Sydney Amateur Sailing Club COMMODORE'S REPORT FOR 2011–2012

I would like to congratulate all the Members and Staff of Sydney Amateur Sailing Club for their tremendous efforts over the last year or so in working so hard and diligently in and around the Clubhouse. Under the leadership of Trevor Cosh our facilities are in better shape than they have been for many years. Special mention must go to two husband and wife teams — Herschel Smith led the team sprucing up the paintwork on the clubhouse and he was ably assisted by his wife Catherine, a *painter extraordinaire*. Mary and Philip Kinsella also did a colossal amount of work preparing the clubhouse and making sure the gardens were at their best for Gaffers Day.

Sunday 23 October was the fabulous Gaffers Day which began with egg and bacon rolls for breakfast on the pontoon. Visitors could then witness the Commodore and organising committee miss the ferry before watching the regatta from the comfort of the classic ferry *Proclaim* where food and drink was supplied. Back at the Club after the regatta a rum tent and jazz band provided suitable entertainment. Gaffers Day is one of the great events on the SASC calendar and this year was no exception with many beautiful yachts reminding onlookers of what the Harbour would have been like in times gone by.

The SASC has been fortunate to gain two NSW Government-funded grants. The first one was for the sum of \$10,200 plus GST from the Sport and Recreation Facility Grant Program. The second grant was from "NSW Government's Community Building Partnership for a Slipway Waste Water Treatment System Upgrade. Jillian Skinner, our local Member of Parliament, was instrumental in encouraging us to apply for this funding. Rear Commodore Bruce Dover and Director Sean Kelly completed the tedious form filling to gain these funds — a big thank you to both of them.

While talking of Government interaction with the Club I am sure that all members will be pleased that, after a long application period, the Club has received a draft lease agreement from Crown Lands for a new lease for 40 years. Once agreed and confirmed, this will remove any uncertainty about our tenure.

Thanks also to the people who keep our Club running so well. Megan and Judy keep the office running smoothly and efficiently dealing with a myriad of administrative detail. Around the Clubhouse Frank keeps us ship-shape and Rod and his crew are managing the slipways within the difficult constraints imposed. Our major activity is racing and we have been very well served, as always, by the starting crews. They seem to have the Wisdom of Solomon with their uncanny ability to guess the fickle weather conditions and either shorten courses or let them run. They always seem to manage to get us sailors back to the bar for at least one or two post-race drinks! Maggie somehow keeps the sailing results under control working in conjunction with Captain Peter McCorquodale. The tender drivers Mike, Alan and Dennis have been supplemented this year with volunteers manning *Jack Millard* on the busy race days and thanks to Tony Clarkson for organising that roster. A special thanks to the editor of the Club's publications, John Jeremy. The newsletters arrive in the post like clockwork.

MEMBERSHIP

FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

For the current financial year the Club has recorded a profit of \$1,067 compared to a loss of \$55,241 last year. In actual fact, the underlying result was a loss of \$9,133, but the receipt of a grant from the NSW Government of \$10,200 for work carried out on the Mosman Boatshed last year has been brought into income for this year.

This year we have once again been forced to change the way in which we report our results to members. For many years we have felt it important that members know the true cost of maintenance of club assets and have included the internal value of work done by slipway staff in that maintenance. We are now advised that under current accounting rules we cannot do this, thus this year maintenance has been reduced by \$52,006 (last year \$64,991) and revenues by the same amount. However the detailed accounts at the rear of the report, which do not form part of our statutory accounts and are not required by law, do not reflect this change.

Revenues from ordinary activities increased by 5.29 % whilst overall costs reduced by 2.5%. Whilst the Board has continued to maintain the club boats and our facilities at a high standard, the levels were not as great as last year. In addition, mooring maintenance was down substantially this year as last year contained two lots of annual service costs. The accounting for YA subs changed this year as the Club became liable for them and the fees were included in our annual subscriptions.

