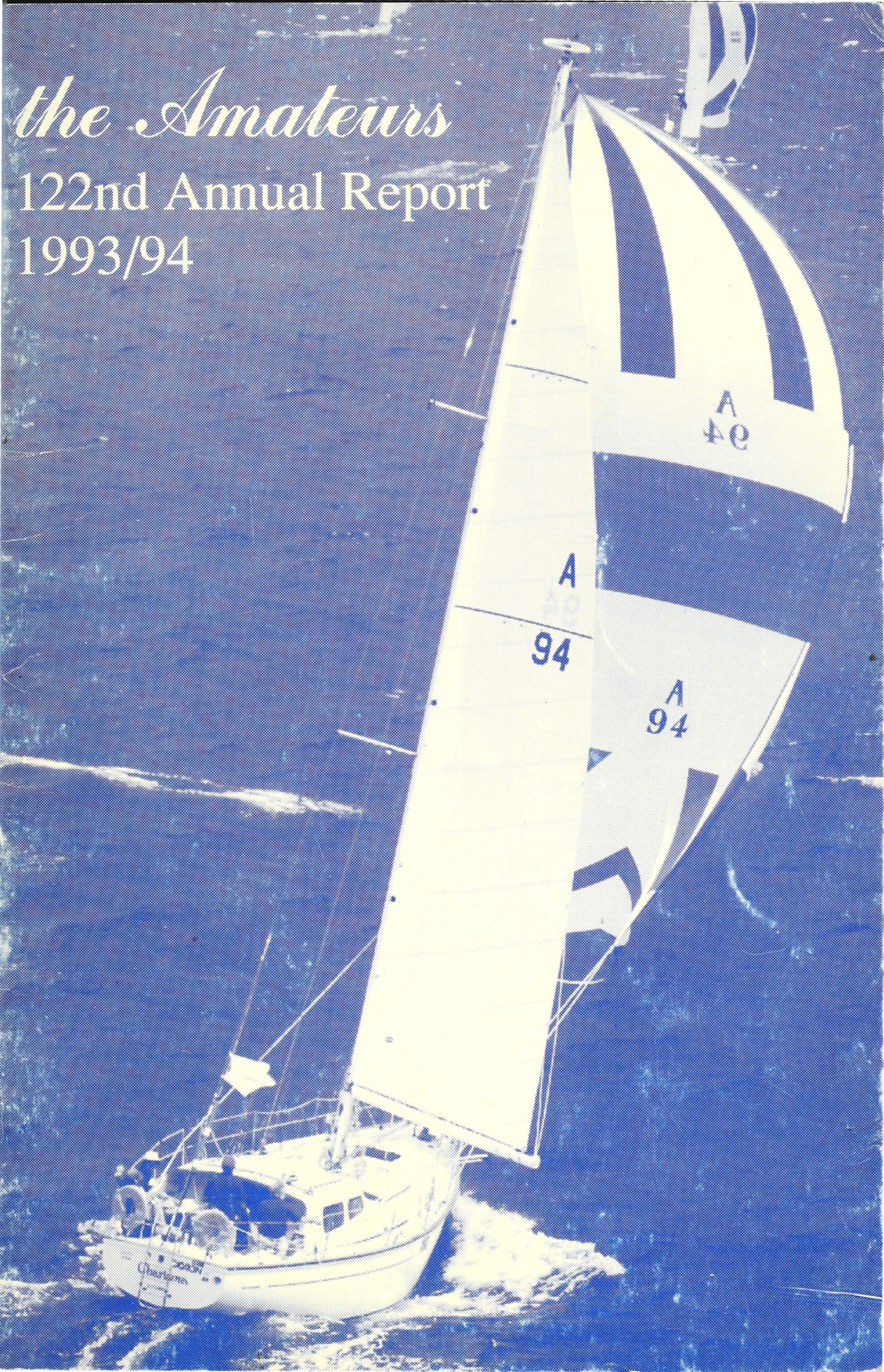

COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 1993-94

It is with great satisfaction that I present to my fellow club members the S.A.S.C. 122nd Annual Report for the year 1994.

