## E. C. "CLIFF" GALE

On Tuesday 23rd April, "Cliff" Gale passed quietly away in his eighty-second year.

Well known in Sydney's yachting circles, Cliff achieved the supreme attainment of becoming a "legend in his own time". Deferred to in all questions relating to any aspect of yachting, whether it was design, performance, courses or tactics, Cliff was the subject of numerous newspaper articles in which he has been referred to as Mr. Yachting.

Hon. Life Member, Committeeman, Club Captain, and Commodore of the S.A.S.C. which he served so well during his term of 58 years' membership, Cliff not only sailed his courses with consummate skill but was able and pleased to help any fellow yachtsman with advice and practical demonstrations on all problems confronting a budding skipper.

His designs of yachts are famous on the Harbour and there are many variations of his famed "Ranger", a design that he produced in many different dimensions and styles. Some are famous for their cruises throughout the East coast of Australia.

Unquestionably the best known personality on the Harbour, Cliff brought considerable prestige and status to the Amateurs. With Cliff has also passed a link with an era in yachting of gaffrigged yachts, topsails, long bowsprits and beamy hulls.

To Cliff's family we extend our sincere sympathy.

We also note with deep regret the passing of Mrs. M. Robson, wife of C.W.Robson, past Commodore of the S.A.S.C. from 1934 to 1938, Delegate to the Yachting Racing Association and also Committeeman.

YACHT REGISTER

The register of the Amateur Sail Numbers is again being brought up to date. Would any member who has SOLD his yacht, or who has decided he no longer needs it, please advise the Racing Secretary in writing.

Members who are selling their yachts are reminded that they MUST

remove the sail numbers.

Members who have Y.A. sail numbers with no prefix letter, must have their yacht listed on a Club register, i.e. it must be listed by ONE of the Royal Clubs or S.A.S.C. or M.H.Y.C. etc. Members who only belong to S.A.S.C. a nd have a Y.A. number MUST have it recorded on our register.