The Club's financial position continues to be very strong with cash resources at year end of \$605,577 compared to \$532,947 last year. The major movements affecting cash were a decrease in debtors of \$48,022, increase in prepayments of \$32,134 (mainly insurance) and capital expenditure of \$32,382 (mainly the slipway water treatment plant).

Work by the subcommittee on the proposed slipway modernisation has continued during the year and with the expenditure of \$23,945 for the water treatment plant, the Club has now officially commenced the project for purposes of our DA. Whilst the NSW Government has promised \$21,400 for the project, this sum will be taken into account when received.

The accounts continue to be completed by Megan within a few working days of the year end which is an absolutely wonderful effort.

This is my last report as treasurer and I would like to thank Megan Keogh and Judy Wogowitsch for their assistance throughout the year and also the Commodore for his continued work on the insurances. I would also like to thank the finance committee, which includes Greg Sproule and Fred Bevis, for their contribution.

We look forward to another successful year supporting the on-water activities.

CLUBHOUSE

Our Amateurs' Club House remained the focal point for much of our non-sailing activities during the year with the recent working bee ensuring the physical premises are in good order and we have addressed all the significant issues. Inclement and untimely weather — particularly during the summer and during the Friday night twilights — impacted on the bar and catering sales where numbers were well down on many evenings to just a few dedicated and often very damp boat crews. Fortunately this downturn was more than offset by a stunning Gaffers Day event, when the weather-Gods indeed smiled upon us and delivered a glorious sunny day and perfect conditions, by which I mean a throng of very thirsty and very hungry sailing crews. It was a record day which more than covered our set-up and catering costs and was a great advertisement for our Club and its proud traditions. We owe a great vote of thanks to the Gaffers Day Committee led by Philip Kinsella, which has set a very high bar for future events.

The SASC Flag Officers' Dinner also maintained its ranking as one of the most sought after invitations amongst the Sydney Harbour sailing fraternity with a strong representation from all our fellow sailing clubs with NSW Maritime, Sydney Ferries, Yachting NSW amongst others. Our Guest of Honour for the evening was our local State Member and the Minister for Health, Jillian Skinner, who has been a long-time supporter of the Club. The occasion gave us the opportunity to brief the Minister on development projects including the Mosman Boatshed deck refurbishment and the new waste-water treatment plant. The Minister was supportive and, due to her significant backing, the Club has been the recipient of two State Government grants totalling more than \$32,000 towards the cost of those projects.

This year we have also begun offering training courses at the Club aimed at improving sailing skills and seamanship. At the time of writing, more than 70 members had registered interest to date in a range of courses which we will conduct progressively over the next year. Initially we will be focussing on marine diesel maintenance, marine radio, marine first aid and sea safety and survival courses. The feedback from the first courses conducted at the Club has been very positive and I encourage those who have not yet registered to think about doing so. Later in the year we will look to offer courses in boat handling, mooring techniques and rope work.

Once again I would like to pay tribute to the team which works tirelessly behind the scenes ensuring that our events are all so well organised and catered, ensure the clubhouse and surrounds are in tip-top condition and come Twilights, Gaffers Day or Prize Giving the fridges are full, the food plentiful and everything in its place. So a special thanks to our dedicated team — Megan, Judy, Maggie, Frank and regular staffer, Mindy, all who do their best to ensure that we run not just a successful club, but a highly social and enjoyable one at that.

I would also like to acknowledge the contributions of our duty officers who give freely of their time throughout the year — sometimes above and beyond the call of duty — to ensure that the tenders are manned, our thirsts are quenched and our stomachs satisfied once the racing on the water is finished. It is often a thankless job but one which does much to reinforce the Corinthian spirit of our Club.

RACING

The 2011–2012 sailing season at the Amateurs was, as usual, a great success but had some interesting ups and downs. Overall fleet numbers were slightly down. The weather certainly did not help us this year, particularly with the Twilights.

