We have enjoyed a stellar season on the water with an increase in yachts participating in events which is a credit to Captain Chris Sligar and the Division representatives and the way they look after their fleets.

Thank you to the starters who have continued to excel and deliver perfect racing courses with great humour and spirit. The starters of the Amateurs are the envy of the harbour and we must do all we can to support our teams.

The improved slipway facilities have been well received with the final stage, a new cradle, underway. The steelwork is complete and should be in place, assembled and operational by August. The Board has also approved a pile replacement program for those past their use by date and we expect to have this completed before October to ensure the facilities are in good repair for Gaffers Day. Thank you Trevor Cosh and the ever present band of volunteers for keeping the major works progressing.

The improvement works to the Green Shed have resulted in 180 degree turnaround in the financial outcome of that facility. It is now a reliably positive contributor to the Club's operations.

The Art and Archives Committee has been doing a tremendous task in sorting, vetting and revising the displays in the clubhouse including refurbishing each area as they are worked through. It is coming together beautifully and we are enjoying the new displays of yachts.

Gaffers Day is on 18 October and, under Peter Scott's guiding hand, we look forward to a great day for the Amateurs, Sydney Harbour and classic yachting. Past Commodore Vic Dibben has accepted the position of Patron for the day which we are very excited about and we look forward to welcoming members joining us on the day.

Thank you to the Directors, the Vice Commodore, the Rear Commodore, Immediate Past Commodore, Captain, Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Secretary — they have all worked tirelessly and with great enthusiasm in the spirit of the Amateurs.

FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

The Club's financial position remains strong, with cash resources at year-end of \$582,408 increasing from \$516,665 last year. This cash increase is in addition to considerable ongoing improvements to the slipway, boats and clubhouse. Praise is due for the voluntary contributions of expertise and labour from our membership which contributed to this excellent result.

This year the Club has recorded a deficit of \$50,248 compared to last year's deficit of \$49,269. With an active slipway and pontoon upgrade strategy, we anticipate that there will be another deficit next year. The Club's current total equity of \$1,165,555 is stable. Considering the depreciation charge of \$95,070 this represents a cash surplus of \$66,880 surplus from ordinary activities.

Membership is 389 this year with the addition of 21 new members compared to 398 the previous year. Fred Bevis and Tony Clarkson, the other members of the finance committee, deserve thanks for their ongoing interest and expertise in assisting me as Treasurer. I would like to congratulate office staff, Megan Keogh and Judy Wogowitsch, who have been very diligent throughout the year providing timely information regarding financial matters and continue to cooperate well as a team and contribute to the effective management of the Club.

BOATSHED

We have also focussed the past year on the refurbishment to the Club's vessels — *Captain Amora, Nancy K* and *Jack Millard*. In my previous reports, I have made a point of thanking those "anonymous members" who go quietly about their work making repairs here and there, replacing mooring lines, overseeing the pontoon structure, fixing leaks and broken windows, door latches and a myriad of little things that most of us would never notice. This year I would like to place on record the extraordinary efforts made over many years by two members in particular — the late Tony Curtis and Mike de Burca, who intends retiring to the country. Both of these gentlemen, over many years, attended to countless jobs big and small around the club — often at their own cost and certainly giving of their time without ever seeking recognition or recompense. Together they epitomise the spirit of the club and we should all extend our gratitude and thanks. To the others, who continue their anonymous good works, I salute you also.

Our thanks to our tender drivers, Mike, Alan, Mitch and until recently Dennis, who often go well beyond the call of duty in trying circumstances to provide an efficient, courteous and timely service.

It is also worth acknowledging the efforts of our expanding team of volunteer tender drivers whose contribution on race days ensures owners and crew are back at the bar in time to collect their prizes — or commiserate as the case may be. A reminder that they are volunteers who could otherwise be out on the water sailing and who give freely of their time.

Thanks are also due to fellow board member, John Sturrock, who has the unenviable task of overseeing the maintenance and allocation of the club's moorings.

