## BOATSHED

Progress has been made during 1980/81, with improvements to the Boatshed equipment, with repairs to slipway cradles and the purchase of trestles for the clipway and a pedestal drill for the workshop. The winch on No.2 slipway failed and was found to be beyond economical repair. It has been replaced with a second hand winch which has been thoroughly refitted before installation. Work on the slipways will continue in the coming year.

Demand for Club moorings has continued to be high during the year, with only a small turnover. The waiting list has remained between 8 and 15, and with no prospect of additional moorings being allocated to the Club, there appears no easy resolution to the mooring situation.

“Captain Amora” and “Nancy K” have worked hard during the year, and routine refits are planned for both boats during the winter. The distinctly “agricultural” steering gear now fitted to “Nancy K” has done its duty admirably.

The boatshed continues to rely heavily on voluntary work of Boatshed Committee Members. Tony Ashleigh and Peter Wargent, supported by Carl Speers have kept business moving during the year despite some unexpected hindrances and the Committee joins me in extending our appreciation to them.

# SYDNEY AMATEUR SAILING CLUB

## DIRECTORS' REPORT

In accordance with a resolution of the board of directors, the directors' report as follows with respect to the club's surplus for the financial year ended 31st May, 1981 and the state of the Club's affairs at that date.

1. The operating surplus of the club for the year ended 31st May, 1981 was \$8,654.00.
2. No issue of notes or debentures was made by the Club during the financial year.
3. The directors took reasonable steps before the income and expenditure statements and balance sheet were made out, to ascertain that there were no bad debts and that adequate provision was made for doubtful debts.
4. At the date of this report the directors are not aware of any circumstances which would render the amount of the provision for doubtful debts inadequate to any substantial extent.
5. At the date of this report the directors are not aware of any circumstances which would render the values attributed to current assets in the accounts misleading.
6. No charge on the assets of the club has arisen since the end of the financial year to the date of this report to secure the liabilities of any other person.  
No contingent liability has arisen since the end of the financial year to the date of this report.
7. No contingent or other liability has become enforceable or is likely to become enforceable within the period of twelve months after the end of the financial year which, in the opinion of the directors, will or may affect the ability of the Club to meet its obligations when they fall due.
8.
