#### COMMODORE'S REPORT

The year just concluded witnessed a further chapter in the progress of the Amateurs. Advances continued in a number of areas and as usual were the product of effort. Things, contrary to popular belief, never just happen! They have to be made to happen and this process requires effort.

Members were fortunate in having once again an enthusiastic and capable group of officials to provide for their many needs. It would seem appropriate however, in this my last year in office, to point out the necessity for involvement by all members, if the traditions of the Amateurs are to be maintained and indeed advanced in years to come. It is the collective expertise of members brought together at committee or board level which ensure the success of the many ventures undertaken for the benefit of members. The needs of members are therefore the responsibility of members and each of us should consider how best we can assume our responsibility.

The first stage of the building renovation and redevelopment programme referred to last year is now complete and members are enjoying the results of this development. Likewise the new club tender has undergone several modifications which have contributed to its overall efficiency.

The most recent development has been the establishment of a club radio communication network. It was initially proposed to provide a Club Base Station for the purpose of contacting its own vessels. The scheme was however expanded to include members' yachts and an inexpensive communication system is now available through the Club to members for harbour and coastal use.

Sailing activities this year have increased to new levels of achievement under the chairmanship and guidance of Peter Hamilton. Not only have numbers increased but also the quality of competition has been such as to tax the resources of all concerned with starting and finishing races. This year the Club fleet has increased from nine to eleven divisions and weekly entries have risen to approximately one hundred and fifty yachts. Handicapping has been such that on most occasions starter Jack Millard and his crew have been heavily taxed as group after group of yachts cross the finishing line in close company.

The Boatshed department was again very ably managed by Vice-Commodore Bob Skinner. As mentioned elsewhere, Bob and his Committee have continued to provide and improve those services so essential to the boat owning members of the Club. It is worthy of note that during the periodic bad blows which we experience in the Bay, the Club has suffered no failures to any of its equipment.

Clubhouse and related activities continued this year under the enthusiastic control of Rear Commodore Vic Dibben and his hard working Committee. The success of so many functions was a measure of the effort put into the organization by this group.

To conclude this my final year in office, my personal thanks to all who have assisted me in so many ways to pursue the objectives of the Amateurs for the past three years.

To the Board, the Committees, the Starters, Colleen, Tony and Carl — thank you.

#### FINANCE/ADMINISTRATION

Results for the year under review were considered satisfactory and were in line with the Club budget prepared at the beginning of the period. As in prior years your Directors received regular quarterly reports on progress against budget. In addition a number of monthly control reports provide timely information to the Board on liquidity, status of debtors, levels of labour sales etc.

The Committee is currently working on proposals to assist the Board in its consideration of the next stage of its redevelopment programme. At the same time it has reviewed the liquidity of the Club and its planned future needs against an economic background of continued but reducing inflation.

Recently published rate revisions for a number of services were generally in line with cost increases in the community. Happily however your Club is still providing services to members at rates below those obtainable elsewhere.

#### BOATSHED

The objective of the Committee during the year has been to maintain boatshed, boat maintenance and mooring facilities on a sound trading basis at the same time keeping charges to members as low as possible.

There has been some downturn of work no doubt due to the general financial situation, but an adequate work load has been maintained, refer draft.

The Boatshed Committee wishes to record its thanks to the Boatshed staff Tony Ashleigh, Peter Wargent and to Carl Speers.

#### CLUBHOUSE

The Committee continued this year to encourage members to participate in Clubhouse Activities. As part of this objective a "get together" was started taking place on Saturday afternoon from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. at the Clubhouse when racing does not take

Many members have taken advantage of this gathering to meet other members and

have discussions on a range of subjects generally associated with sailing.

Monthly General meetings have been well attended with interesting subjects and speakers.

An outstanding evening was when Club member Bill Lawler gave members an insight into the Admirals Cup races in the U.K.

Some very good films have been shown, one being the 1977 Hobart race which we were able to obtain almost immediately it became available.

Another interesting film was "A man — a ship — a dream" which was loaned to us by the Cape Horners Association.

