I would like to thank all the people who keep our Club running so well. Megan and Judy keep the office running smoothly and in a professional way dealing with a myriad of administrative detail.

Around the clubhouse Frank keeps us ship-shape and Rod and Jeff are managing the slipways within the difficult constraints imposed turning out quality work at as good a price as possible in these straightened times.

Our major activity is racing and we have been very well served, as always, by the starting crews. They have been sorely tested this year with three abandoned races in the Summer Series. The Wisdom of Solomon has come to the fore with their uncanny ability to guess the fickle weather conditions and either shorten the courses, let them run or send us home. They always seem to manage to get us sailors back to the bar for at least one or two post-race drinks! I have been helped and assisted by the Flag Officers and the members of the Board in both administrative and policy matters.

The range of talent that this Club has on tap is remarkable and the willingness of people to share their expertise in almost any field you care to name makes us what we are. Many of these skills and talents are harnessed in a very productive way by Trevor Cosh maintaining and modernising our facilities — thanks Trevor.

It is important that the Sydney Amateur Sailing Club remains true to its roots. One of our points of difference is our amateur status, albeit often difficult to maintain in the face of the commercialisation of just about everything we do in life. Other clubs are dependant upon the dollars of government and sponsors, as these dry up they are in trouble. Preserving what we have is an essential part of creating a club which is the envy of many.

The Club's finances are very sound. The details are in the Treasurer's report. We have concentrated on maintenance of the Club's vessels and the Green Shed and this costs money. However this maintenance should stand us in good stead for future years. A small decrease in Membership numbers needs to be reversed to keep the bank balance improving.

## FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

This year the Club has recorded a deficit of \$41,790 compared to a surplus of \$1,067 last year. This is in line with budgeted results although slightly higher due to lower boatshed activity and together with slightly higher general expenses in the clubhouse.

The Club's financial position remains robust, despite this deficit, with cash resources at year's end of \$659,165 compared to \$605,577 last year.

The net deficit for the year was a result of a drop in ordinary activities by 2.3% while overall costs increased by 3.6% compared to the previous year. As the result of anticipated large capital requirements for slipway development some maintenance costs in prior years had been deferred, such as on the slipway and *Nancy K*, and were required this year to maintain the Club's facilities to a proper standard. The costs of some of the maintenance expenses have been very substantially reduced by the generous voluntary labor provided by our members. There have been minor modifications to the reporting of subscription income however membership is holding at 395 this year compared to 389 the previous year.

In this first report as Treasurer I would like to thank the other members of the finance committee, Fred Bevis and Tony Clarkson, for their assistance and advice.

The office staff Megan Keogh and Judy Wogowitsch have been very diligent throughout the year and provided detailed information promptly as required. The additional workload to prepare the accounts for the auditors is quite onerous and I thank them for this on our behalf.

## **BOATSHED**

We have completed another very successful year on the water and it has been another year of continual improvement to the Club's fleet and assets. *Jack Millard* has been repowered with a heavy duty 60hp outboard and new controls. The hull also received a new epoxy sealer to the wetted surface plus a new marine ply deck internally. *Nancy K* received a topside makeover with paint and full fendering plus the installation of a rigid boarding ladder to assist in man-overboard recovery. *Captain Amora* received significant engine repairs with the replacement of the turbo charger and propeller realignment delivering a significant improvement in performance.

We continue to monitor the vessels and their requirements to manage their repairs and maintenance as effectively as

we can whilst ensuring on-water serviceability for the Club.

Our thanks go to Rod and Jeff from the boatshed for their fine workmanship and also to the volunteer club members who dedicated themselves to ensuring *Jack Millard's* hull upgrade.

Our thanks also go to the tender drivers, Mike, Alan and Dennis who have ensured another year of continual on-water service. We are very fortunate to enjoy such reliable service which is ably co-ordinated by Mike.

A special thank you to the volunteer tender drivers for dedicating their time in taking the peak load out of the Saturday boarding and disembarkation periods.

Working bees at the Mosman shed have continued under the valuable guidance of Trevor Cosh and Mike de Burca which is ensuring the long-term viability of the facility. The availability of the Mosman shed for short term mooring to undertake self-performed work has become very popular and we are delighted to see the members maximising the use of this facility.

A special mention to the CYCA for their generosity in donating the outdoor lockers and dinghy pipe racking to us for installation at the Mosman shed, a wonderful spirit of co-operation from a fellow Sydney Harbour club in supporting yachting activities.

The Club has been undertaking a full examination and review of the tender and mast cranes having engaged external structural engineers and underwater specialists to survey the current condition and advice on ongoing requirements for the operation of the cranes.

