## **COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 1986-87**

It is with the greatest of pleasure I present the 115th Annual Report of the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club.

There is little doubt the club over the past year has made considerable progress and this has been the direct result of a great deal of hard and dedicated work on the part of many members.

In the racing sphere, the downward trend experienced over so many years has been reversed. While we have not been able to lift the size of our Saturday Point Score fleet (and this must remain one of the club's major priorities) this trend has been more than compensated by the introduction of both the Twilight and Winter Racing Series.

With the introduction of these two successful additions to our racing calendar it is evident we are more successfully catering for the needs of our members and the club has grown in both strength and stature as a result.

The racing year was capped by our success in the Daydream Shield won over the M.H.Y.C so convincingly by our club, a further example of the increasing strength and expertise of our fleet.

My sincere congratulations to Chris Oh, our Racing Secretary, Rosemary Hay, the Racing Chairman and the Racing Committee as a whole for a most successful and well conducted year.

The disaster of the strong southerly last August and its effect on the new pontoon has been successfully overcome and my thanks go to the boatshed staff and those members who assisted in moving dragging yachts to safer anchorages and in effecting short term repairs to the pontoon and in so doing avoided increased damage. Particular thanks should go to John Rickard whose negotiations with both designer and contractor ensured the successful repair of the facility with the minimum of cost to the club.

This year saw the refurbishment of the Clubhouse interior lift into top gear. We are now well along the way to completing our objectives by the January deadline and have already purchased lounge and folding chairs, tables and trestle tables, introduced a redesigned bar, installed additional lights and commenced to redecorate the interior walls.

This has been a very expensive undertaking and it is most pleasing to report a very great deal of the money required was obtained by fund raising activities of members.

Jack Earl donated a very beautiful and valuable painting as a raffle prize, members donated the cost of most of the chairs required, fund raising activities were held and my thanks go to all those who participated in this work. A particular tribute to Louise Sullivan who guided the Furniture Committee and ensured our purchases would be tasteful and suit the long established Club atmosphere.

The introduction of the Twilight Series had perhaps a greater impact on the Club than any other event in many years, not so much because of the racing, good as it was, but because of the outstanding social activity.

It was a magnificent sight each Friday night to see upwards of 100 people in the club enjoying its facilities and each other's company as they dined together after each race. I feel sure the quite dramatic increase in new membership applications is a direct result of visitors experiencing the delightful atmosphere so evident on these nights. My thanks to Rear Commodore Denis Williams whose work load was vastly increased due to these events and who ensured each night was successful.

The action by the M.S.B. to introduce fore and aft moorings has to date been successfully negotiated to the benefit of the club and those who moor in Mosman Bay. While to date no finalisation has been reached it is anticipated the club will benefit from increased moorings with the minimum inconvenience to Members mooring in the Bay.

I have been indeed fortunate to have the assistance of Vice Commodore Frank Tebbutt, Rear Commodore Denis Williams and the very valued support of Immediate Past Commodore Vic Debben. The help and assistance of these Flag Officers has done much to assist the Club reach its objectives over the past year.

My thanks also to our Treasurer Fred Bevis who has guided our finances for so many years, to Tony Saunders Chairman of our Development Committee and to John Jeremy, Bob Lawler, our Hon. Secretary Russell Peterson and Colin Bull for their work on sub-committees, assisting on the Starters Boat and the many tasks they have undertaken during the year.

To the Directors, Treasurer and Secretary, Jack Millard and the starters, Suzie Blay, Rosalie Gilbert, Nan Kartzoff, Glen Dickson, Adam Fitzgerald, Eric Ode, Jeanette Percival and all those who helped to make the club a success, this — my personal thanks.

During the course of the year Membership showed a nett increase of 12 over the previous year. The increase in Membership is a pleasing trend and given the improvements in Club facilities, it is expected that this should continue in the coming year. Members are encouraged to introduce prospective Members to the Club to help strengthen the overall financial position and to help maintaining Membership costs.

At date of writing this report, the 1986-87 figures have not been finalised, but our treasurer's estimate is for a small surplus from total revenue of some \$282,000.

In broad overview, the Club is in a sound position, able to provide at reasonable costs, the services for which it exists, to keep property in working order, to continue to improve facilities, and to see its way ahead to service and repay loan commitments — assuring that our income pattern continues.

Looking briefly at the major cost centres:-

Administration: Revenue credited was some 23% above budget and 15% over the previous year. Major increases came from Membership subscriptions and joining fees. Expenses were well contained being marginally above original budget.

**Racing:** Costs were close to budget although 31% above 1985-86. Major increases were increased depreciation provision and maintenance for the Captain Amora, postage costs and a new fee of \$14.00 for buoy maintenance.

Race entrance fees were 11% above the previous year and as in the past did not cover costs. This account has a deficit of about \$5,800. To break even, race entrance fees would have to be considerably increased, doubtless then leading to a loss of "market share".

