it prudent to curtail the activity of the Development Committee to the point of only keeping the pot simmering.

Consequently, there has been no physical addition to the Club's premises. However, the preparation of the Master Plan has taken another forward step with the submission of a set of sketch drawings by the Club's Architect. These are currently being considered by the Committee, and every aspect of providing for the Club's needs discussed with the Architect. The plans are yet to be put to the Directors.

It is hoped that, with Centenary Year behind us, we will be able to become more active on the developing side.

HISTORICAL PUBLICATIONS

"The Amateurs" has been completed and launched, and this committee is very gratified at the reception it received.

The Synopsis of Official Minutes covering the first one hundred years has been completed and five bound copies produced. One each to National Library of Australia, Mitchell Library and Club records; L. P. Jones and J. A. Middleton have accepted responsibility for the safekeeping of the other two copies.

A supplement to "The Amateurs" is being produced to complete the coverage to the full one hundred years and contains a report of the Centenary Celebrations.

DIRECTORS' REPORT

To the Members,

The following report is made in accordance with a resolution of the Directors with respect to the profit of the Club for the financial year ended 31st May, 1973 and the state of the Club's affairs as at that date.

- (a) The net profit of the Club for the financial year amounted to \$1852.
- (b) The following transfers to or from reserves or provision during the financial year were:
 - (i) \$1,000 from accumulated funds to rebuilding fund.
 - (ii) \$750 from provision for Centenary year costs to accumulated fund.
- (c) Before the Income and Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet were made out, the Directors took reasonable steps to ascertain what action had been taken in relation to the writing off of bad debts and the making of provisions for doubtful debts and to cause all known bad debts to be written off and adequate provision to be made for doubtful debts.
- (d) At the date of the report the Directors are not aware of any circumstances which would render the amount written off for bad debts or the amount of the Provision for Doubtful Debts inadequate to a substantial extent.
- (e) Before the Income and Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet were made out, the Directors took reasonable steps to ascertain whether any current assets (other than debts owing to the company, referred to in (c) above) were unlikely to realise in the ordinary course of business their value as shown in the accounting records of the company and, if so, to cause:
 - (i) Those assets to be written down to an amount which they might be expected to realise; or
 - (ii) Adequate provision to be made for the difference between the amount of the value as so shown and the amount that they might be expected to realise.
- (f) At the date of the report the Directors are not aware of any circumstances which would render the values attributed to current assets in the accounts misleading.
- (g) At the date of the report:
 - (i) No charge exists on the assets of the Club which has arisen since the end of the financial year and secured the liabilities of any other person.
 - (ii) No contingent liability exists which has arisen since the end of the financial year.
- (h) No contingent or other liability has become enforceable or is likely to become enforceable within the period of twelve months after the end of the financial year which, in the opinion of the Directors, will or may affect the ability of the Club to meet its obligations when they fall due.