The highlight of the year was undoubtedly Gaffers Day, which was a wonderful day with fantastic yachts like *Hurrica V*, *Archina* and *Heartsease* the largest in the fleet. There was the sight of 14 Rangers and Coutas starting together, rather than a Mark Foy start. In all there were five divisions — two Bermudan, two Gaffers and the Historic 18 footers. As usual the Club looked fantastic with many yachts tied up alongside.

The Opening Day Regatta had 26 starters and the generous donation of \$1,000 from past Commodore Vic Dibben allowed the Club to give out trophies and prizes. *Hotspur2* won the Regatta from *Clewless?* and *Very Tasty*. Ross Littlewood from *As You Do* put \$500 behind the bar — meaning very happy sailors who returned to the Club!

The Lion Island race was, for the first time, on the calendar for the CYCA Offshore Series and 27 yachts started in Division 1 and 18 in Division 2. The only problem was that 14 of the 18 in Division 2 neglected to look at the starting signals so were OCS, leading to some disgusting emails from disgruntled entrants. A subsequent claim for redress was denied as the Protest Committee Chairman found the SASC Starters had not erred. *AFR Midnight Rambler* won Division 1 from *EZ Street* and *Molly* whilst *First Light* won Div 2 from *Moya* and *Torquil*.

The Saturday point score series have again been popular. The Classic Division was strong with a total of 21 yachts entered in two divisions. *Celeste* won Division 1 from *Anonyma II* and *Lolita* while *Caress* won Division 2 from *Cherub* and *Vanity*.

Division 2 had 10 entries in the long series which was won by *Primary Wave* from *Clewless*? and *Vitamin Sea*. The Short series was healthier with 13 entries and was won by 5 to 6 from *Primary Wave* and *Clewless*?.

The Cavalier 28 Division short series had nine entrants. The scratch series was won by U2 from Centaurus and Flying Circus, the PHS series by U2 from Christina III and Quattro.

The Super 30 Division continues to succeed with 11 Super 30 Cup series entrants and an impressive 33 competing in the Gold Cup series. *Torquil* won the Cup series from *Youngstar* and *Hotspur 2* while *Flying Brandy* won the Gold Cup series from *Youngstar* and *Very Tasty. Youngstar* won the North Sails prize.

Sunday's Division 6 was a little smaller this year — 14 entries but only nine regular starters. The series was won by *Magic* from 5 to 6 and *As You Do*.

The Sunday Gaffers numbers were down this year with only seven entrants. *Cherub* won the series from *Reverie* and *Ranger*. We are looking at having some Classic Sunday races in conjunction with this series next season, which hopefully will increase numbers.

The Paul Slocombe Trophy series on Tuesday nights was disappointing this year. There were eight entries, but only five yachts did more than two races. This series will be put on hold for next season, but we are open to ideas to reinvigorate what is arguably the most competitive series which the Club holds. This year *Jellicle* won from *Clewless?* and *Shambles*.

Friday Twilights were quieter this year and Robert Keessen won the trip for two to Lord Howe Island. SASC again thanks our sponsor, Concise Systems, for their continued support of the series.

The Easter Weekend Bob Brown Trophy race to Pittwater was a slow one this year — a couple of yachts just sneaking inside the time limit. *Cocomo* won on handicap from *Molly* and *EZ Street*.

The Idle Hour Trophy in October had 14 starters — Slips won from Gecko and Fagel Grip.

Probably the less said about the Club Championship the better. The history books will show that the Kelly Cup, Tara Ipo and Brooker Trophies were not awarded this season.

The SASC starting team also ran the racing on Area D for the Sydney Harbour Regatta, as well as a couple of Thursday night Classic Twilight races — meaning that some weeks we had a race crew out five days out of seven – really stretching our resources.