At one General meeting discussions was around racing, cruising and yachting activities in the S.A.S.C., this resulted in a special meeting of members interested in cruising and the formation of a Cruising Division within the Club.

Another night a lecture on marine radios resulted in the Club installing its own 27 MHz

radio transceiver & sets being made available to Club members at a reduced price. The annual event when the Club entertains the children from the Northcott and Manly Warringah schools was again successful due to the assistance and support from the members and their ladies, and the Committee would like to thank everyone who assisted, whether by donation or practical help.

The numbers of members and their crews returning to the Clubhouse after the races has increased and the Committee are pleased to report that the catering arrangements

have been able to cope with the increasing numbers.

The Clubhouse Committee are continuing to aim for increasing member activity and plans for upgrading the kitchen in the Club have been prepared by the Club's Architect, and they are being considered by the Directors.

New furniture is also on the list for consideration.

The year is ending with maximum bookings for the Annual Dinner Dance and Prize Giving night. The Committee would like to thank the members for their support during the year and also record its thanks to Colleen Nicolls, Clare Constable, Mrs. Percival, Tony Ashleigh, Peter Wargent and Carl Speers.

#### DEVELOPMENT

C.F.C. Crisp (Chairman), R.L. Skinner, C.H. Bull, W.R. Lawler, G. Brackenbury. Completion of workshop and toilet facilities and payment for them continued into this year's activities. All this work is now complete and operational.

Planning of the Club's future has been restricted to a look at its immediate needs over the next five years. This has involved improvement of domestic facilities in the kitchen and Clubroom and upgrading of the racing/sailing facilities.

The latter has been studied in depth by the Racing Committee.

The Development Committee has had the Club Architect prepare sketches and estimates for improvement around the Clubhouse and has put to the Board its recommendations in favour of proceeding with these with similar priority to upgrading racing facilities.

As the Board has accepted these recommendations in principle it is confidently expected that both developments will come to fruition in the coming or subsequent year.

A record fleet of 149 yachts was entered in the Club's Saturday Spring and Summer racing season. The fleet was divided between 11 divisions, of which 6 started with a

scratch start and 5 had handicap starts.

The task of starting and controlling this large fleet has grown significantly, and members should respect with gratitude the continuing efforts of our starters Jack Millard and Ray King and their assistants, and our Hon. Racing Secretary Peter Chapman. John Jeremy's work as convenor of a sub-committee responsible for the preparation of a report recommending that the Club build a new Starter's boat is much appreciated. It is gratifying to note that the Directors have agreed in principle with that recommendation.

Members will note from the fixture list (published as the centrefold) how much more extensive the Club's programme is now than it was a few years ago. Additional voluntary support will occasionally be required to run this programme. Your committee hopes that that support will be more forthcoming in the future than it has been in the recent past.

I would like to wish all members, and the new Chairman and his committee in

particular, fair weather and good sailing.

In accordance with a resolution of the board of directors, the directors report as follows with respect to the club's surplus for the financial year ended 31st May, 1978 and the state of the club's affairs at that date.

- 1. The operating surplus of the club for the year ended 31st May, 1978 was \$1,700.
- 2. No issue of notes or debentures was made by the club during the financial year. year.
- 3. The directors took reasonable steps before the income and expenditure statements and balance sheet were made out, to ascertain that all known bad debts were written off and that adequate provision was made for doubtful debts.
- 4. At the date of this report the directors are not aware of any circumstances which would render the amount of the provision for doubtful debts inadequate to any substantial extent. During the year ended 31st May, 1978 no debts were required to be written off as bad debts.
- 5. At the date of this report the directors are not aware of any circumstances which would render the values attributed to current assets in the accounts misleading.
- 6. No charge on the assets of the club has arisen since the end of the financial year to the date of this report to secure the liabilities of any other person.