As our financial and club year draws to its conclusion it's opportune to reflect, then look forward and plan for the club year ahead.

The financial strength of the club continues and is detailed in the Annual Report by our Honorary Treasurer.

This financial strength and careful control of the club's cash flow has allowed the Board the flexibility to authorise and carry out some quite large improvements or repairs around the club this year and financed from accrued club funds. The larger percentage was invested in our pontoon wharf and new sewerage system. Their benefits were apparent immediately.

All our departments finished with a positive result this year with the greatest improvement in the boatshed.

Boatshed/Slipway

Firstly I would like to congratulate Fred Bevis who accepted the Board's invitation to move from Treasurer to Vice Commodore during the year.

In finishing off the program started by Tony Saunders, Fred's own input is obvious and he has laid the ground work for a successful year in 1995.

House Committee

Our house committee has again excelled during this year. Ross Munn and his committee have consistently provided us with second-to-none in-house catering and continues to receive enthusiastic response from club volunteers to help run our Friday night twilight socials.

This department also finished the year with a positive contribution to the club's balance sheet.

Club Racing

Again club racing played a leading role in club activities, with a peak 119 yachts paying to race full or part-time in the club's Saturday point score races. Congratulations to Philip Brown, Racing Chairman; Paul Foster, Racing Secretary; Vic Dibben, Club Starter and our Division Captains, all who have worked as a team to help keep our club racing not only professional but also a first class event throughout the season.

Both Peter Garrow and Roy Simmonds continued to support the club by manning the starter boat for most of the Tuesday and Friday night twilight races.

It is healthy to reflect on past achievements particularly club racing.

Some of our older members believe because we have fewer divisions for our Saturday point score that our racing fleet is also down. This is not so. For example in 1974 the club had 129 yachts racing point score - 9 divisions, in 1984 it was 101 yachts also in 9 divisions, in 1994, we peaked at 119 yachts in 7 divisions. Sure we are down in division Saturday harbour point score, but these have simply been overtaken by speciality or feature races.

Last season 289 yachts paid entry fees to enter and race one, some or all of the club's racing calendar.

Times have changed, so have our member racing preferences. Members can now enter club races, twilight Tuesday point score, twilight Friday social, Saturday point score, Sunday metre boat point score, off-shore short or long races point score, winter point score, plus special events in between in 11 divisions.

We are alive and well with a top racing committee and team meeting the contemporary demands of our members.

Finance

Again I would like to thank and congratulate Tony Clarkson who also accepted an invitation to join the Board of Directors and become Honorary Treasurer. He has approached this important club position diligently and with enthusiasm.

The 1993/94 balance sheet shows a small deficit following the financing of some new development and necessary repairs plus some one off expenses which accrued this year.

Gaffers Day

Attended by the Governor of NSW this year, Bill Gale did the club proud with his mighty effort and chairmanship of our Gaffers Day committee.

Because of the combination of good weather, attention to detail by the committee, and a good roll up of yachts, the day must go down as one of our better events.

In closing my report and on behalf of our members, I thank all Board members for their support and contribution over the year.

Thank you to our permanent staff, Jeanette, Roy, James, Phil and Bernard who have quietly worked behind the scenes over the year performing their allotted duties. Also Faye, who is of constant support with her administrative duties and feedback.

Membership has remained fairly steady over the year with 37 new members joining the Club and 36 ceasing to be members.

FINANCE

The Club has reported a deficit of \$1595 for the year compared to a surplus of

\$10,088 for the previous year. The current year's result includes the cost of converting the septic tank to a pump-out tank connected to the main sewerage \$11,900, payment to the Yachting Association for buoy maintenance covering the period 1989 to 1992 \$5,296, repairs to the deck totalling \$11,700 and we have for the first time provided for Long Service Leave for our employees totalling \$5,508. All in all, it is felt to be a satisfactory result.

The total revenue of the Club was \$488,404 compared with last year of \$434,170. An improvement of 12.5%. The improvement is largely due to the better performance of the slipway activities and the higher revenues generated by the House & Social Committee.