**Boatshed:** This cost centre includes revenue from leasing of moorings, dinghy stowage spaces, lockers and from work performed on the slipways. It is a major source of income. Revenue was in line with forecast, up 16% on the previous year. Outgoings were however 9% in excess of budget, major variances being in general insurance costs, wages, repairs and maintenance and costs of materials used. This year also sees the first year with provision for depreciation of the new pontoon. Net income from Boatshed was approximately \$23,000.

**Clubhouse:** This account which is mainly after race and other social activities, was again in deficit. Social activities as such usually break even or show a profit but this account also includes costs accruing to the Club rooms and office which in the net lead to an under recovery of about \$14,000 which was close to budget.

Of special note is the refurnishing of the Club Room. The new tables, chairs, replacement refrigerator, stereo and bar improvement representing an outlay of \$21,000 being partly offset by furniture donations of \$8,550.

#### BOATSHED

Vice-Commodore - F.H.S. Tebbutt

This year has seen many improvements to our facilities in spite of our considerable outlay on the new pontoon. New rails have been installed on part of the small slipway. Irregularities have been welded up on all slipways and cross-members between the rails have been repaired. The cradles have been restored to good condition, serviceable trestles have been repaired and four new ones purchased. Both of the dinghy-shed roller doors have been replaced with new ones. A new portable pump has been purchased and is to be housed in a locker near the water-blaster for emergency use. A number of new tools have been added to the Manager's collection to improve our efficiency of operation.

With the use of the new pontoon, the Nancy K has been damaged repeatedly by ferry wash this year. Since the end of the racing season, large scale improvements to the Nancy K have begun. These include extensive engine maintenance, improved navigation lights, the improvement and strengthening of the fender around the gunwhales, and other structural improvements. Large custom-built portable fenders have also been made, and plans are afoot to further improve the "touch and go" end of the pontoon where most of the damage to the boat has occurred.

The Captain Amora is also being refurbished and by next season should be in excellent condition. Large custom-built portable fenders have also been made for this vessel to better ensure its safety when tied up alongside the pontoon.

During the year all the Club moorings have had a major service and are now in first class condition.

Following Peter Wargent, David Griffin became Boatshed Manager, and Adam Fitzgerald continued the high standard of workmanship to which Members have become accustomed. David resigned to become self-employed during April this year, and we wish him well in his new project.

We have been most fortunate to obtain the services of Glen Dickson — another shipwright/boatbuilder, to take over the Managership of the boatshed. Work is proceeding as smoothly and as expertly as before. We welcome Glen to the Club.

The net income from boatshed activities has been slightly less than in the previous year.

In conclusion I would like to thank David Griffin, Glen Dickson, Adam Fitzgerald and Eric Ode for their willing work for the Club, and also to indicate my gratitude to members of the Boatshed Committee — Tony Saunders, Bob Lawler, Max Miller and Bill Grant, whose work and advice have done so much to maintain our facilities at such a good standard for the benefit of us all.

The new tables and chairs, and the improvements to the bar area have enhanced the ambience and function of the Clubhouse itself, and for those many members who have not attended the Club for some time, I encourage you to in future join in and enjoy for yourselves these assets of the Club.

I now take this opportunity of thanking my wife Louise Sullivan, and all the other people who have put so much of their time into helping me to provide enjoyable functions for the Club. Again, I also thank Jeanette Percival and Suzie Blay who provided their assistance throughout the year.

## **DEVELOPMENT REPORT**

Sub-Committee: Tony Saunders and John Rickard.

Our activities during the year have been as follows:

1. Minor modifications were required to the new service wharf. A different type of compound material was installed between the pontoons and weights underneath were added to dampen the hingeing effect. These modifications appear to have been successful and our thanks to John Rickard for the completion of the project.

2. A Club Yacht Broker was appointed with the object being to obtain extra income for the Club. In the same vein, advertising was initiated in the rear of the Club News which added to our revenue.

3. The current major project is the conversion of swing moorings to the fore-and-aft system in the North-West corner of Mosman Bay next to Old Cremorne Wharf. This will enable us to expand our mooring provision to members and is in line with the current requirements of Maritime Services Board policy. We are hoping to at least double the amount of yachts which can be moored in our current lease area — subject to the approval of the local M.S.B. Officer. Negotiations are now under way with mooring contractors.

## NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

## 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of the club's accounts. Unless otherwise stated such accounting policies were also adopted in the preceding year.

- (a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and do not take into account changing money values, except to the extent to which they are reflected in the revaluation of certain assets.
- (b) Bank Overdraft: Cheques drawn and not presented at the club's bank at 31st May are classified as creditors.
- (c) Depreciation and amortisation of fixed assets: Fixed assets are being depreciated or amortised on the straight line method by sufficient charges to write off the costs of the assets over their expected useful lives.
- (d) Stock on hand:
  Stock on hand has been valued on a first in, first out basis at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
- (e) Income tax: No provision for income tax is necessary as the club is exempt from taxation by virtue of the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.
- (f) Financial reporting by segments: The club operates predominantly in one industry the promotion of amateur sailing, and in one geographical area — Sydney.

#### (g) Accounts disclosure: These accounts comply with the requirements of Schedule 7 of the Companies regulations in force as at 30th September, 1986.