  No contingent liability has arisen since the end of the financial year to the date of this report.
- 7. No contingent or other liability has become enforceable or is likely to become enforceable within the period of twelve months after the end of the financial year which, in the opinion of the directors, will or may affect the ability of the club to meet its obligations when they fall due.
- 8. In the interval between the end of the financial year and the date of this report no item, transaction or event of a material and unusual nature has arisen which is likely, in the opinion of the directors, to affect substantially the results of the club's operations for the next succeeding financial year.
- 9. Since the end of the previous financial year no director of the club has received or become entitled to receive a benefit by reason of a contract made by the club with the director or with a firm of which he is a member or with a company in which he has a substantial financial interest.

### SYDNEY AMATEUR SAILING CLUB RACING REGULATIONS

- 1. Control. The Committee shall have control of all matters connected with racing and shall fix race entry fees, set courses, divide yachts into divisions at its discretion and shall decide any question which may arise which is not provided for in these regulations, but a yacht shall always have the right of appeal to the Yachting Association of N.S.W. against a disqualification as a result of a protest.
- 2. Racing Rules. Races shall be conducted under the current racing rules of the International Yacht Racing Union. Addendum B, parts 2 and 3, being Safety Regulations of the Australian Yachting Federation and the appropriate class rules all as modified by the Sailing Instructions.
- 3. Class Rules. The Bluebird Division is open to all yachts registered with the Bluebird Association. The Quarter-Ton Division is open to yachts with the appropriate racing certificate and, by invitation, to other yachts which should be expected to rate 18.0. The Half-Ton Division is open to yachts with the appropriate racing certificate and, by invitation, to other yachts which should be expected to rate 21.5. The Thunderbird Division is open to all yachts registered with the Thunderbird Association. Yachts racing in the Thunderbird Division shall comply with the Constitution and Specifications of the Class Association.
- 4. Entries. Entries shall be made in the form adopted by the Club and shall be forwarded to the Hon. Racing Secretary, Sydney Amateur Sailing Club, Green Street, Cremorne 2090, so as to be received at least six days prior to the event in which entry is desired. All entries are subject to the approval of the Racing Committee.
- 5. Person in Charge. A member of a recognised Yacht Club shall be in charge of each yacht competing in a race conducted by the Club.
- 6. Number of Starters. Unless three (3) yachts start in a Club race, it will be at the Starter's discretion to cancel the race, in which case no prize will be awarded and unless four (4) yachts start, no second prize will be given and unless six (6) yachts start, no third prize will be given.
- 7. Prizes. The Committee shall award the prizes subject to these rules, but before they do so, the owner or his representative may be required to sign the prescribed declaration that the yacht has conformed to all Rules and Regulations.
- 8. Sails and Rigging. Any alteration affecting the declared dimensions of hull, spars, sails or rigging, propellor, etc., shall be advised to the Hon. Racing Secretary six days prior to the event to which the alterations will apply. The spinnaker boom shall be set from the mast in such a manner that the distance between the mast and the outer end of the spinnaker boom cannot exceed half the overall length or twice the moulded beam, whichever is greater. No headsail or spinnaker shall be hoisted from any spar above the masthead.
- 9. Alternate Helmsman. Change of regular helmsman shall be notified to the Honorary Racing Secretary or the Starter at least 24 hours before the race. A yacht may be disqualified for failing to notify. The Committee reserves the right to after the handicap for a change of helmsman.
- 10. Dress. Helmsmen and crews of all yachts competing shall be suitably attired, the minimum requirements in this respect being shorts and shirt.
- 11. Motors. A yacht may be propelled by motor or towed until two minutes before it crosses the starting line.
- 12. Club Racing Flag. Yachts when racing shall fly the S.A.S.C. racing flag at or near the masthead.
- 13. "A" Prefix Sail Numbers shall be black and shall be worn on each side of the mainsail and spinnaker.
- 14. When not racing Club yachts should fly the Red Ensign (or Blue Ensign) and the Club burgee.
- 15. Sale of Yachts. Where a member disposes of his boat or sails it shall be his duty to protect the interests of the Club by removing any registered markings from the sails, withdrawing his burgee and notifying the Hon. Racing Secretary.