I would also like to acknowledge Rod, Donald and Roy for, not just the quality of the workmanship

and expertise they bring to the Boatshed, but the good humour, patience and courtesy they demonstrate in the provision of services to all members — exacerbating as that may be on occasion. Rod celebrated 20 years with the Amateurs late last year and his knowledge and skills are of enormous benefit to the Club.

CLUBHOUSE

It has again been a pleasure to work with members, directors, staff and my fellow flag officers this season. The sailing has also been entertaining, although the handicappers seem to assume that my poor old cruiser racer, *Supertramp II*, is equipped with a foiling canting keel. The wind generator is not a propulsion device. Oh the injustice.

Away from the water, following the 2013–14 season, the clubhouse parted ways with a variety of bar staff supplied by a third party contractor. In their place we have engaged our own bar staff on a casual basis. This has proved to be a cost-effective solution. By now most of you may have come into contact with Kenan, Nicola and Sophie. They have proved to be an excellent team and each has indicated a desire to continue the arrangement next season.

We have also changed meat suppliers, an important decision for a club yet to embrace the dangerous cult of vegetarianism. Quality has improved, while the wholesale price paid by the club has been reduced significantly. Our facilities limit the range of fare we can efficiently provide to members but I have a few modest surprises in store for the next season.

Wine remains a problem. As I no longer reside in a premise with a bath, outsourcing has occurred and quality occasionally varies. The tasting committee, over which I preside and retain sole membership, will not rest until a regular supply of quality and economical sauce is sourced. Muscat by the flagon or claret by the box is not in contemplation at this juncture.

Following a spate of vandalism we installed CCTV cameras around the clubhouse last year. One memorable event, more traditionally associated with the boudoir, was recorded soon after the cameras were installed. Regrettably no SASC members were involved. Hopefully fortunes will improve in the seasons that follow. On a positive note, the cameras appear to have reduced the number of unwanted interlopers who were causing a significant amount of damage to the club. Security patrols were also increased at various stages during last season when the need for frequent deterrence became apparent.

James, of the charismatic Lawler clan, discoverer of the canal at Dunalley, produced, and provided to the club at no charge, the beautiful timber tables which now grace our deck. Mark Pearce of *Cherub* heads the stolen photo committee, a very sensitive role and he has the club looking majestic. Since the last report David Salter, of *Mister Christian*, has interviewed Syd Fischer and David Kellett. These interviews are becoming don't-miss events and David is to be congratulated on both his choice of subjects and the way he conducts the interviews.

Peter "Cowboy" Cowman continues to exert great energy in keeping the clubhouse in excellent condition. Megan and Judy in the office, when not creating invoices for mooring fees, or carefully reviewing the CCTV footage, make the tasks of Rear Commodore inestimably easier. They are truly focussed on the wellbeing of the club and all members should be appreciative of their continual efforts.

Clubhouse finances remain in good order. At the time of writing it appears income will be approximately 19% ahead of budget, while expenses are 6.5% above budget. The club again complied with all elements of our liquor licence. Gaffers Day occurs again later this year and Peter Scott of *Cherub*, along with his committee, are planning great things.

RACING

The publication of this SASC Annual Report marks the end of my second year as Club Captain. This year has been a season of consolidation, in contrast with my first year where substantive improvements to the racing program were achieved. It has been universally enjoyable and I thank members for their support and words of encouragement.

The on-water sailing programs, both summer and winter, were a success with fleet numbers remaining mostly static.

The Cruiser-Racer fleet saw modest growth over summer after concerted effort by fleet members.

The Friday twilight fleet was patchy this year, more due to far too many rainy Fridays than any underlying issues.

Anecdotally, while entry numbers remained static, the actual number of starters each Saturday increased making for more competitive racing.

Once again, on behalf of all competitors, I thank the staff and volunteers at the SASC who contribute so wholesomely to the racing calendar.

As an example of how these folk contribute — the Club Championship this year was held on a light and fickle day. Tony Barry (PRO) waited *just* long enough for a breeze to settle before starting a shortened-course race, resulting in a complete race and Champions proclaimed.

Congratulations to *Matagi* from BSC as the SASC Club Champion and winner of the Kelly Cup. Details of all winners and results are to be found later in this Annual Report.