SASC also hosted the annual Classic Yacht Rally — a fantastic opportunity to see some of the most beautiful metrestyle yachts in Sydney sailing and rafted up together. This year there were three 12 metres, five 8 metres as well as a 7 metre, a 30 square metre and a 5.5 metre. Seeing *Gretel II* tied up alongside the pontoon on the Friday night with lights shining on her was a fantastic sight.

In conclusion, and perhaps most importantly, I would like to thank the many people without whom racing would simply not happen. Firstly I would like to thank Maggie Stewart for all of her efforts.

Secondly I would like to thank the teams of starters — Russ Chapman, Vic Dibben, Tony Barry and the Saturday team and Charles Maclurcan, John Jeremy, Tony Clarkson and the Friday night, Sunday and special regatta starting teams. I would also particularly mention Cameron Edwards who has been invaluable during the season.

Let's hope 2012–2013 is successful and perhaps less controversial.

Directors have been in office since the start of the financial year to the date of this report unless otherwise stated. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES OF THE COMPANY

The principal continuing activity of the Company during the financial year was to promote the sport of amateur sailing. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

TRADING RESULTS

The operating surplus (loss) after income tax of the Company for the year to 31 May 2012 was \$1,067 (2011: loss of \$55,241).

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

The Club's sailing, slipways and social programmes all continued satisfactorily.

The Club had 17 new members during the year. Membership now stands at 389.

DIVIDEND

No dividend has been recommended or paid during the year as the Company's Articles of Association do not permit payment of dividends.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN STATE OF AFFAIRS

No significant changes have occurred in the state of affairs of the Club.

AFTER BALANCE DATE EVENTS

No matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Company, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Company in subsequent financial years, apart from:

The Directors and members have under consideration a proposal to replace the existing slipway with a hardstand facility at an approximate cost of \$1,100,000. At the date of signing this report, no commitment has been entered into as the provisional approval given by members is subject to a number of conditions, none of which have yet been met. We have also received notification that a NSW Government Grant of \$21,400 under the 2011 Community Building Partnership Program has been approved, but not provided at balance date.

LIKELY DEVELOPMENTS AND RESULTS

The Company will continue to promote the sport of amateur sailing through its racing and training programs.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

Sydney Amateur Sailing Club Limited has elected to early adopt the pronouncements AASB1053: Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards and AASB 2010-2: Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from Reduced Disclosure Requirements to the annual reporting period beginning 1 June 2010.

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars.

(a) Income Tax

No charge has been made in respect of income tax as the Company relies on the exemption from income tax granted by Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. Therefore, it is not appropriate to adopt the principles of tax effect accounting.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first in first out basis.

(c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair values as indicated, less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to the economic entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The carrying values of plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment at each reporting date, with recoverable amounts being estimated when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may be impaired. Impairment exists when the carrying value of an asset exceeds its estimate recoverable amount. The asset is then written down to its recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposal are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income.

(d) Financial Instruments

Apart from financial assets or cash, term deposits, receivables and financial liabilities of trade and other payables, the Club does not hold or intend to invest in any other type of financial instrument.

Initial recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value. Fair value represents the amount for which an asset could be exchanged or a liability settled, between knowledgeable, willing parties.

(i) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits at-call with banks and other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts.

(ii) Loans and Receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are subsequently measured at fair value.

Collectability of trade debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectible are written off. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where some doubt as to collection exists.

(iii) Payables

The liability for creditors is recognised upon delivery of the goods and services to the Club or where the Club has entered an irrevocable contract for the supply of goods or services.

(e) Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the Income Statement.

Where the future economic benefits of the asset are not primarily dependent upon the asset's ability to generate net cash inflows and when the entity would, if deprived of the asset, replace its remaining future economic benefits, value in use is depreciated replacement cost of an asset.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an asset class, the entity estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the class of assets belong.

(f) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. Long service leave is accrued in respect of all permanent employees.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

(g) Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred. This basis is representative of the pattern of benefits derived from the leased property.

(h) Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

(j) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(k) Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.
