## COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 1988-89

It is with great pleasure, I present the 117th Annual Report of the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club.

This year has been, for the Club, a year of consolidation rather than innovation in that our major areas of expenditure have been in the maintenance and refurbishment of existing Club assets.

Already completed are the extensive repairs to the tender "Nancy K" and an almost complete rebuilding of the No. 1 slipway.

Partially completed is the extensive refurbishment of the starters boat "Captain Amora" where all external paintwork was removed, damage and deterioration to all woodwork repaired and the cabin area totally remodelled to include a stove, water, sink, improved toilet facilities and new wiring and switch board.

While the cost of the repairs to these three vital club assets has been considerable (\$35,000) all were well overdue and necessary to the smooth running of the Club in the future.

Over and above these activities the Board has approved the expenditure of \$60,000 to totally rebuild the No. 2 and 3 slipway and replace the existing dinghy shed roof. Further plans will be approved by the Board for refurbishing the mens toilet and change room with the installation of extra basins, new floor and ceiling and an improved hot water system for the shower.

With the completion of these projects the Club will once again be able to turn its attention to the introduction of new facilities to improve the enjoyment and convenience of members. It is however, with our lease due to expire in just a few short years, most necessary that our existing Club facilities be kept in near perfect condition as an assistance to us in negotiating a new lease of this valuable piece of foreshore.

In the racing sphere, our winter and twilight series continue to be outstandingly successful but this success continues to be eroded by a reducing Point Score Fleet.

Every effort is being made and will continue to be made by the Club to improve our level of professionalism in conducting our racing and the introduction of our new racing book is the beginning of this drive. I would however, ask for the assistance of all members to support our racing fleets both personally and by influencing others to join with us in our pointscore, winter and twilight races.

The boatshed has undergone a period of instability this year with the resignations of two Boatshed Managers and we are at present looking for a replacement. I trust we will find in the near future a stable and competent Manager from applications being received.

In the Clubhouse we have continued to enjoy many successful social functions with the post-twilight bar-b-cues continuing to be outstandingly popular and are possibly a major factor in maintaining our level of new membership applications.

To the many many crews who have volunteered to assist on these nights, my sincere thanks. Without your assistance it would have been impossible to maintain the high standard of these nights.

As this is my final report as Commodore, it would be impossible not to look back on the past three years, with pride at the Clubs achievements, with regret regarding those plans which did not come to fruition and with gratitude to those many members who assisted me over this period. My sincere thanks to immediate Past Commodore, Vic Dibben who has assisted me greatly during the past three years, Treasurer Fred Bevis who was always able to find the money, Bill Mountford for his constant efforts as Chairman of the Racing Committee, Vice Commodore Bob Lawler for his hard physical work on the slipways and work boats, Rear Commodore John Morris and his wife Lil, for their unstinting efforts in the Club House, Colin Bull for his efficiency as Secretary. Tony Saunders for his work on development and all Directors for their help and their individual efforts to move the Club forward.

My hearty thanks to Bob Skinner and all crew on the Starters Boat, Faye Buckley for her very hard work in the office, Denise Macintosh for her great effort as Racing Secretary, Phil McWilliam and Keith Radford for their efforts in the constant bad weather to maintain boatshed profitability, Jeanette Purcival for the great service she offers from behind the bar and to my wife Kate who during my 7 years as a Flag Officer has worked very hard for the Club and given me all the support I could possibly hope for.

Finally I must thank the members for giving me the honour of appointment as Club Commodore.

It has been a privilege to work for such a club and I look forward to continuing to make a contribution to the progress of the Club in future years.

### FINANCE:

**Overview:** Total receipts for the year 1988/89 at \$317,878 were in line with forecast but total expenditure was some 3% above forecast, leaving a small trading surplus of only \$4,826.

Although the Club is holding comfortable reserves the accounts reveal some underlying trends that are cause for concern. We are also about to face up to major maintenance work on the large slipway, the dinghy shed roof, the water service, upgrading of the men's washroom and a slip-way cradle. These projects will call for careful money management over the next year or two. For convenience our accounts are divided into four major cost centres and comments on the highlights follow:

**Administration:** Gross revenue in this account was a little better than forecast up 6% on the previous year. Joining fees fell from \$9,900 to \$6,500 fortunately being offset by increased subscriptions and interest. Most outgoings were in line with expectation except for repairs, salaries and sundries which were higher than expected because of staff changes and advertising costs. The net result was a surplus of \$3,465.

**Racing:** Historically this has been a loss area and continues to be so. While most out-payments were close to budget, R & M for the starter's boat and relevant salaries were well up on both budget and the previous year. These variances combined with a fall in race entry fees from \$17,078 to \$14,633 resulted in a deficit in this account of \$11,371 compared to \$928 the previous year. This trend can only be regarded as serious.

**Boatshed:** This is a net revenue producing account and has again given a surplus of \$21,162, 12% of gross receipts compared to 9% last year. Closer examination of some elements of this cost centre however indicates areas of concern. Increased moorings and mooring fees account for \$9,645 of the surplus and increased hiring out of the slips, \$5,845. Of concern is the dollar

value of labour hours sold, 14.5% less than the previous year, and because of wage increases, the manhours sold in real terms is 23.6% down. Taken together the above figures tell us that the boatyard is not trading well.

Hopefully after the large slip-way has been rejuvenated and can accommodate the larger boats now in our register, we may recover business that is now going elsewhere. It must be acknowledged in reviewing this cost centre that the \$16,400 cost of overhauling the small slip-way has been fully absorbed in this year.