#### POINTSCORES AND HANDICAPS

Club Pointscores: Each division shall have a handicap pointscore competition and divisions with a scratch start shall also have a scratch pointscore competition. Each yacht finishing will score points equal to the number of entries in the race minus the number of yachts beating her. In the handicap pointscores, additional points will be awarded: seven points for first place; four points for second place; two points for third place. Retiring yachts will receive one point. Only a yacht entered for the whole season, or entered before February 13 for the remainder of the season, will be eligible to receive points.

Yachts must discard the points of three races in the season. The points of one race must be discarded in each of the Spring and Summer pointscores — see below. Races earning the least points (including races in which the yacht did

not start or finish) will be discarded.

In each division a gold medal will be awarded to the Club member earning the greatest number of handicap points; a silver medal will be awarded to the Club member earning the second greatest number of handicap points; and a bronze medal will be awarded to the Club member earning the third greatest number of handicap points. Points accumulated during the season prior to membership will be counted.

**Spring Point Score**—A trophy will be awarded to the yacht in each division leading in the handicap Point Score at Christmas (one (1) race discarded).

Summer Point Score—A trophy will be awarded to the yacht in each division earning the most points in the handicap Point Score from January onwards (one (1) race discarded).

Handicapping: An automatic handicap penalty will be applied of 5 minutes or 3% for a win, 3 minutes or 2% for second, 2 minutes or 1% for third. A yacht which does not start in two consecutive pointscore races will have a one minute or 1% reduction of handicap. Handicap variations may be made at the discretion of the Racing Committee.

Kelly Cup: Perpetual Trophy for competition between the leading yachts from all divisions in the handicap pointscores.

Gretel Trophy—A perpetual trophy of a Gold Cup presented by the late Sir Frank Packer to the winner of the No. 1 Division Point Score.

H. S. Lloyd Memorial Trophy—A perpetual trophy presented by the Lloyd family to the winner of the Second Division Point Score.

John Taylor Cooke Memorial Trophy: A trophy presented by H. E. Pfeisfer to the winner of the No. 3 Division pointscore.

P. J. Worrall Trophy—A perpetual trophy awarded to the winner of the Thunderbird Division Scratch Point Score.

Tempest Memorial Trophy: A perpetual trophy awarded to the winner of the Metre Division pointscore.

Merrington Trophy: A perpetual trophy presented by the Merrington family to the winner of the Bluebird Division scratch pointscore.

J.O.G. Plate: A perpetual trophy awarded to the winner of the Quarter-Ton Division scratch pointscore.

Ida Trophy: A perpetual trophy awarded to the winner of the No. 5 Division pointscore.

Magic Dragon Trophy: A perpetual Trophy presented by Mr. and Mrs. Colin Bull to encourage racing in the Half-Ton Division—to be awarded to the winner of the Spring scratch pointscore.

Bill Gately Memorial Trophy: A perpetual trophy presented by the family of the late W. J. Gately to be awarded to the leading Hood 23 in the No. 4 Division scratch pointscore at Christmas.

Tingira Trophy: A perpetual Trophy presented by Dr. C. H. (Tom) Selby in recognition of the part all crews play in the successful racing performance of yachts—to be awarded to the nominated forward hand of the winning yacht in the No. 3 Division pointscore.

Bob Brown Trophy: A trophy presented by the late A. W. Furse and G. Crichton to the winner of a race to be held at Easter.

Idle Hour Trophy: A perpetual trophy presented by the late A. W. Furse, awarded to the winner of a picnic race finishing at Store Beach.

Tara-ipo Seamanship Trophy: A perpetual trophy presented by Mr. and Mrs. A. Norton-Smith to the winner of a race to test seamanship.

Daydream Shield—A perpetual trophy donated by Mr. Peter Fletcher for competition between M.H.Y.C. and S.A.S.C., in inter-club races.

Centenary Trophy: A perpetual trophy awarded to the skipper who, on handicap, wins by the greatest margin within his division in the race held closest to Founders' Day (October 1).

Centenary Plate—Each skipper who wins a gold medal scores a point towards the Centenary Plate. The first skipper to score 3 points wins the trophy outright.
