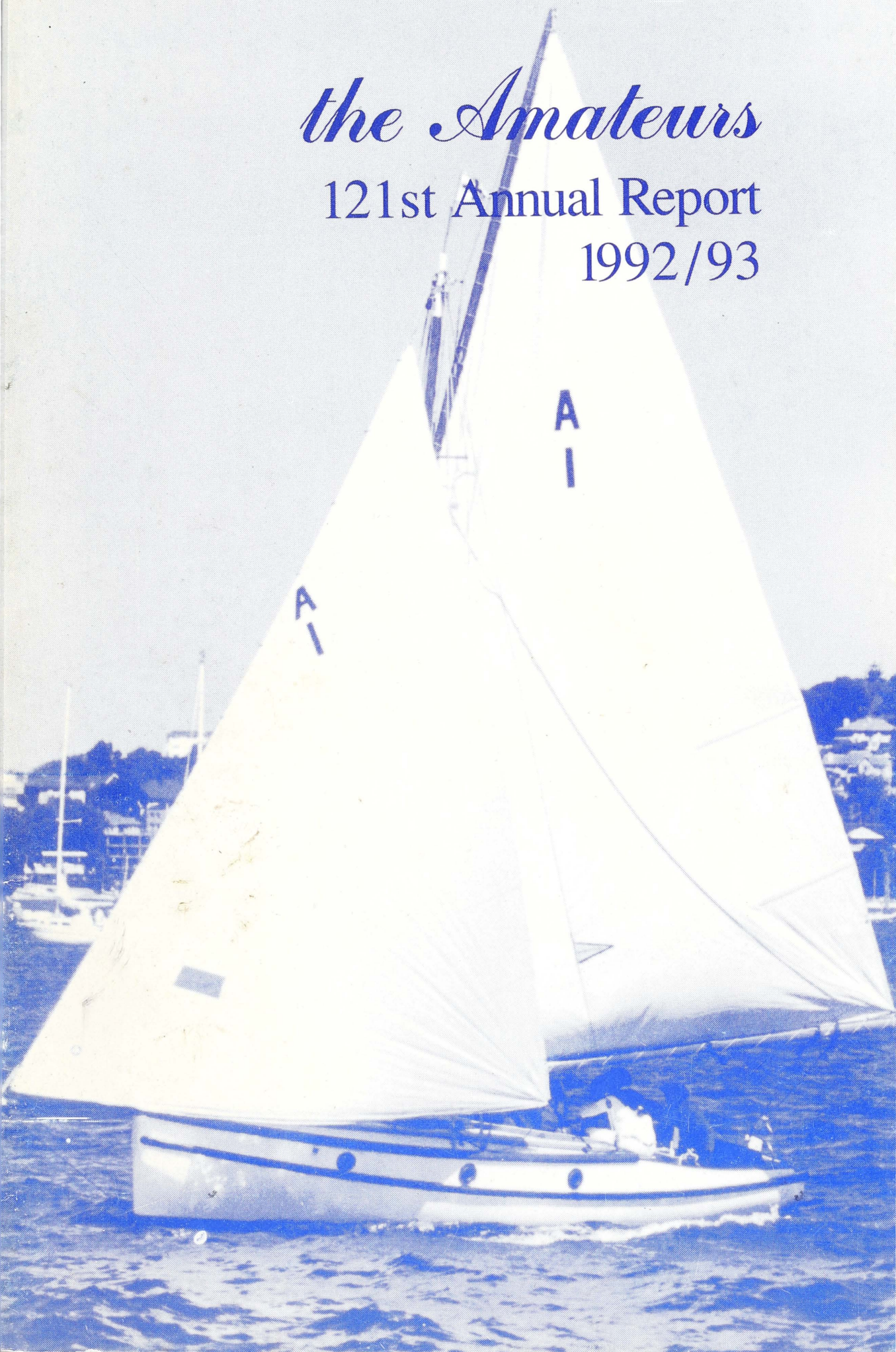

COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 1992-93

It is with some pride that I carry on the tradition and present the S.A.S.C. 1993 Annual Report, our 121st year.

As we close the current year I am able to report that all departments have made excellent progress throughout the year. Our forward prospects and planning look positive, particularly for club racing, inhouse, and slipway activities.

In all, our financial year will show a modest surplus, and is the direct result of sound financial control and diligent management from our department heads.

It was a year of financial consolidation, with major expenses invested in the repair of the pontoon and the re-powering and fitout of the Nancy K.