Slipway sales increased from \$130,145 last year to \$164,672 this year, an improvement of 26.5%. Rigid control of expense exercised by the Vice Commodore and his Committee has seen the surplus from the Boatshed increase two fold from \$19,560 to \$36,454.

The Club House increased its revenue from \$70,204 in 1993 to \$82,881 in the current year due largely to the popularity of the Friday night twilights and no doubt some additional benefit was gained on Gaffers Day. As mentioned previously the installation of the new pump-out facility for \$11,900 largely accounts for the increase in the operating deficit of the Club House from \$26,904 to \$38,183.

Racing has experienced a fairly steady year with income increasing from \$21,609 last year to \$23,745. Expenditure was affected by the payment of past maintenance for racing buoys and additional depreciation for the starters boat. As a result the deficit on racing activities increased from \$9,835 to \$19,162.

It was pleasing to note that Gaffers Day even without a major sponsor as on previous occasions (but with help from Berny's and a big effort by the Gaffers Committee and others) was run with only a minor cost to the Club.

I believe the finances of the Club are in good shape for the coming year and we should be able to satisfactorily cope with the major expenditures that are planned for 1994/95.

Finally, I would like to thank Faye Buckley for the high standard of her work, the professional way in which she carries out her duties and the considerable assistance that she has given me as the new Treasurer.

BOATSHED

Vice Commodore's Report

Tony Saunder's report last year mentioned the downturn in shipwright sales that year and the measures he had implemented to curtail costs and the conduct of a survey of Members of their use and experience of the Club's

slipway services. Almost from the time of the survey, activity increased and has remained at strong levels throughout the year. The improvement in activity is confirmation of members' support of the Club.

The survey sheets have been analysed and collated and they indicate a high level of satisfaction with the work done and, in particular, the slipway staff. Obviously in an operation such as ours it is impossible to have a perfect record and some improvements have been implemented. These were mostly put in place by Tony Saunders before he stepped down to go overseas and I thank him for his hard work and success.

Both Phil McWilliams and Bernard Connellan have decided to upgrade and improve their skills and have been pursuing TAFE courses in boat maintenance and woodworking. This speaks volumes for their dedication and commitment to provide a broad range of services and skills.

The major development and repair works undertaken this year have been the upgrading of the sewerage system, the completion of the wharf re-decking and continuing maintenance on the pontoon. Bob Lawler has made his usual invaluable contribution of technical and practical advice on these projects.

Thanks to the Boatshed Committee for their help and advice during the year. The boatshed staff have had a very successful year and provided services to members at record levels and I thank them for their dedication. Thanks also to the team of tender drivers who have worked well under the coordination of Andrew Bustos. Thanks to Faye for the timely reports on the operations.

DEVELOPMENT

During 1993/94, work on the Club's facilities concentrated on maintenance tasks. Further repairs were carried out to the pontoon and access ramp to preserve the structure and extend its life for a number of years. The repairs to the main wharf decking started during 1991/92 were also completed.

Members who use the Clubhouse frequently (and, in particular, the club staff) will welcome the changes made late in the past year to the sewage collection system. The septic tanks which were responsible for a considerable odour problem have been decommissioned and one of the tanks converted to a holding tank, which is now pumped directly to the sewer. The second tank, now spare, is likely to find a new use as part of a system being planned to control waste from the Club's slipways. Design work on this system will begin early in 1994/95, and it will be given a high priority to ensure that any impact of our operations on the local environment are minimised.

Early planning has also started on a modernisation for the starter's boat **Captain Amora**. Vic Dibben has prepared a list of improvements, which will not only make life more comfortable for the starters (and their work even more efficient), but will extend the life of the boat.

The planned changes to the external appearance of the clubhouse mentioned in last year's report have been developed in detail, and tenders for the work

have been received. This work does not have as high a priority as the jobs already mentioned, but it is hoped to progress it as the opportunity offers during the next year.

All these improvements to the Club's facilities are amongst a range of potential development projects which have been considered as part of a long term plan. Whilst some of the items in the plan may never happen, the plan will help the allocation of funds and the setting of priorities. The work being considered ranges from internal refurbishment of the clubhouse, to flammable material storage; extra mooring piles or even pontoon space; a wharf awning for those less than perfect Friday nights in summer, and in the longer term, replacement of the boats.

All future plans reflect the need to preserve the unique environment of the club, the importance of our relationship with our neighbours, and the primary focus of our activities: sailing.

RACING REPORT 93/94

The 1993/4 racing season has been one of the most comprehensive conducted by the Amateurs. For some weeks in February we ran races on Tuesday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday including special series and events such as Midweek Pointscore, Metre Boats, Ladies Day and Match Racing. The standard of racing is good and those competitors involved have had a most enjoyable season.

The Twilight programme was extended this year with the introduction of a Midweek Pointscore series conducted on five consecutive Tuesday evenings. The fleet grew to 15 boats and the racing was extremely competitive with spinnakers used and crews working keenly in predominately fresh breezes. This series will be run again in February 1995 with a slightly later start time of 6.20pm to allow skippers and crew more time to get onto the water at the end of their working day. The regular Friday night twilight races are very popular with great enjoyment derived by all sailors both on the water and on the wharf.

The Daydream Shield was regained by the Amateurs this year by a convincing margin, on a balmy February Sunday around a course on the Sound hosted in style by our friends at MHYC. The Amateur's turn to host the event this coming season will give us a chance to defend on our home waters. The Commodore has had the Shield reconditioned and it looks very good hanging in the Clubhouse.

The Amateurs gave a Race Secretaries' Lunch for the Sydney Clubs hosted by Race Secretary Paul Foster. Our guests departed from SASC Clubhouse happy in the knowledge that "the water is bluer and that the sky is brighter" at the Amateurs. The level of goodwill amongst the various yacht club race organisations is both pleasing and helpful.

Saturday racing continues to be the mainstay of Amateurs programme, with 6 divisions on the water each week. The largest fleet is in Div. 2, whilst the Traditional fleets in two divisions are gaining in numbers each year. More boats are being encouraged to join Div. 1 for the coming season to boost its numbers. The 1/2 Ton fleet raced at SASC in 1993/4 and this coming season will race with RSYS, whilst the Cavalier 28 fleet will return to the Amateurs. The S80 fleet which has been combined with MHYC has lost numbers such that there will not be an SASC S80 series for 1994/5, however SASC will conduct the S80 National Titles in January.

The race administration team has worked well together this year with a particularly strong and enthusiastic Race Committee, made up of Divisional Representatives, Starters, Safety and Protest Officers, ably assisted by our executive Roy Simmonds. On behalf of the racing membership and for my own part may I thank each of you for your support and assistance. Special mention of appreciation should be made to our Starters led by Vic Dibben for daylight events and Peter Garrow for twilights. This past season we were assisted by several members taking on the role of Officer of the Day on the Starters boat, principally for the Metre Division, and our sincere thanks go to each of you. It is our policy to increase the pool of skilled OOD's, especially as our programme becomes more diverse with more Sunday and weekday races.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounts have been prepared and presented in accordance with applicable Statements of Accounting Concepts, applicable Accounting Standards and the Corporations Law, including the disclosure requirements of Schedule 5. The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the accounts.

DEPRECIATION OF FIXED ASSETS

Fixed assets are being depreciated on the straight line method by sufficient charges to write off the costs of the assets over their expected useful lives.

STOCK ON HAND

Stock on hand has been valued on a first in, first out basis at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

INCOME TAX

No provision for income tax is necessary as the club is exempt from taxation by virtue of the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Provision is made in respect of the company's liability for annual leave and long service leave at balance date. Long service leave is accrued in respect of all employees with more than 5 year's service with the Club.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred. The company has no legal obligation to provide benefits to employees on retirement.

FINANCIAL REPORTING BY SEGMENTS

The club operates predominantly in one industry - the promotion of amateur sailing, and in one geographical area - Sydney.
