COMMODORE'S REPORT

The Annual Report is one that gives me pleasure to write because again the S.A.S.C. has had a successful year.

On the racing side the Club has successfully completed the season's racing with minimum problems. Thanks to Peter Chessher, Hon. Racing Secretary, the Race Committee, the Starters Jack Millard and his team. Every effort has been made to ensure championships conducted by the S.A.S.C. were to a high standard, including match racing events for the Dragon Association.

With Offshore racing, S.A.S.C. members are really starting to make the club prominent by participating in the Sydney-Hobart, Mooloolaba, Lord Howe and Noumea races.

In the harbour Idle Hour Trophy & Day Dream Shield races were again conducted, maintaining the tradition to hold these events.

Half ton rating yachts for the S.A.S.C. and R.S.Y.S. combined and raced this year with the R.S.Y.S. It proved a most competitive division with "MAGIC DRAGON", "TINGARI" and "VOLOS" S.A.S.C. yachts coming first, second and third respectively in the overall point score.

The S.A.S.C. No. 1 Division and the R.S.Y.S. No. 2 Division combined and raced with the S.A.S.C. with S.A.S.C. yachts filling the first three places in the overall point score.

On the social scene your club has been represented at functions at other major yacht clubs. The S.A.S.C. social functions at the clubhouse have always attracted maximum numbers. The annual Northcott Day at the S.A.S.C., for handicapped children was again well supported by S.A.S.C. members and although a wet day, it was a happy one.

The Officers and Directors are aware of the requirements of members and constantly looking for ways and means to upgrade the services and facilities for members.

To improve the efficiency of the operations of the club a computer will be installed.

The clubhouse, club boats, moorings and equipment have been maintained in good order and condition through an ongoing maintenance programme. As mentioned by the Vice Commodore in his report, Tony Ashleigh was seriously injured on the slipway, he is still a patient in the Royal North Shore Hospital and I am sure all the members join with me in wishing him a speedy recovery.

Peter Wargent who had previously been employed by the Club for seven years, was selected from a number of applicants to carry on the Boatshed activities.

The success of any club is due to the efforts of its Directors including the Secretary and Treasurer, Committees and members, I am pleased to say, have all contributed to make it such a successful year both financially and in its activities. I do thank them for their support.

To our staff, Mrs. Fitzgerald, Mrs. Ferris, Mrs. Percival, Tony Ashleigh, Peter Wargent and Carl Speers, my sincere thanks for their loyal support.

As indicated above, membership has remained relatively stable and whilst there have been changes in the composition of the membership table, there has been a net reduction of only one for the period.

Once again your Committee is pleased to report that results have been in line with the financial plan adopted by your Board at the beginning of the year. Whilst costs have risen it is pleasing to note that the rate of increase has been contained and was covered by the modest price variations which were implemented at the beginning of the period.

Clubhouse activities contributed substantially to the overall results this year and social activities in particular provided not only good entertainment for all concerned but a substantial increase in cash flow.

As the year closed, the Committee recommended that further modest increases in the selling price of Club services be implemented. This recommendation was made in the light of further measures which it believes are available to contain costs.

BOATSHED

The committee has the unhappy duty to report that an otherwise relatively tranquil year was shattered by a disastrous accident in which Tony Ashleigh had the lower part of his left leg severely damaged, necessitating amputation.

We know that the very best wishes for as complete and rapid recovery as possible will be in the hearts of all members. Tony's great fortitude and strength of character will undoubtedly be of inestimable benefit during the recovery process.

This circumstance has made temporary closure of the slipway necessary but we anticipate that full services to members will be resumed from early June, 1983. During the closure arrangements were made for members' boats to be slipped and serviced at the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron, Kirribilli. Our thanks to the Squadron for their co-operation.

Projects under active planning and design at present include replacement of the dinghy pontoon by a larger pontoon which will extend further east to accommodate the Nancy K on the north side, leaving the south side free for dinghy launching and retrieval. Upgrading of the slipway winches and cradles has largely been completed. Other improvements to boatshed and shipwrights equipment will continue during the winter months. Dinghy racks will be progressively replaced. The Club has also acquired wire cutters, swaging tool and pop rivetter which will be available for the use of members during the refitting period leading up to the Spring Season. Watch the S.A.S.C. No progress has been made in the pursuit of additional moorings in Mosman Bay; consequently a waiting list for moorings is still in operation.

Extensive work to the Nancy K engine room has been completed and a thorough overhaul of the Captain Amora mechanicals and electricals will follow.

All in all, we hope to be in good shape for the next season.

In acknowledging and thanking all those who make the Boatshed and Slipway actually work, the committee members and the staff, I know we would all concentrate our thanks this year on Tony Ashleigh and hope to see him on the water again in the not so distant future.

During the past year the clubhouse sub-committee comprised a group of very hard working and enthusiastic members whose efforts resulted in a number of successful functions.