Club Racing

The club's major activities are always associated with club racing. This year was no exception and we congratulate our racing committee and starters for their professionalism.

Philip Brown, Racing Chairman, together with Paul Foster, Racing Secretary, and working with our division representatives have formulated a strategic plan for our 1993/94 racing calendar. This energetic team will ensure club racing stays high on club priorities.

The club's high racing safety standards were maintained throughout the season and we thank Tony Barry, also his team, for their efforts.

Boatshed/Slipway

Tony Saunders has worked enthusiastically over the year to promote and raise the level of management efficiencies, together with Phil McWilliams, several new ideas have been formulated to improve our service to members. Our current slipway survey is also working to this goal.

In house chargeable hours has fallen this year, lowering the total expected boatshed earnings. This has largely been offset with reduction in casual labour, minimising any possible loss.

House Committee

The social activities of the club has certainly been enhanced with the tremendous effort from Ross Munn this year.

Our twilight socials impose greater responsibilities on the modern Rear Commodore, so I not only congratulate Ross on a job well done on behalf of the members but also thank the many volunteers who have assisted him during the year, thus enabling our clubhouse socials to contribute positively to the club's welfare.

Finance

The club's financial and future success is proportional to its membership base, also members involvement and support of club facilities is essential.

The club (its members) for example have paid for our shipyard facilities and this represents a considerable cash outlay. Currently this club asset is well under utilised while many club yachts are slipped elsewhere, with modest support

from all members of our club facilities the club financial basis is assured.

Fred Bevis, Club Treasurer, has worked tirelessly over the last 16 years managing and balancing the club's finances, often working late at years end for our Annual Financial Report. On behalf of the Board and members I thank him for his dedication to our club's welfare.

In closing my report to members I wish to thank all board members for their effort and time contributed to this year, also our permanent staff, Faye Buckley, Roy Simmonds, Jeanette Percival, Phil McWilliams, Bernard and James, for a job well done.

FINANCE

The Club has reported a surplus for the year of \$10,088 compared to a loss of \$18,959 the previous year. The previous year contained the expenditure on the renovation of the men's washrooms of \$43,410. The surplus is a pleasing result and broadly in line with the budget.

In last years report concern was raised about the decline in membership numbers. This year however, has seen membership numbers stabilise and it is hoped that they may now increase.

Total revenue for the year was \$434,170 which is slightly lower than the previous year. Shipwright sales declined by 12% from \$147,877 to \$130,145 this year. The decline is significant and continues the trend of lower levels of activity on the slipways in the past two years. The recessed economic conditions are a major factor in the decline however we must consider other factors which may be involved. A survey of the members is being conducted to gather information about the services presently provided, improvements that can be made and possible new services. I urge all members to complete the survey as it will be an important input in the Board's review of the situation.

Revenue from social functions rose to \$68,722 from \$59,546 the previous year. This increased revenue contributed to an improved Clubhouse result.

Other departments were generally in line with either expectations or the previous years revenue or expenditure levels.

The Board has decided to revalue the Captain Amora and the Nancy K so as to more accurately reflect their market value. The revaluations have increased the Asset revaluation reserve by \$30,000 this year.

The past two years have been difficult economic times for most businesses. The Club is also experiencing some declining revenues but continues to be in a sound financial condition and with reserves that will allow continued development and the maintenance of assets.

I would like to thank Faye Buckley for the professional way she approaches her job and the support she has provided to the Board. The Club's continued efficient operation is in no small way due to her efforts.

BOATSHED

Vice Commodore's Report

Sub Committee: Ian Anstee, Russ Chapman, Mike deBurca, Bob Lawler, Peter Wargent.

As members will note from the Directors' Review of Operations, boatshed income is down on the previous year due to a decline in shipwright sales. To counteract this, the hiring of casual labour was curtailed unless it was for projects which required specialist assistance. We decided to conduct a survey recently on members use of our slipways, to determine if there are other factors involved. This information is now being received and the results will be used to see if we need to offer new/improved services.

The following is a list of our new equipment and major repair/maintenance projects carried out over the past year:

- "Nancy K". The trusty old Lister engine was replaced with a new MWM that hopefully should last another 20 years. The "Nancy K" is our work boat/tender and generally is in operation 7 days a week, so reliability and power are paramount. A special thanks to Bob and Mick Lawler, Lindsay Buckmaster, Mike deBurca and the boatshed staff for a job well done.
- "Captain Amora". In addition to the normal servicing, the topsides were refurbished and re-sprayed to comply with our AGC sponsorship.
- Satisfactory negotiations were completed with the Waterways Authority concerning capacity plates for the "Jack Millard" and "Nancy K" and

thanks are due to members Peter Wargent and John Jeremy (both Naval architects) for their assistance.

