

## SASC Equipment Audits - Category 7,5,4

## **General Instructions - 2025**

- 1. SASC provides two free Audit Days in August (9th and 16th).
- 2. Administration fees (\$35) will apply outside these free days, or if you book an audit and are not available.
- 3. Audit forms expire twelve months after the date of audit.
- 4. Equipment audits shall only be completed on the official forms provided by Australian Sailing (AS)/SASC
- 5. All gear shall be laid out for inspection. Where equipment is not adequately laid out, the equipment auditor may refuse to continue the audit.
- 6. The boats owner or person in charge shall be in attendance during the audit
- 7. Where a boat has outstanding items still required as part of its audit, it shall be ineligible to race. Outstanding items shall be presented with the audit form to sign off, to an AS/SASC accredited auditor.
- 8. Inflatable life jackets to be checked annually with proof of annual check attached see PFD checklist
- 9. Fire Extinguishers must be checked annually and must be under 5 years old and showing green in the meter.
- 10. Boat Registration all boats must be registered with TFNSW Maritime.
- 11. Audit forms and Insurance certificates must be uploaded to SailSys to complete your race entries
- 12. For Category 7 and 4 you must complete the AS Category 7 or 4 forms.
- 13. For Category 5, you must complete the AS Category 5 form. **PLUS**, the <u>Category 5 Addendum</u> see next page.

For Category 5, you must complete the AS Category 5 form and the additional requirements from TFNSW Maritime:
