COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 1990-91

In my report last year I made the comment that that year had been a difficult one given the economic climate of the time completely without expectation of a continued and steeper decline in the economic climate. Having survived the year 1990-91 I am pleased to report that life at the SASC has not been difficult thanks to the support of the Club staff, Flag Officers and those Club members who have done so much for the Club over many years.

The operation of the Club's traditional yacht racing division has been a continued success story thanks again to the efforts of the likes of Bill Gale and Bill Merrington.

The S80 Division, although not over-endowed with numbers, has been an example to others by continuing to display enterprise in hosting and winning the Hong Kong Interport Series and promoting very competitive and enjoyable sailing. The prime movers of this division are to be congratulated.

Our offshore yachts have again performed well and have been a credit to SASC in winning places in Sydney-Hobart, Sydney-Gold Coast and CYCA Season Pointscores. Particular thanks are due to our offshore yachts for providing the opportunity to many SASC members to participate in major national events.

While numbers have been down in several of our divisions the performance of our seventeen yachts in retaining the Daydream Shield indicates that we must be doing something correctly. The effort of so many members with the Daydream Challenge was matched only by the 16-1 winning result and the sense of achievement which followed. Congratulations once again to our SASC representative team and let's be ready for next year.

Achievements in maintaining Club facilities have again been significant this year. The repairs and wharf extension, the acquisition and commissioning of the Club's new tender/rescue vessel have been effected without incurring any debt thanks to careful money management by the Club Treasurer, to the volunteer work carried out by members and to equipment donated by members. Particular thanks are due to Jim Lawler (Young Jim), who negotiated the purchase of the new tender and was responsible for the fitout.

During the past year the boatshed operations have reaped the benefit of slipway upgrading. The Club staff have made the most of those facilities and significantly increased the profitability of these operations. Thanks to Phil, Bernard, Bob and Jack for jobs well done.

Once again our Race Starter, Race Committee and race organizers have done a magnificent job in providing consistent race management of the highest standard. In order to promote racing and to maintain standards there is however a need for more members to play an active part as divisional representatives, assistant divisional representatives, safety officers, protest committee members and special event officers. I can only exhort members to volunteer services, to respond to requests for assistance and not leave the work to a few and so make their work load a burden.

On the social scene, thanks to Rear Commodore Charles Maclurcan, Jeanette Purcival and Heather McWilliams for looking after our Friday Twilight suppers, Saturday afternoon refreshments and all those special events.

To my fellow Flag Officers I wish to record my appreciation of your support.

Special thanks are due to our Club Treasurer and Finance Chief Fred Bevis who has managed our affairs so professionally in these difficult times.

Finally I wish to record my appreciation to Faye Buckley and Denise Macintosh for the work they have performed in running the Club office, accounts and race management. The outstanding performance of our office staff has made the task of the Club's Flag Officers and Committee Members so much more manageable and certainly more pleasant — thank you Faye and Denise.

FINANCE

Overview: Revenue increased by 10.0% to \$427,321 and the Club returned a surplus of \$15,770 after expending over \$40,000 on the renovation of the wharf. Total expenditure, including the wharf renovations, rose by only 3.7% to \$411,551.

A pleasing aspect of this year's result was the improvement in slip operations which has handled an increased volume of work while containing operating costs.

The major capital expenditure item was the purchase of the tender/rescue boat costing \$14,649.

The decline in membership numbers is a disturbing trend. The current economic conditions have contributed to the decline but the underlying trend needs to be addressed. The reduction in junior membership fees and extended payment of the joining fee may help increase membership numbers but a more active promotion of our racing fixtures and the first class facilities offered by the Club would help.

Modest increases in boatshed charges and membership fees have been set for next year. Those increases, along with tight control of expenditure, should

return a surplus. Major projects for next year, estimated to cost \$50,000, are the renovation of the men's washroom and the renewal of the wharf deck. This expenditure can be funded from reserves and current cash flow.

The following comments summarise our four major cost centres:

Administration: Membership fees rose slightly because of fee increases however the membership numbers declined. Revenue in total rose by 2.6%. Expenditure was maintained at the same level as last year resulting in an overall surplus of \$25,140 compared with last year's \$22,686.

Racing: Race entrant numbers and fees declined. Entrance fees this year were \$16,928 compared with \$17,926 last year. Expenditure rose by 3.7% to \$31,454 to return a loss of \$14,526.

Boatshed: Income this year was \$257,678 compared with \$211,412 last year. Expenditure was contained and the surplus for the year was \$26,702. As stated earlier the result is very pleasing and the efforts of the Boatshed staff are to be commended, in particular Phil McWilliams.

Clubhouse: Receipts for the year declined by \$5,000 to \$55,242. Expenditure increased by \$7,000 to \$84,560. Expenditure this year included the net cost of conducting Gaffers Day of \$1,454. Although receipts from social functions were lower they still provided a surplus for the year of \$10,000.

I would like to thank Faye Buckley for efficiently looking after the day to day accounting and administration work. She has also contributed significantly in helping to contain costs and at the same time happily dealing with members' needs.

BOATSHED

Vice-Commodore's Report

The 1990-91 year proved to be extremely busy for our Boatshed staff; the workload was high and carried out with very few hiccups during the year.

The Club and Club members have benefited I believe from the good stable management shown by Phil McWilliams, and the backup given to him from his supporting staff, Bernard Connellan and Jack Smith. Boatshed revenue is up on forecast this year and we thank Members for support throughout the year in this department.

The clubhouse is currently looking a lot smarter and many thanks to Jack Smith who, working part time, has repainted the timber exterior, plus windows.

Both the Nancy K and Captain Amora again gave very reliable service this year and are a credit to the preventive maintenance given over the season by our Boatshed staff. The Nancy K which basically works 7 days a week, as either a work boat during the week and a tender at weekends, is currently undergoing a winter refit at the time of writing this report. The engine will be overhauled, and any hull damage repaired and repainted prior to going back into service and will be ready for the new season. The Club's new fast tender is carrying out normal tender service during this refit.

A special thanks to the 25 volunteer Club members who turned up and helped clean up the Club, dinghy shed, slipway and surrounding garden area, over

a two day weekend during Spring last year. The results of this work are still obvious (we filled a 12 ton mast skiff that weekend).

All the club moorings were again routinely serviced during May/June and are back in top condition.

Again, because of attention to detail very few problems were experienced with club moorings during the past year.

We said farewell to Eric Ode who retired during the current year. Eric worked hard and diligently for the Club and members during his service with SASC.

Bob Omond who has taken over from Eric has the job well in hand, and the results of his good work can be seen throughout the clubhouse and outside lawn and garden area.

The 1991-92 year will again bring lots of activities for the boatshed crew with planned maintenance on equipment and building scheduled well into the new club year.

The Board has approved expenditure for the replanking of 125m² of wharf deck planking and during our Winter will call for volunteers to form a one day working bee to renew damaged timber.

DEVELOPMENT

During the year, work was completed on major repairs and extensions to the Club wharf. The deck area was increased, and additional space for boats to secure alongside provided by the additional pile and fendering at the southern end. An additional tender/rescue boat was purchased to provide additional tender services during the summer season, and assistance for special events. On 25 May, 1991 the new boat was named W. J. (Jack) Millard to honour the memory of the Club's long serving starter.

In keeping with the plan to ensure the continued high quality of the Club's facilities, work in 1991/92 will concentrate on maintenance items, rather than major improvements. The timber decking on the wharf will be replaced, and a refurbishment plan for the Men's amenities has been approved for completion during the coming year.

Rigorous stocktaking and accounting procedures nailed losses on bar and kitchen items and a pleasing financial balance resulted, on most occasions.

A number of special events were conducted and I am grateful for those that contributed volunteer labour.

The Season opened with an enjoyable dinner. A spit roast on the wharf ensured a satisfactory main course and Mrs. Lawler provided a delicious fruit salad dessert. My wife made chocolates to accompany coffee and the Anstee family served and cleaned up.

Sponsorship for the National Gaffer's Regatta meant that the Event required far greater input than before. The official vessels were fed by outside caterers and in the meantime, a band of volunteers ensured that drinks and eats were available at the Club for those requiring them. My particular thanks to the Tomaszewski family and its wonderful twin girls, who, suitably costumed for the occasion, persuaded even the most sober participant to indulge in a little Mount Gay Rum and tonic!

Refreshments were provided on Store Beach, once again, for members after the Idle Hour Trophy Race in November. I am indebted to the well connected Commodore and his men from the Manly Rugby Club for the beer on tap and the accurate and appropriately profitable accounting procedures duly employed.

Twilight racing continued on Fridays during daylight saving. The rather onerous task of feeding and watering an indeterminate number of members and their friends, each night, stretched our volunteer crews to the limit. Thank you to everyone who helped, and to Lil and John Morris for keeping an eye on proceedings. The continuing success of this activity relies on a steady stream of volunteers and a fairly reasonable attitude from consumers of the service provided. We are not in a position to have the functions professionally arranged.

From time to time, sausage sizzles have been held as requested, and typical of these was the Daydream Shield Race Day. A very short time after the crews and visitors returned to the Club they were able to eat and have a beer. All this occurred with a minimum of fuss and drama, thanks to the boys from Firetel and others.

So, another year has passed and I am proud to say that the Amateurs still engenders praise from the members of other Yacht Clubs as it hangs on to fast disappearing traditions. The particular atmosphere they appreciate really hinges around members attitudes with regard helping out. This last year proves that the spirit continues.

RACING

We are at the end of yet another racing season which has been a good season for the "Amateurs" fleet.

This season has seen our racing fleet remain constant in size from the previous year and we have seen quite a number of new members racing their yachts. This is particularly encouraging when most other clubs continue to see their racing fleet reduce and when we are in the middle of probably the worst economic recession since the thirties.

We were particularly pleased to welcome the Cavalier 28 Association back to racing with the SASC and we look forward to seeing them again next season.

Most of you will have noticed that we still have the "Daydream Shield" occupying its rightful place on our clubhouse wall. SASC yachtsmen displayed superb sailing skills in beating the MHYC team by 16 races to 1. Well done all competitors and especially to Peter Pangas who did a tremendous job in the events organisation.

Some of you, however, may not have noticed Hong Kong/Sydney Interport Trophy back in the SASC trophy cabinet. The Hong Kong Impala Association visted Sydney this year to compete with the S80 Association in the SASC hosted Interport. The S80's won, another tremendous job done.

Throughout the year, the Race Committee continued its policy of staying close to the racing yachtsmen and taking notice of the majority wishes. A well attended skipper's meeting was held in late season to discuss a number of issues relating to next season's racing. There were some excellent suggestions which will be actioned for next year's program. It is the Race Committee's intention to strengthen our racing fleet by developing race programs which suit the majority of our members. The mechanism for doing this will be to continue to get closer to our divisional representatives and to hold regular skipper meetings.

On a sadder note, it is with regret that we report the death of Jack Millard. Jack was the SASC Honorary Starter for 30 years and had worked in an advisory capacity these last two seasons. He provided great strength to the starting crew and will be sadly missed. The Club has christened our new tender, the "W. J. (Jack) MILLARD" in his honour.

I would like to thank all the starting crew for their hard work in all manner of conditions, the volunteer crews for the Twilight evenings (getting bigger each year), all the members of the Race Committee, especially Peter Pangas and Paul Brown (who did an excellent job of chairing the skipper's meeting in my absence).

Having completed three years as Racing Chairman and given the pressures of everyday work, I have decided not to run again this year. I would like to thank everyone for their support over the past three years, especially Denise Macintosh whose help has been enormous. It is sad that she will not be with us next season as the Macintosh family are returning to Singapore. Good luck Denise and Ian and thank you.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of the Club's accounts. Unless otherwise stated such accounting policies were also adopted in the preceding year.