- During the month of October 1992, the pontoon showed signs of “distress”. A heavy marine contractor was called in to effect emergency repairs. More minor work will be required by the contractor in the next few months.

Over 250 boats were slipped this year and all the club moorings on Mosman Bay were serviced.

- Slipway Equipment. New trestles were purchased. We also purchased new airless spray equipment and can now spray on anti-fouling and undertake top quality topside work.

Your club now has the necessary equipment and skilled labour and we look forward to satisfying members requirements in the future.

I conclude with expressing my thanks to the Boatshed Committee for their help and guidance over the past year. Thanks are also due to our hardworking boatshed staff, headed by Manager Phil McWilliams who is ably assisted by Bernard Connellan and James Nash, who has helped on boatshed maintenance projects as time permits from his clubhouse duties.

Thanks to Faye for keeping me plied with figures, and also Patrick Quirk, our chief tender driver and his team James, Damien, Chris, Andrew, and Daniel.

To help cater for the large crowd the Board has approved the purchase of a larger refrigerator thus improving our efficiency.

RACING REPORT 92/93

Since the formation of the Amateurs in 1872 racing has been the cornerstone of the Club and continues to be the principal focus of the Amateurs calendar and membership activity. In that first year there were 24 boats racing in 3 Divisions and they competed in two races plus four "outings".

During the past season 81 boats competed in 6 Divisions in our Saturday racing plus 14 boats in Division 7, racing at 3 or 4 week intervals. For the Metre Division 5 races were held on Sundays with 20 entries. The Amateurs also conducted the Cavalier 28 State Championships, one day of the S80 Match Racing Championships, the Daydream Shield challenge with MHYC, Idle Hour, Kelly Cup, Ladies Day, Nominated Skippers and Bob Brown

Trophy events, plus the popular Twilight series held on Friday evenings which attracted strong support with 68 entries.

That coveted plate the Daydream Shield this year made a return to MHYC after close but convincingly won challenges by 9 out of 14 boats from MHYC. The Easter event, the Bob Brown Trophy recorded 21 finishers. The season ends with a series of 4 Winter races with 45 entries.

The founders of the Amateurs would be proud that their first programme would evolve to such a comprehensive schedule.

Thanks and congratulations are due to all those involved in making the programme possible and a success. Our Hon. Starters Vic Dibben and Bob Skinner and their regular crew of volunteers, supported by Peter Garrow for the Twilight series, ensured that the high standard of racing continued. Charles Maclurcan and his Protest Committee have adjudicated the few disputes which have arisen. Roy Simmonds our Assistant Race Secretary in the office, who has ably serviced both skippers and Starters, also assisted on the Twilight Starters Boat. The Division Representatives have arranged handicaps, fielded complaints and praise from their Division, and served on the Racing Committee. To each of you we record our thanks.

During the past year there were three retirements from the Racing Committee. Paul Brown, past Chairman, Bob Skinner Hon. Starter, after six years of dedicated service, and Peter Pangas, Racing Secretary. Vic Dibben continues to skillfully organise and run the Starters Boat, and Paul Foster has taken on the job of Racing Secretary. We each look forward to serving you well.

Skippers involvement in "how" and "what" is organised for the racing programme is most important. A Skippers Meeting held in May gave consent to new dates and arrangements for both Ladies Day and Nominated Skippers events. Your comments and suggestions are always welcomed by the Racing Committee.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of the club's accounts. Unless otherwise stated such accounting policies were also adopted in the preceding year.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and do not take into account changing money values, except to the extent to which they are reflected in the revaluation of certain assets.

DEPRECIATION AND AMORTISATION OF FIXED ASSETS

Fixed assets are being depreciated or amortised on the straight line method by sufficient charges to write off the costs of the assets over their expected useful lives.

STOCK ON HAND

Stock on hand has been valued on a first in, first out basis at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

INCOME TAX

No provision for income tax is necessary as the club is exempt from taxation by virtue of the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

FINANCIAL REPORTING BY SEGMENTS

The club operates predominantly in one industry - the promotion of amateur sailing, and in one geographical area - Sydney.