In summer it was a hallmark of every division that the final series place getters were decided in the

last race of the season. Congratulations to all. Operationally this year has not been as smooth as I would have liked. The behind-the-scenes management of the racing program has consumed more of our limited resources than expected

management of the racing program has consumed more of our limited resources than expected, and in consequence we missed some objectives set for the year.

It was forecast this time last year that SASC would be able to reduce the cost of the sailing program by a further 10% during the year while improving the range of services offered.

We have not achieved that target, however, costs were managed to match last year's budget.

Increased emphasis will be applied to the sailing operations this coming year so that resources can be made available for new initiatives such as communications and further fleet development.

The SASC continues to strengthen its relationships with our sister clubs on Sydney Harbour.

This current winter series has seen the introduction of a combined race program with RANSA; which by all reports has been a success on-water.

This year is a Gaffers Day year for the SASC and I would expect strong support from the Sydney clubs for our premier event.

Thank you to the Board of Directors of SASC for your continued support of the racing program.

I look forward to a stronger, competitive and even more enjoyable season next year.

The principal continuing activity of the Company during the financial year was to promote the sport of amateur sailing. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

TRADING RESULTS

The operating loss after income tax of the Company for the year to 31 May 2015 was \$50,248 (2014: loss of \$49,269).

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

The Club's sailing, slipways and social programmes all continued satisfactorily.

The Club had 21 new members during the year. Membership now stands at 389.

DIVIDEND

No dividend has been recommended or paid during the year as the Company's Constitution does not permit payment of dividends.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN STATE OF AFFAIRS

No significant changes have occurred in the state of affairs of the Company.

AFTER BALANCE SHEET DATE EVENTS

The directors have approved a proposal to replace the existing piles supporting the deck in front of the clubhouse at an approximate cost of \$70,000.00.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001. The Company is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars.

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first in first out basis.

(c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair values as indicated, less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to the economic entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The carrying values of plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment at each reporting date, with recoverable amounts being estimated when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may be

impaired. Impairment exists when the carrying value of an asset exceeds its estimate recoverable amount. The asset is then written down to its recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposal are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income.

(d) Financial Instruments

Apart from financial assets or cash, term deposits, receivables and financial liabilities of trade and other payables, the Company does not hold or intend to invest in any other type of financial instrument.

Initial recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value. Fair value represents the amount for which an asset could be exchanged or a liability settled between knowledgeable, willing parties.

(i) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits at-call with banks and other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts.

(ii) Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables are recognised at amortised cost, less any provision for impairment.

Collectability of trade debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectible are written

off. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where some doubt as to collection exists.

(iii) Trade and Other Payables

The liability for creditors is recognised upon delivery of the goods and services to the Company or where the Company has entered an irrevocable contract for the supply of goods or services. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are not secured and are usually paid within 30 days recognition.

(e) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity assesses whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (eg in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where the future economic benefits of the asset are not primarily dependent upon the asset's ability to generate net cash inflows and when the entity would, if deprived of the asset, replace its remaining future economic benefits, value in use is depreciated replacement cost of an asset.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an asset class, the entity estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the class of assets belong.

(f) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the Company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance sheet date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. Long service leave is accrued in respect of all permanent employees.

Contributions are made by the Company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred

(g) Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred. This basis is representative of the pattern of benefits derived from the leased property.

(h) Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers. Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument. Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers. Revenue from membership fee is recognised prorated over the membership period. All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

(j) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(k) Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(l) Going Concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which assumes that the Company will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due. The directors have confirmed this basis in the directors' declaration on page 22.

(m) Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The directors evaluate estimates and judgements incorporated into the financial statements based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data obtained both externally and within the company.

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report of Sydney Amateur Sailing Club, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 May 2015, the statement of comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information and the directors' declaration of the company.

Directors' Responsibility for the Financial Report

The directors of the company are responsible for the preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements and the *Corporations Act 2001* and for such internal control as the directors determine is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. As such we are not in a position to provide an opinion of the valuation of the fixed assets as at 31 May 2015.

Qualified Audit's Opinion
