One of the most heartening features of the Australia Day Regatta is how, over its long history, the event somehow manages to overcome every obstacle that fate has thrown in its path.

More than a century ago soldiers returning to Australia from the Great War were accused of bringing the 'Spanish Flu' home with them. It became a horrible epidemic. In the days before antibiotics and ventilators, influenza spread through the urban population at terrible speed and thousands died.

As with the current Corona-19 crisis, governments prohibited just about every type of public gathering. But, even at the height of that epidemic, the Australia Day Regatta was held. Huge spectator crowds assembled – many of them wearing facemasks. Some things never change.

So, after two years of COVID privations the Regatta again emerges from a crisis to celebrate the founding of our nation as a Crown Colony 234 years ago.

Originally known as the Anniversary Day Regatta, what we now cherish as the Australia Day Regatta has become a central part of those national celebrations. This year will mark the 186th staging of the event, making it the oldest continuously-run sailing regatta in the world.

For all of us, Australia Day is an opportunity to celebrate what being Australian means to them. For sailors, it is getting out on the water, getting close to nature and seeing it at its best, increasing knowledge and awareness of the environment and knowing that it is worth protecting; gaining a better understanding of interconnections and our place in 'the big picture' and connecting with cultures past and present.

It is also day to recognise and remember that for tens of thousands of years, Indigenous Australians have been aware of the symbiotic relationship between our country and the water that surrounds it. First Nations people from the saltwater clans have long had totemic relationships with, and responsibilities for, the sea and the different sea creatures within.

The regatta is an event for people of all ages and abilities – anyone from any walk of life can get involved. No craft is too large or small to enjoy this wonderful day afloat. You can enter through your local club or at the website listed below.

We are pleased to again acknowledge the continuing support of the Armed Services, in particular the Royal Australian Navy for the provision of the Regatta Flagship.

To all participants we extended our best wishes for a safe and enjoyable Australia Day on the water.
