## COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 1989-90

It is indeed my privilege to present the 118th Annual Report of the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club.

The past year has been a difficult one, given the current economic climate and the general decline in Racing Fleets throughout all of the Sydney Clubs. However, due to the timeless efforts of Bill Gale, resulting in the addition of the two divisions of Traditional Yachts, our Racing Fleet's numbers and the inflow of New Members has been retained. The success of these two new divisions is a wonderful example of what can be done when members apply their efforts to promote sailing for the benefit of all Club members, the tradition of the sport and the Club. I am sure that Bill will keep up his magnificent work, but I must take this opportunity of exhorting all members to assist in keeping our Club viable by being prepared to assist our Racing Committee in assuming some part of the workload where appropriate.

While the Club's Saturday Racing Fleet, except for the Traditional Division, has continued to decline, strong interest in Friday Summer Twilight, Winter Events, Long Offshore Events, JOG and S80 Interport Events has provided both social and highly competitive racing for Club members with varying interests. Those variations in interests serve as a warning that the Club must remain flexible and provide events to keep members keen and interested.

This year we managed to regain possession of the Day Dream Shield from Middle Harbour Yacht Club, thanks largely to a great performance by our S80 Yachts. I am sure that SASC can retain the Shield next year, but we will need to be prepared with more yachts in top condition with keen crews ready for some stiff competition. As with all competitive sports the more effort a team can make, the greater the reward which results, so let us be ready for next season's challenge and enjoy the benefits.

Once again, repairs and maintenance have taken up a good deal of the Club's finances and volunteer labour resources, but we do have results. The rebuilding of the Club's No. 2 Slipway plus the new Slip Cradle which has just been put into operation, make slipping of modern and larger yachts possible and introduce a much improved margin of safety. I wish to express my appreciation to the many members who assisted with these two projects and who made it possible to contain costs to an affordable level.

Next year there will be many opportunities for members to participate in maintenance and Club clean-up programmes, and I trust that our traditional spirit of self help will continue.

To our Starters and Race Organisers, I wish to express my appreciation of your consistent efforts and most professional execution of race control procedures.

I now seek to record my appreciation of the work done by my fellow Flag Officers, Club Directors and Club Staff for the support they have given to me as Club Commodore, and the way they all have carried out their particular duties. Special recognition is due to Faye Buckley, our Executive Secretary, who has established new levels of efficiency in dealing with an ever increasing workload. Thank you Faye for a difficult job well done.

### FINANCE:

**Overview:** Although revenue increased significantly by 21.5% to \$386,999 the Club returned a loss of \$9,001 for the 1989/90 year due mainly to planned major maintenance works on the slipway, its cradle, and replacing the roof over the dinghy shed.

The operating results reflect effective management of resources and significant support from members to maintain a high standard of the Club's facilities in the most cost effective way.

Current economic trends will demand conservative expenditure on major projects being considered for the next few years. These are, and include some carried forward from this year: upgrading the men's washroom, major maintenance to the decking structure around the Club, and introduction of a new tender/rescue boat.

The following comments summarise our four major cost centres:

**Administration:** The increase in subscriptions was due mainly to the introduction of Traditional Division racing and increased interest from higher interest rates and increased deposits during the year. Sundry income includes new commissions from brokers and sponsors. Expenses were very much in line with budget.

**Racing:** Increased income from entrance fees resulted from increased charges and the establishment of Traditional Divisions. Some expenditure has increased in line with the new Divisions whilst salaries have increased with the employment of a part-time Race Secretary. The new race program costs were also included in this year's accounts.

Our concern continues to exist with the reduced size of fleets and its effect on the operations of the Club.

**Boatshed:** A 14.8% increase of mooring fees resulted from an increase in the length of boats on Club moorings and more efficient use of dinghy spaces.

Shipwright sales increased by 23.5% to a very pleasing \$120,846. This result was achieved notwithstanding major slipway and cradle maintenance that cost over \$50,000 and was included in the boatshed net deficit of \$11,973.

In the coming year, with stable staffing now expected and the completion of these major maintenance works, further gains should be achievable.

The effect of proposed M.S.B. mooring fee increases to all recreational boaters is also being monitored.

**Clubhouse:** This cost centre bears the costs of running the clubhouse and its maintenance and thus is historically another loss account. Direct comparison with the previous year is distorted as revenue and expenditure accounting has altered. This has not affected the improved net result of this operation.

## **BOATSHED:**

### **Vice-Commodore's Report:**

This year has seen the completion of the slipway upgrading programme which included the complete rebuilding of the No. 2 slipway and reinstatement of its 10 tonne capacity. The recently completed cradle provided safe slipping for yachts up to twelve feet in beam and features winches and lifting slings for fore and aft stability.

Slipway equipment has been upgraded to include a 28 cfm compressor spray painting equipment and a pneumatic disc sander with water service attachment to provide wet sanding capability.

These improved facilities have already improved productivity and will continue to do so throughout the coming years.

Both the Nancy K and Captain Amora have provided very reliable service throughout the year which is a direct result of continued good maintenance. Continued improvements have been made to Captain Amora including the addition of VHF radio with direct dialing telephone facility.

Income from the Boatshed has improved significantly this year due to the efforts of Phil McWilliam and Fergus Leahy. Congratulations and thanks to Phil and Fergus. Thanks also to Jack Smith who has worked on a part-time basis on clubhouse, pontoon and equipment maintenance.

Special thanks are due to Eric Ode for his continued dedication to club duties and personal assistance to members with Sunday tender operations.