We have recently accepted the generous caretaker offers from John Pennefather as Dinghy Master and David Salter as Vessel Master to keep an eye on the dinghy fleet and the motor vessels respectively. These generous offers will greatly assist the Club mission of having all assets operating consistently to specification.

Finally, thank you to the Boatshed Committee for your enormous guidance and assistance during the years, there are many hours of dedicated service contributed by a very talented group of members to whom I am very grateful.

We look forward to a successful year ahead and assistance from members in any way big or small is always appreciated.

A special thanks to Vice Commodore Liam Timms and Captain Peter McCorquodale who played a big part in contributing to the success of the evening.

The event was a good reminder of the interest of members in hearing, sharing and learning from others in order to improve the quality of our own seamanship and sailing skills.

We hope to organise other such events for the benefit of members in the coming year and would welcome suggestions as to who you think would make a suitable guest or interview subject.

Overall the clubhouse performed well during the past year with the number of good weather twilights outnumbering the bad with the result that bar and catering sales were up and racing crews maintained their thirst during the summer racing series.

We also conducted a Responsible Service of Alcohol course at the Club during the year which has increased the number of members we can roster on as Duty Officers to assist behind the bar on race days. Just a reminder to all members — Duty Officers contribute their time free of charge for the benefit of all and often at the expense of having a day on the water so their efforts are well worthy of our acknowledgement.

On behalf of all members, I would also like to acknowledge the work of the team which works tirelessly behind the scenes ensuring not only that the clubhouse and surrounds are always spick and span but that our events are flawlessly organised, the fridges are full and the food plentiful.

## **RACING**

Before any mention of results I must thank Maggie Stewart for her fantastic support and help — I believe it's her 17<sup>th</sup> season helping the Amateurs. SASC may be one of the smaller yacht clubs in terms of members but in terms of yachts racing we are right up there and we have fantastic administration of our racing. Each year Maggie, alone and part time, does the same amount of work that other clubs have two or more full-time employees to complete. There is so much done behind the scenes and we all owe Maggie a lot. Thank you.

The 2012–2013 sailing season at the Amateurs was, as usual, a great success and certainly less controversial than last year! Again the weather did not help us this year with a number of races abandoned due to too much or too little wind which had a bearing on point score results. Overall numbers are again down but we are not alone in this. We are looking at a number of strategies to boost numbers for next season and would appreciate any input from members and competitors.

The Opening Day Regatta had 20 starters and another generous donation from past Commodore Vic Dibben allowed the Club to give out trophies and prizes. *Mystic II* won the Regatta from *Spindrift* and *Lunacy*. Ross Littlewood from *As You Do* put \$500 behind the bar for the second year meaning very happy sailors who returned to the Club.

The Lion Island race set the trend of being less controversial this year with skippers deciding to watch the flag sequence. There were 30 starters in two divisions. *San Toy* won Division 1 from *EZ Street* and *Quest* whilst *Limelight* won Division 2 from *Rapid Transit* and *Morag Bheag. EZ Street* was the bridesmaid for the second year in a row — better luck this year guys.

The Saturday point score series has again been popular. The Classic Division was strong with a total of 26 yachts entered in two divisions. *Celeste* won Division 1 for the second year running from *Fagel Grip* and *Mister Christian* and *Cherub* won Division 2 from *Caress* and *Vanity* — a rearrangement of the same three winners from last year.

Division 2 had only six entries in the long series which was won by *Primary Wave* from *Vitamin Sea* and *Spindrift*. The short series was healthier with 11 entries and was won by *Antares* from 5 to 6 and *Vitamin Sea*.

The Cavalier 28 Division short series had ten entrants. *Centaurus* won the scratch series from *U2* and *Flying Circus* — the PHS series was won by *Flying Circus* from *Blind Justice* and *Quattro*.

The Super 30 Division had six Super 30 Cup Series entrants with 23 competing in the Gold Cup series. *Hotspur 2* won the Cup series and *Knockabout* won the Gold Cup series from *Youngstar* and *Very Tasty*. On AMS *Very Tasty* won the Super 30 Cup and *Knockabout* the Gold Cup Series.

Sunday's Division 6 was healthier this year — 20 entries with some 13 regular starters. *Hotspur 2* won the series from *Magic* and *Clewless?*.

The Sunday Gaffers numbers were also up this year with eight entrants. *Ranger* won the series from *Reverie* and *Sana*. We also had some Classic Sunday races in conjunction with this series this season but although there were 11 entries, including three 12 metres, actual participation was small so we will not be repeating this series.

The annual Classic Metre Yacht Rally was again, however, a fantastic opportunity to see some of the most beautiful metre-style yachts in Sydney sailing and rafted up together. There were 21 entries with *Sjö Ro* winning the Rally and *Tanami* and *Flamingo* sharing the Concours d'Elegance honours.