Other major events included "The Flag Officers' Night" where flags were indeed numerous as food from seventeen different countries was served, decorated with flags of the appropriate nations. The evening entitled "A night of International Cuisine" was a great success.

Christmas was celebrated this year with two functions, our traditional Christmas Dinner and an afternoon Children's Christmas Party. The evening event saw turkeys, hams, pork, Christmas Pudding and other festive fare despatched with great gusto, and all attending appeared to thoroughly enjoy themselves. The Children's Christmas party (a new event this year) was also a great success with Santa (thanks Brian Dixon) distributing gifts and kids despatching enormous quantities of party fare.

Although the weather was not kind, Northcott Day gave us the opportunity to entertain those less fortunate than ourselves. Approximately half the children who planned to attend, defied the weather and had a great time. Our thanks to all those who assisted by acting as host yachtsmen or wharf or clubhouse staff.

No report on the clubhouse would be complete without a mention of Diana Fitzgerald, our Assistant Secretary, who works behind the scenes organising bookings and purchasing the many requirements for functions, or Jeanette Percival who works so steadfastly each Saturday in our refreshment area. My thanks to both ladies for their help.

We look forward to another year of club functions and trust we will be able to introduce new and innovative ideas to make the clubhouse a special place in your planning of social activities next year.

RACING

P. Chessher (Hon. Racing Secretary), J. Millard, R. King, (Starters), D. W. Gale (Yacht Register and No. 2 Division), D. Willis (Safety), P.C. Gregory (Protest and Cavalier 28 Division), G. The 1982-1983 racing season blew in strongly and seemed to stay that way for most of the season; although records show that the season divided neatly into 10 races of under 15 knots and 10 of 15 knots plus (mostly plus). The S.A.S.C. had a fleet of 129 yachts sailing in 9 Divisions, 8 divisions sailing harbour courses.

There were, unfortunately, insufficient Bluebirds to form a Division; however, we sailed Cavalier 28's as a Division for the first time as well as a mixed fleet of yachts in the new Offshore Division. The Offshore Division has proved to be very popular with a number of the boats racing to Hobart; gaining creditable results.

The Amateurs ½ ton fleet combined with the R.S.Y.S. fleet this year with Amateurs boats gaining three major placings in handicap results. We look forward to having the combined ½ ton fleet racing with the S.A.S.C. during 1983-1984.

During the season the inaugural Cavalier 28 Owners Association State Championships, the Thunderbird State Championships as well as a series of match races for Dragon Class yachts was conducted by the S.A.S.C. The Easter long weekend saw the R.S.Y.S. and the S.A.S.C. combined to conduct championship races for a number of classes. With the increasing problem of crowding on the harbour co-operation between clubs is vital in the interests of better racing for skippers and crews. This also helps ease the workload on the starters crews who give so much of their time for our benefit.

This season saw the use of a computer to calculate results and point scores as well as storing information on individual yacht performances. Such information is invaluable to the Committee when handicaps are calculated, especially in mixed fleet events such as Idle Hour Trophy and Kelly Cup. The programme development is continuing and will eventually lead to provisional results being available at the clubhouse shortly after the completion of a race. Particular thanks must go to Pat Ferris for her help in double checking results during the initial stages of this project.

My thanks to all committee members for their efforts during the year, to our Starters, Jack Millard and Ray King and to our office staff Diana Fitzgerald and Pat Ferris.

Fair winds and good sailing to all skippers and crews for the coming season.

2. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY OF THE CLUB

7. EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO BALANCE DATE

No charge on the assets of the club has arisen since the end of the financial year to the date of this report to secure the liabilities of any other person.

No contingent liability has arisen since the end of the financial year to the date of this report.

No contingent or other liability has become enforceable or is likely to become enforceable within the period of twelve months after the end of the financial year which, in the opinion of the directors, will or may affect the ability of the club to meet its obligations when they fall due.

8. OTHER CIRCUMSTANCES

At the date of this report the directors are not aware of any circumstances not otherwise dealt with in the report or accounts, which would render any amount stated in the accounts misleading.

9. UNUSUAL TRANSACTIONS

The results of the operations of the club during the financial year were not, in the opinion of the directors, substantially affected by any item, transaction or event of a material and unusual nature.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of the club's accounts. Unless otherwise stated such accounting policies were also adopted in the preceding year.

- (a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and do not take into account changing money values.
- (b) Bank Overdraft:
Cheques drawn and not presented at the club's bank at 31st May are classified as creditors.
- (c) Depreciation and amortisation of fixed assets:
Fixed assets are being depreciated or amortised on the straight line method by sufficient charges to write off the costs of the assets over their expected useful lives.
- (d) Long service leave:
The long service leave liability has been recorded in the accounts in respect of employees having completed at least five years service with the club. The liability in respect of employees with nine years service or more is reflected as a current liability.
- (e) Stock on hand:
Stock on hand has been valued at lower of cost and net realisable value.
- (f) Income tax:
No provision for income tax is necessary as the club is exempted from taxation via the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.