Thanks and appreciation is also extended to Faye Buckley for her commitments to the club's welfare and rationalisation of the boatshed management with the club's accounting system.

1990/91 will again be a busy year improving and maintaining the club's valuable assets. I look forward to assisting members during this—our 118 year of racing at the S.A.S.C.

## **DEVELOPMENT**

With a continuing financial commitment to maintenance of the boatshed and slipways during 1989/90, a range of future development options for the forthcoming five years were prepared for consideration by the Board.

Proposals which maintain the high quality of the Club's facilities in order to ensure the Club continues to present an image in keeping with its Mosman Bay surroundings are given a higher priority than more extreme development options. This is considered particularly important in view of the need in coming years to consider the renewal of the Lands Department Lease which expires in December 2000.

In keeping with this plan, major repairs to the structure of the wharf are planned for early in 1990/91, to restore it to near its original condition for a further life of at least ten years. At the same time, two modifications are proposed.

The steps at the south end of the wharf are rarely used by members, not least due to the proximity of a rock shelf. An additional pile, fendering and access are planned to make the steps more usable.

It is also intended to fill the gap in the wharf decking next to the slipways to increase deck area, and to provide space for the stowage of an additional tender/rescue boat. To handle the boat a small crane will be fitted. It is planned to use this boat to provide additional tender services during summer months, particularly to the Mosman Bay wharf, in an effort to encourage members and their guests to park in the public parking areas at the head of the bay, reducing the parking load in the streets near the Club.

Detailed plans have been submitted to the Maritime Services Board for approval. Whilst time is tight, it is hoped that the work might be complete for the 1990/91 sailing season.

## RACING

This season was a season of change for the "Amateurs" fleet. It was a season of progress and was extremely successful in most areas but disappointing in a few.

Our established Spring/Summer pointscore fleet continues to follow the decline that is the general experience of most major Sydney Harbour clubs. This year saw Divisions 1, 2 and 3 combine to form two divisions due to declining numbers.

We were also unfortunate this year in losing the Cavalier 28 fleet to the R.S.Y.S. However we have been advised that they will return to race with the Club next season. This year's loss was however, partially offset by the ½ tonners sailing with the "Amateurs". The ½ ton fleet continues to grow from strength to strength and is proving to be one of the most competitive on the harbour. An increasing number of S.A.S.C. yachts are racing offshore and the Offshore Division continues to grow.

The great success of the season was the introduction of the "Traditional" yachts racing with the "Amateurs". The "Traditionals" were the "brainchild" of Bill Gale and his exceptional dedication, hardwork and perseverance resulted in two divisions of long keeled yachts racing regularly each Saturday. The final numbers were 12 yachts in Traditional 1 Division and 21 yachts in Traditional 2. I am sure this success will continue and congratulations must be extended to Bill for his hard work and foresight.

Both the Winter and Twilight series continue to be popular. This year we have seen yachts new to the Amateurs racing scene and the largest Twilight racing fleet yet, with around 80 entries and 30 yachts starting regularly.

The Club hosted the S80 State Championships this year which comprised six races held over three days. The event was extremely successful and saw a large fleet with yachts from as far afield as Lake Macquarie.



Another special event of the season was the hosting of the J.O.G. Diamond Bowl ladies race. This is the first time S.A.S.C. has hosted the J.O.G. and the event proved to be a success. The race was run as a full extras race in blustery, southerly conditions on a course which would test most racing sailors. The J.O.G. ladies were highly competitive and displayed excellent sailing skills. We have been requested to run the series next season.

Nominated Skippers and the S.A.S.C. Ladies' Days, however, were not as successful this year as previously. There was little response to the running of an "extras" division for Ladies' Day this year. Next year we will continue to offer the "extras" option in the hope that the Amateurs ladies can show the J.O.G. ladies a thing or two.

A return bout of the Hong Kong/Sydney interport between the S80 Association and the Impala Association was held this year in Hong Kong. Sydney Amateurs intrepid crew fought long and hard to defend the trophy only to lose it to the Hong Kong team in the final race. Well done; and we look forward to the visit of the Hong Kong team next year and the return of the trophy to the S.A.S.C. cabinet.

The starting crew grew in strength this year under the guidance of Bob Skinner and Vic Dibben and our thanks is extended to them and their crew. On a sad note, we have to report the passing of Ted Williams who died in May this year. Ted had been a long standing member of the start crew and will be sadly missed.

"Thank you's" are also extended to Peter Garrow, John Jeremy, Charles Maclurcan, Peter Pangas and the Anstee family for helping with the organisation and the crewing of committee vessels for our special events and the Twilight series. Also, on the subject of thanks, this report would be incomplete if mention was not made of the volunteer crews who help man the Twilight social activities. These volunteers are a critical part of the series success. Thank you and let's build on it next season.

Finally thanks again to the race committee and especially to Denise Macintosh whose organisational abilities held the show together.

Looking forward to an excellent 1990/91 season.

### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of the club's accounts. Unless otherwise stated such accounting policies were also adopted in the preceding year.

- (a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and do not take into account changing money values, except to the extent to which they are reflected in the revaluation of certain assets.
- (b) Depreciation and amortisation of fixed assets:  
Fixed assets are being depreciated or amortised on the straight line method by sufficient charges to write off the costs of the assets over their expected useful lives.
- (c) Stock on hand:  
Stock on hand has been valued on a first in, first out basis at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
- (d) Income tax:  
No provision for income tax is necessary as the club is exempt from taxation by virtue of the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.
- (e) Financial reporting by segments:  
The club operates predominantly in one industry—the promotion of amateur sailing, and in one geographical area—Sydney.