Friday Twilights were again mostly quieter this year with weather affecting a number of races. Garth Davies from *Orient Express* won the twilight prize — this year donated by Alan Quick from Quick Plumbing.

The Easter Weekend Bob Brown Trophy race to Pittwater was a good one this year even though the breeze died once the leaders had rounded Barrenjoey. *Mister Christian* won on handicap from *Molly* and *Sticky*.

The Club Championship had good breeze this year and the Kelly Cup was won by *Quattro*, the first Cavalier 28 to win this prize. *U2* won the Tara Ipo Trophy, and *Lolita* the Brooker Trophy.

In conclusion, I would like to thank the teams of starters without whom none of the above would have been possible—Tony Barry, Russ Chapman and the Saturday team and Charles Maclurcan, John Jeremy, Tony Clarkson, John Morris and the Friday night, Sunday and special regatta starting teams. I would also particularly like to mention Cameron Edwards who has been invaluable during the season.

Directors have been in office since the start of the financial year to the date of this report unless otherwise stated.

#### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES OF THE COMPANY

The principal continuing activity of the Company during the financial year was to promote the sport of amateur sailing. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

#### TRADING RESULTS

The operating loss after income tax of the Company for the year to 31 May 2013 was \$41,790 (2012: surplus of \$1,067).

#### **REVIEW OF OPERATIONS**

The Club's sailing, slipways and social programmes all continued satisfactorily.

The Club had 22 new members during the year. Membership now stands at 395.

#### DIVIDEND

No dividend has been recommended or paid during the year as the Company's Constitution does not permit payment of dividends.

#### SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN STATE OF AFFAIRS

No significant changes have occurred in the state of affairs of the Company.

#### AFTER BALANCE DATE EVENTS

No matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Company, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Company in subsequent financial years, apart from:

The directors and members have under consideration a proposal to replace the existing slipway with a hardstand facility at an approximate cost of \$1,100,000. At the date of signing this report, no commitment has been entered into as the provisional approval given by members is subject to a number of conditions, none of which have yet been met.

#### LIKELY DEVELOPMENTS AND RESULTS

The Company will continue to promote the sport of amateur sailing through its racing and training programs.

#### ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATIONS

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of Preparation**

Sydney Amateur Sailing Club Limited has elected to early adopt the Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements as set out in AASB1053: Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards and AASB 2010-2: Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from Reduced Disclosure Requirements to the annual reporting period beginning 1 June 2010.

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001. The Company is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars.

#### (a) Income Tax

No charge has been made in respect of income tax as the Company relies on the exemption from income tax granted by Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. Therefore, it is not appropriate to adopt the principles of tax effect accounting.

#### (b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first in first out basis.

#### (c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair values as indicated, less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to the economic entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The carrying values of plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment at each reporting date, with recoverable amounts being estimated when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may be impaired. Impairment exists when the carrying value of an asset exceeds its estimate recoverable amount. The asset is then written down to its recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposal are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income.

#### (d) Financial Instruments

Apart from financial assets or cash, term deposits, receivables and financial liabilities of trade and other payables, the Company does not hold or intend to invest in any other type of financial instrument.

#### **Initial recognition and measurement**

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value. Fair value represents the amount for which an asset could be exchanged or a liability settled between knowledgeable, willing parties.

#### (i) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits at-call with banks and other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts.

#### (ii) Loans and Receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are subsequently measured at fair value.

Collectability of trade debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectible are written off. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where some doubt as to collection exists.

#### (iii) Payables

The liability for creditors is recognised upon delivery of the goods and services to the Company or where the Company has entered an irrevocable contract for the supply of goods or services.

#### (e) Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

Where the future economic benefits of the asset are not primarily dependent upon the asset's ability to generate net cash inflows and when the entity would, if deprived of the asset, replace its remaining future economic benefits, value in use is depreciated replacement cost of an asset.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an asset class, the entity estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the class of assets belong.

#### (f) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the Company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. Long service leave is accrued in respect of all permanent employees.

Contributions are made by the Company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

#### (g) Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred. This basis is representative of the pattern of benefits derived from the leased property.

#### (h) Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### (i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

#### (j) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

#### (k) Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matters described in the Basis for Qualification paragraph, the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects the financial position of Sydney Amateur Sailing Club as at 31 May 2013 and its performance for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in note 1 of the financial report.

#### **Inherent Uncertainty Regarding Completeness of Income**

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for the directors to maintain an effective system of internal control over all income until its initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to the income was limited to the amounts recorded.

#### **Basis of Accounting**

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 of the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for distribution to the members for the purpose of fulfilling the directors' financial reporting obligations under the Company's constitution. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