**Clubhouse:** This cost centre bears the costs of running the clubhouse and its maintenance and thus is historically another loss account. Revenues and expenditures were generally in line with budget except for insurance and repairs. Direct comparison with the previous year is distorted by the effects of the Gaffer's Day event.

## **BOATSHED:**

### **Vice Commodore's Report:**

Following from last year the Boatshed Committee and Staff have continued with the task of maintenance and upgrading of the Club's equipment.

Pontoon modifications have proved generally successful although continual maintenance is required. With the addition of mooring points off the pontoon the utilization of the pontoon facility has increased dramatically and has enabled more members who do not occupy moorings in Mosman Bay to enjoy the Club's facilities.

The fore and aft moorings remain the subject of controversy among Sydney's boating fraternity, however, the SASC experience is that some maintenance problems have been encountered but the system is generally satisfactory for small and medium sized yachts in the top end of Mosman Bay.

Last years two major projects have been completed successfully resulting in very sound No. 1 Slipway and a transformed Captain Amora. Thanks to members' generosity with volunteer labour and equipment resources cost of these works has been contained. The current major project is the re-building of the Club's No. 2 Slipway which will allow safe slipping of boats up to 10 tonnes. The board has approved a project budget on the basis that members will assist with design procurement and prefabrication of steel work and demolition piling and steel placement will be carried out by contract.

Again this year I take this opportunity of thanking Members of the Boatshed Committee and members who have been so generous with their time and resources in participating in the Club's maintenance projects.

To Keith Radford, Phil McWilliam and Eric Ode I wish to record my appreciation for jobs well done.

## RACING

The end of the 1988/89 racing season is almost here with only two more races to run in the Winter series.

This season was not as successful for the Amateur's fleet as in previous years. Spring and Summer pointscore entries were about 15% lower even after making allowances for the ½ ton division racing with the Royals.



The Winter series has continued to grow and the Twilight fleet goes from strength to strength showing its increasing popularity as the perfect way to end a stressful working week.

Special events this year included the second Hong Kong/Sydney Interport between members of the S80 Association of NSW and the Impala Association Hong Kong. This was a return bout following the visit of the S80's to Hong Kong last year. It was a two day event in perfect sailing weather; day one match racing and day two a teams event. The locals won and the magnificent trophy (rapidly becoming a tradition) was entrusted to the care of the SASC and now resides in the trophy cabinet. As well as sailing hard the visitors all played hard and the social events were memorable with local knowledge of the nightlife proving as important as local knowledge of the water. The challenge has been issued for next year and the S80 Association will be defending the trophy in Hong Kong.

The SASC were hosts again this year for the Cavalier 28 State Championship which took place over two weekends in March. The conditions were excellent and varied delivering everything from drifting westerlies to brisk nor'easters. Good close sailing prevailed during the Championships and extra special skills were displayed as the fleet drifted their way through the one hundred & fifty or so boats lining up for the start of the annual Sail for Cancer.

A special thank you is extended to Peter Garrow, John Jeremy, Charles Maclurcan, Peter Gray, Peter Pangas, and my wife, Helen, who crewed the committee vessels for these events.

Both Nominated Skippers and Ladies Days maintained their numbers on last year and a number of ladies have requested an extras division for next year. Idle Hour was, as usual, successful both from a sailing point of view and from a social one.

Having forgotten their drenching on the previous Easter, some sixteen yachts made their way to Coasters Retreat competing for this year's Bob Brown Trophy. The weather was magnificent and held out till the evening of Good Friday, then, true to form, deteriorated for the rest of the weekend.

Thank you to Mike Van der Helder and Ian McDonald for finishing Idle Hour and the Bob Brown Trophy.

As you are all probably aware, the Club's Honorary Starter, Jack Millard, has been recovering from illness for most of this season, Bob Skinner volunteered at the start of the year to act as starter in Jack's absence, expecting the stand in time to be short. The starter's job is probably the most difficult, most visible and most criticised (except for the handicapper) of all those of the race committee. Bob took this on with little experience and the learning curve was steep. Thank you Bob Skinner and your crew, Ted Williams, Marcia Hatfield and Alex.

The Twilight series is increasing in popularity and the success is in no doubt due, in the main, to the social atmosphere of the race and the post race festivities. Thank you to Peter Garrow and Vic Dibben for crewing the "Captain Amora", thank you to Lil and John Morris for management of the social activities and a special thank you to all the volunteer crews, without whom those balmy summer Friday nights would not be the same.

Congratulations are in order for all competitors, i.e. owners, skippers and crew for your participation in the Amateurs racing calendar, building on our strengths and helping to ensure the continuance of Sydney Amateur's fine traditions.

A final thank you must go to the Race Committee, especially Denise Macintosh, without whose help chaos would have reigned, Geoff McCorquodale (Chairman of the Protest Committee), Peter Pangas (Race Secretary), Tony Barry (Safety Officer), and all division representatives.

### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of the club's accounts. Unless otherwise stated such accounting policies were also adopted in the preceding year.

- (a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and do not take into account changing money values, except to the extent to which they are reflected in the revaluation of certain assets.
- (b) Depreciation and amortisation of fixed assets:  
Fixed assets are being depreciated or amortised on the straight line method by sufficient charges to write off the costs of the assets over their expected useful lives.
- (c) Stock on hand:  
Stock on hand has been valued on a first in, first out basis at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
- (d) Income tax:  
No provision for income tax is necessary as the club is exempt from taxation by virtue of the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.
- (e) Financial reporting by segments:  
The club operates predominantly in one industry—the promotion of amateur sailing, and in one geographical area—Sydney.
